**Re: Proposed Fiscal Year Ending (FYE) 2024 Municipal Budgets**

Honorable Members of the Johnson City City Council:

As the Mayor of The City of Johnson City, I am endowed by Chapter 102 of the Texas Local Government Code as the budget officer of this city. I took a different approach to the budget process in order to increase transparency for our constituents and to encourage involvement by all members of the City Council. After many long hours with staff and department heads, I present to you the budget for Fiscal Year Ending 2024 for your consideration and approval. The laws of the State of Texas require that the city's presented and approved General Fund Budget is balanced, and I am pleased to report that this budget meets that requirement.

Events that have occurred in this city over the past several years have lowered a dark cloud over City Hall. Our citizens show a general distrust in many of the financial aspects of how this city is run. This message is not written to dishearten you and blame is squarely placed on the people who chose to break the law. But it is a necessary statement. To not acknowledge the feelings of the citizens of Johnson City does us all a disservice. As a newly elected Mayor, it is my hope and my ultimate goal to not only regain the trust of our citizens, but to bring about a renewed faith in local government and perhaps even excitement about the future of our city. Let us begin to build that faith and excitement together.

While it is not the most fun part of governing, the budget process is absolutely the most essential. If life in a post COVID world has taught us anything, it's that everything is unpredictable. Costs of goods and services continue to climb even now that inflation is beginning to plateau. It was a balancing act between that statement and the recognition that every department within the city is in need of new equipment, more manpower or both. I took all the notes from our budget workshop to heart, and I did my best to include them in this budget. I also included as many of the requests from department heads as could be afforded, and I think they will also be pleased.

## ***Budget Strategy***

City Staff and I began budget preparation with a desire to speak to each individual department head to get an idea of their Department's needs and their wants. The goal of this step was to increase the quality of life of our citizens, while at the same time providing every department with the equipment that they need in order to accomplish that mission. We looked for and successfully found several places where we could trim some excess expenditures. That included a discussion on reworking the current council chambers into offices for the police department and utilizing the security of the current building; and instead building a new wing to serve as a Council chambers and Courtroom, which could cost significantly less than the construction of a specialized building like a police station. We were also successful in saving over \$130,000 at the Wastewater Treatment Facility by utilizing effluent instead of purchasing a new, very expensive piece of equipment. These "brainstorming" discussions with staff and department heads have the potential to save hundreds of thousands of dollars to the city.

We are pleased to report that the proposed Fiscal Year Ending 2024 Municipal Budgets maintain the same ad valorem (property) tax rate from FYE 2023 -- \$0.3569 per \$100 valuation. We also expect to see increases of up 10% in some of our Revenue items. This is a conservative calculation, but the increase is in line with recent performance history. General Fund revenue also includes a direct transfer from the Water & Wastewater Utility Fund in the amount of \$76,143.00. This accomplishes the goal of utilizing the business of the utility department to subsidize the general fund. We also will be surpassing the recommended Fund Balance by holding over 4 months of operating reserves in the General Fund.

The City's Debt Service (interest & sinking) Fund includes the first payment of the newly issued Series 2023 Certificates of Obligation, three (3) lease-purchase contracts for Police Department vehicles and Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) systems within the City's Utility Department. Our Debt Service will be fully funded through property tax collections.

Some changes have been made to personnel, and while no new positions within the city have been created, some of the moves will maximize the effectiveness of different departments while saving as much taxpayer money as possible. It is absolutely essential to maintain a competitive wage, therefore, a 5.52% cost of living adjustment is included for all permanent employees. After speaking to all staff who would be affected by the change, the decision was made to eliminate the Utility Billing / Permitting Clerk position. This not a decision that was made lightly, and I spoke to staff on several occasions before I could confidently file this budget. This change will improve the salaries within the Public Works Department, which in turn will attract qualified candidates for job openings within the department. In an effort to streamline departments, a Parks and Recreation employee is being moved under Public Works, as well. The Utility Department Head already oversees many aspects of the Parks Department, therefore this move made sense to staff and myself. In total, the number of Utility Department employees has increased to four (4) people. We report that the hourly wage rate for a Water / Wastewater Operator now starts at \$27.00 per hour.

The City needed to increase base salaries for police officers to a minimum of \$53,136.50 per year to stay competitive. The salary line item includes allocations with a 5.52% to 13.54% increase based on officer's current salaries. These increases are not guaranteed to the officer and shall be distributed at the discretion of the Department Head, based upon employee performance and merit.

It is one of my highest priorities to maintain a workplace where City Employees feel valued. Maintaining and improving employee benefits is a big part of that. Employee Health and Dental insurance benefits are funded at the same level as this year, though cost has increased by a little over 7.5%, while vision insurance rates stay the same. In addition, Life insurance and Accidental Death and Dismemberment, as well as short- and long-term disability insurances also remained flat. The City's total salary and benefit expenditures are estimated at \$1.42 Million; this is approximately 42.50% across the General and Water/Wastewater Utility Fund. We will continue to endeavor to keep salary and benefit expenditures at or below 50% of these Fund Budgets.

A new fund has been created for the collection and expenditure in the Opioid Abatement suits. The fees for this fund are distributed by the State of Texas as part of the settlements in Pharmaceutical Company Class Action suits.

As we discussed during our Budget Workshop, a Splash Pad Fund has also been created. It will hold funds collected for future planning and construction of this project. I will not be accepting my Mayoral salary and I have transferred the full \$10,000 to the Splash Pad Fund in the hope that others in our community will follow suit with donations of their own. This project will improve the quality of life of children and families within Johnson City, and I cannot think of a more worthwhile project.

Lastly, these proposed Budgets include changes to the Municipal Fee Schedule. As discussed in a recent Council Meeting, the City's Solid Waste Contractor adjusted their fees to meet their increased operating costs. We withheld increasing costs to our citizens at the time, but the amended fee schedule does include the 4.71% increase. This equals to a \$1.06 increase to Residential customers. All other fees that have changed using the same Consumer Price Index adjustment that was used to calculate employee wage increases. Impact Fees and City Swimming pool entrance fees stay the same, in addition to any fee with a state-mandated maximum.

Revenues to the General and Water & Wastewater Utility Funds are expected to reach approximately \$3.3 Million during the 2023-2024 Fiscal Year.

Some of the highlights of the proposed FYE 2024 Municipal Budgets are:

- Maintaining and increasing Economic Development Programs;
- Increasing security of Park Facilities;
- Increasing Marketing and Advertising of the City for Tourism;
- Streamlining Department Personnel;
- Upgrading and maintaining City Parks amenities and buildings;
- Funds for Readiness for the 2024 Total Solar Eclipse;

- First Responder Vehicles, Equipment, and Software;
- Employee Training in all Departments;
- Agenda Management Software to increase citizen involvement;
- Development Services Review and Oversight;
- More Robust Community Events;
- Continuing the Meter Replacement Program;
- Highly Efficient Meter Reading Equipment;
- Public Works Vehicle and Equipment;
- Wastewater Treatment Plant Equipment;
- Wastewater Line Improvements;
- Fire Hydrant Improvements; and
- Updates to the Capital Improvements Plan and Impact Fee Study.

As stated above, the proposed ad valorem (property tax) tax rate remains the same at \$0.356900 per \$100 valuation. If adopted, the ad valorem tax rate would be split between Maintenance & Operating (M&O) and Interest & Sinking (I&S or debt service) tax rates in the following manner:

The Blanco County Appraisal District certified municipal ad valorem taxable values on July 25, 2023. The net taxable value consisted of more than \$351 Million; however, approximately \$42.6 Million is subject to disability and senior tax freezes, which decreases the amount of tax collected by the City. The total expected ad valorem collection is estimated at \$1,209,371. The No-New-Revenue tax rate is \$0.3107 / \$100 valuation, and the Voter-Approval tax rate is \$0.3715 / \$100 valuation.

## City of Johnson City A Historical Perspective




Johnson City, the County Seat of Blanco County, is at the junction of U.S. Highways 281 and 290, twelve miles north of Blanco in the central part of the County. Settlers living along the Pedernales River in the rugged central part of the County, among them one James Polk Johnson, for whom the town was later named, thought that the county seat at Blanco was not accessible, so, in 1876, they called for an election to move the Courthouse closer to the geographical center of the County. When this attempt failed, the citizens followed Johnson's lead and began publicizing the idea of establishing a new

community. The site chosen was on land originally granted to James Fentress, which belonged to Johnson. A post office was established there in 1878, and, soon afterwards, town lots were offered for sale. In 1879, the people successfully petitioned for an election to choose a new county seat but were defeated. Meanwhile, the town continued to grow, especially boosted by the construction of Johnson's two-story office building and his hotel. He also donated lots for schools. In 1890, another county seat election, a hotly contested one, made Johnson City the County Seat.

Though its new status boosted the economy of the community, Johnson City did not get modern utilities until the 1930s, when Lyndon Baines Johnson, a relative of the founder of the City, sponsored legislation that introduced full electric power to the area under the Lower Colorado River Authority and the Pedernales Electric Cooperative. After Johnson became a United States Senator and began his climb to the Presidency, telephone service rapidly progressed from the old magnetic box phones to dial service and then to worldwide service. In addition, when he returned from the White House, Johnson made the United States a gift of his lands, now the Lyndon Baines Johnson National Historical Park.

Johnson City, for many years mainly a ranch trade center, had a steady tourist business from its origins. Though the number of businesses dropped from twenty in 1914 to seven in 1933, it rose to forty-two in the mid-1950s, when the town was incorporated. In the late 1960s and early 1970s, when Johnson was President of the United States, the major income in Johnson City came from the tourist industry, and the number of businesses rose to fifty-two. By 1986 the number had dropped to twenty-six. The town's newspaper, the Record-Courier, was established in 1883. The population fluctuated from 400 in 1925 to 950 in the late 1940s, and from 660 to 800 between the late 1960s and the mid-1980s. Johnson City continues to be mainly a tourist center. In 1990, the population was 932. That figure increased to 1,205 by 2000. The 2020 decennial census is 1,627.

## **City of Johnson City A Functional Perspective**

The City of Johnson City is a Type A General Law municipality operating under a Council-Mayor form of government. All powers of the City are vested in an elected Council, consisting of five Councilpersons (or “Aldermen”) and a Mayor. The Council enacts local legislation, determines City policies, and employs the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO).



The Mayor is the Chief Executive Officer of the City and is responsible for the proper administration of all affairs of the City. The CAO serves as the assistant to the Mayor and City Council in carrying out activities prescribed by them.

The City government provides a broad range of goods and services to its citizens. The activities and personnel required to provide these goods and services are organized into broad managerial areas called Funds. Funds are separate fiscal and accounting entities with their own resources and budgets necessary to carry on specific activities and attain certain objectives.

Funds are further organized into function groups called Departments. A Department is a group of related activities aimed at accomplishing a major City service or program (i.e., Police or Public Works Departments).



A Department may be further divided into small areas called Divisions. Divisions perform specific functions within the Department (i.e. Criminal Investigations within the Police Department).

Leading each Department is a Department Head. Department Heads have supervision and control of their respective Department(s) and the Divisions within it; however, they are subject to supervision and control by the Mayor and/or CAO. A Department Head may supervise more than one Department.






### General / Debt Funds Revenue by Source (in Millions)




### Water/Wastewater Utility Fund Revenue by Source (in Millions)





## Net Taxable Property Valuation (in Millions)




## Total Tax Rate per \$100 Valuation






### Total Debt Obligations (in Millions) (as of 10/01/23)

The City is required by State Law and City Code to approve a balanced annual budget. A budget is balanced when the sum of estimated current revenues, plus available unreserved fund balances, are equal to or greater than current expenditures.

### ***Fund Balance***

The General Fund balance must be of adequate size and strength to manage unexpected decreases in revenues *and* unexpected, unbudgeted expenses, such as during a natural or man-made disaster. The Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) recommends a minimum general fund balance of no less than two (2) months, or 16.67%. The GFOA recommends a minimum enterprise fund balance, such as the Water and Wastewater Utility Fund, of no less than forty-five (45) days, or 12.33%. The FYE 2022 Annual Financial Report indicated that the City of Johnson City held a little over three (3) months, or 28.54%, of average monthly expenditures in its General Fund balance. The City's Water and Wastewater Utility Fund held zero (0) days of working capital in its Fund balance.

### ***Investment Policy***

Investments shall be made by the City in conformance with State Law and the City's Investment Policy, as amended by the City Council. All investments shall seek, in the following order of importance: safety, liquidity, and yield.

### ***Annual Financial Report***

The City, through an independent auditing firm, produces an annual financial report in accordance with generally accepted accounting procedures (GAAP), as mandated by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB). The City anticipates improving the annual financial report to a comprehensive annual financial report (CAFR) in the near term.



**SUMMARY OF  
OUTSTANDING DEBT OBLIGATIONS**

A municipality typically funds large capital purchases and improvement projects, such as the construction of utilities or roads, through the use of existing monies and/or the issuance of debt obligations. Debt obligations typically consist of the following:

### ***General Obligation Bonds***

General obligation bonds are backed by the full faith and credit of the issuing municipality, meaning that bonds are guaranteed by a pledge of future ad valorem tax revenues. General obligation bonds may or may not require voter approval. Currently, the City of Johnson City holds two (2) general obligation refunding bonds (Series 2012 and 2021).

### ***Certificates of Obligation***

Certificates of Obligation are also guaranteed by a pledge of future ad valorem taxes; however, they do not require voter approval. Currently, the City of Johnson City holds two (2) issuances of Certificates of Obligation (Series 2015 and 2023).

### ***Tax Notes***

Tax notes are short-term debt instruments issued by a local government to finance an immediate project that will be repaid with future tax collections, such as ad valorem tax revenues. Currently, the City of Johnson City holds no tax notes.


### ***Public Property Finance Act Contract***

Chapter 271 of the Texas Local Government Code authorizes a City to execute, perform, and make payments under a contract with any person for the use, purchase, financing, or other acquisition of any personal property. Commonly referred to as “Lease-Purchase”, the City currently holds three (3) lease-purchase contracts.

The adopted FYE 2024 Capital Replacement Fund and Vehicle Equipment & Replacement Program Fund Budgets include Lease-Purchase contracts for the purchase of two (2) Police Department vehicles and one (1) Public Works / Utility Department vehicle.

## ***Fund Policy and Structure***

In accordance with City Council Resolution No. R20-044, as amended, the City of Johnson City reports governmental fund balances per GASB Statement 54 definitions on the balance sheet in the following manner:

### ***Non-spendable Funds***

Land, buildings, vehicles, equipment, and infrastructure are designated as Non-spendable Funds. Non-spendable Funds cannot be expended because they are not in a spendable form or they are legally required to be maintained (e.g. inventory, permanent endowment funds, et cetera).

### ***Restricted Funds***

Some General and Water and Wastewater Utility Funds and all Debt Service Funds are designated as Restricted Funds and, accordingly, the use of such Funds is restricted by Federal, State, and Local law or policy. Restricted Funds can only be expended in a certain manner or on certain goods or services because constraints are externally imposed on said Funds by creditors, grantors, law, or constitutional provisions. Restricted Funds include:

- (1) General Fund Components:
  - i. Police Forfeiture Funds (State & Federal)
  - ii. Court Technology & Security Funds
  - iii. Local Truancy Prevention & Diversion Fund
  - iv. Municipal Jury Fund
  - v. Hotel Occupancy Tax Fund
  - vi. Parks & Recreation Fund
  - vii. Opioid Abatement Fund
- (2) Debt Service (Interest & Sinking) Fund
- (3) Water & Wastewater Utility Fund Components:
  - i. Impact Fee Fund
  - ii. Vehicle Equipment Replacement Fund

### ***Committed Funds***

The Capital Replacement, Water & Wastewater Utility, and Splash Pad Funds are designated as Committed Funds. Committed Funds are formally designated by the City Council for a particular purpose, and only City Council can alter such designation of funds.

### ***Unassigned Funds***

The balance of the General Fund is designated as an Unassigned Fund. Unassigned Funds constitute the residual amount of monies within the General Fund that do not qualify for any of the aforementioned fund classifications. Unassigned Funds originate from the collection of

maintenance and operation portions of ad valorem tax, sales tax, franchise fees, Court fines and fees, and other municipal licenses, fees, and activities.

***Fiduciary Funds***

Fiduciary Funds are used to report assets held in trustee or agency capacity for others and which, therefore, cannot be used to support the government's own programs. The City holds no fiduciary funds.

The adopted FYE 2024 General and Water & Wastewater Utility Fund Budgets generally include a five-point-five-two percent (5.52%) salary allocation per employee. However, in order for police officer pay to remain competitive in the emergency services marketplace, the adopted Budgets include salary allocations per police officer position of five-point-five-two percent (5.52%) to thirteen-point-five-four percent (13.54%), based upon each employee's current salary. Moreover, the adopted Budgets contemplate the creation of a Police Department Take Home Car Program similar to programs offered by other law enforcement agencies.

Importantly, the adopted Budgets increase about half (1/2) of employees' salaries to at or above the average annual base salaries identified within the 2021-2023 Texas Municipal League Salary Surveys below.

As is customary, the included salary adjustments are intended for existing, full-time employees and shall be distributed at the discretion of the Department Head based upon employee performance and merit.

Subject: Take Home Vehicles

## **Section 26.00 Take Home Vehicles**

### **Policy**

It is the policy of the Johnson City Police Department to regulate and maintain a Take Home Vehicle Program in order to:

- Provide additional economic benefits to police officers in order to increase employee recruitment, retention, and morale;
- Potentially reduce maintenance costs of police vehicles through “ownership” of said vehicles by assigned personnel; and
- Potentially provide quicker response times by off-duty personnel when recalled to duty because of an emergency.

### **Definitions**

For the purposes of this Policy, the term “take home vehicle” refers to both marked and unmarked police vehicles.

### **General Guidelines for Use of Take Home Vehicles**

- The Chief of Police, at his/her sole discretion, may assign a take home vehicle to police officers that have received a successful evaluation and exhibit good judgement and professionalism on a routine basis.
- Police officers assigned a take home vehicle will park the vehicle at the address listed in his/her personnel file. Command staff shall be notified when an employee has a permanent change of address. An alternate parking location (i.e. neighboring law enforcement agency) may be used, upon approval from that Agency and the City’s Chief of Police.
- No employee shall use the assigned vehicle to further any personal interests, including off-duty employment, unless authorized by the Chief of Police. If authorized by the Chief of Police, off-duty employment is typically only allowed within Blanco County.
- Under no circumstances shall a police officer leave any firearm in a police vehicle without properly securing the firearm in the trunk or by other authorized means.
- Any police officer on leave due to extended sick leave, on-duty injuries, limited duty, or suspension will not have take home vehicle privileges.

### **Off-Duty Mileage and Gasoline Consumption**

- It shall be the responsibility of each police officer to ensure that off-duty mileage and gasoline consumption is not abused.

- It shall be the responsibility of Command Staff to monitor fuel consumption of subordinates in their command.

## **Violation of Take-Home Vehicle Policy**

Any employee who violates this Policy will be subject to the loss of a take home vehicle and/or other disciplinary action.

## **Operation of Vehicles**

- Any police officer using his/her take home vehicle shall adhere to Departmental policies, procedures, rules, and regulations and the City's Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual, as they pertain to vehicle and equipment operation, maintenance, and care.
- Any police officer using his/her take home vehicle in any unauthorized manner or who permits unauthorized uses of the vehicle will be subject to the loss of a take home vehicle and/or other disciplinary action.

## **Good Judgement**

Police officers operating take home vehicles shall exercise good judgement and due regard in utilizing said vehicles, including avoiding any conduct likely to cause unfavorable comments and/or embarrassment to the Johnson City Police Department.

## **Authorized Drivers**

**ONLY** Johnson City Police Department employees shall be permitted to operate take home vehicles.

## **Where Vehicle May Be Operated**

Unless otherwise authorized by the Chief of Police, police officers shall not operate or park an assigned take home vehicle outside of a **30-mile radius** of the City of Johnson City, Texas. The 30-mile radius restriction shall not apply to the following:

- Official on-duty business during a call for service or criminal investigation; or
- Official law enforcement training approved by Command Staff.

## **Passengers**

Unless otherwise authorized by the Chief of Police, police officers shall not permit non-police passengers in the take home vehicle when off-duty.

## **Alcoholic Beverages**

- No employee shall operate a take home vehicle in violation of the Texas Penal Code and the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code which pertains to the use, transportation, and storage of alcoholic beverages.
- No alcoholic beverage may be transported in a take home vehicle by the employee or any person in the vehicle, except when in the performance of official duties.
- No take home vehicle, except when on official business, will be parked within proximity of any establishment that serves alcohol as its main source of income.
- If an employee is involved in an accident or other incident while operating a take home vehicle and it is determined that alcohol was a contributing factor on the employee's part, the employee's use of a take home vehicle will be immediately suspended and the employee will be subject to other disciplinary action.

## **Passenger Restraint Devices**

Police officers and passengers in a take home vehicle must use restraint devices, as required by State Law.

## **Take Home Vehicle Involved in a Collision**

Whenever a police officer is involved in a take home vehicle collision (no matter how minimal the damage), whether on- or off-duty, he/she shall immediately:

- Advise the Blanco County Dispatch Center or nearest 911 communications center;
- Request a Commanding Officer to respond to the scene; and
- Request an Agency of Jurisdiction to make a report.

### ***Documentation of the Collision***

In the event that a Commanding Officer cannot respond to the scene, the Commanding Officer shall dispatch another on-duty police officer to the incident site who shall assume the responsibilities of the Commanding Officer.

If the responding police officer decides that the take home vehicle should not be operated until repairs are completed, the responding police officer will plan for transporting the involved police officer to his/her home and the take home vehicle to the appropriate repair facility.

The police officer involved in the collision shall provide a copy of his/her report to the Chief of Police through the Chain of Command as soon as possible.

## ***Post Collision Testing***

Drug and alcohol testing shall be conducted on all police officers involved in a vehicle collision while in any vehicle owned by the City of Johnson City if any of the following criteria are met:

- There is an injury to any of the involved parties that requires off-site medical attention;
- There is property damage of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) or more; or
- If the collision involves a City vehicle and a domesticated or wild animal (i.e. whitetail deer or feral pig), it is up to the responding police officer to determine if testing will be done.

## ***Post Collision Training***

Any police officer involved in two or more at-fault collisions within a twelve (12) month period will be subject to the loss of his/her take home vehicle and be required to attend an appropriate TCOLE-regulated driving course. Further disciplinary action may also be taken against the officer.

## **Maintenance and Care of Vehicle**

Each police officer assigned a take home vehicle will be fully responsible for the proper care and general maintenance of the vehicle. Employees will be subject to disciplinary action if they:

- Fail to properly maintain their take home vehicle;
- Fail to report any damage or theft; or
- Fail to report any service problems.

## **Scheduling Maintenance/Repair/ Warranty Work**

Police officers will ensure that their take home vehicle is routinely serviced and maintained in accordance with the vehicle manufacturer's recommended service schedule. Transportation of vehicles to and from service facilities shall be performed while on-duty. Police officers shall coordinate with other on-duty staff for transportation to and from the facility.

## **Break Down of Vehicle (Off-Duty)**

In the event that a take home vehicle breaks down or must be placed in a repair facility while the officer is off-duty, an on-duty Supervisor, or designee, shall be contacted to arrange for vehicle transportation to and from the repair facility. The police officer shall utilize personal transportation to and from work while his/her take home vehicle is being repaired.

## **Vehicle Cleanliness**

Employees shall maintain the cleanliness of the interior and exterior of their assigned take home vehicle as needed. Supervisors may require an immediate response to an unkept vehicle.

## **Inspections**

Monthly inspections of take home vehicles will be conducted by Command Staff.

## **Official Activity**

Off-duty police officers encountering any situation requiring police action shall take appropriate action needed to manage the situation. Except in emergency situations, said officers shall request an on-duty police officer to take any report necessary, transport prisoners, or assist citizens. Upon arrival of an on-duty police officer(s), the off-duty officer may clear the scene.

## **Equipment**

It is prohibited to install any equipment on a City of Johnson City vehicle without prior authorization from the Chief of Police. The Chief of Police may establish guidelines for the use and installation of emergency equipment, communication devices, and other equipment.

## **Policy Review**

This policy is reviewed by the Chief of Police on a yearly basis.







**GENERAL INFORMATION:** Tax Code Section 26.04(c) requires an officer or employee designated by the governing body to calculate the no-new-revenue (NNR) tax rate and voter-approval tax rate for the taxing unit. These tax rates are expressed in dollars per \$100 of taxable value calculated. The calculation process starts after the chief appraiser delivers to the taxing unit the certified appraisal roll and the estimated values of properties under protest. The designated officer or employee shall certify that the officer or employee has accurately calculated the tax rates and used values shown for the certified appraisal roll or certified estimate. The officer or employee submits the rates to the governing body by Aug. 7 or as soon thereafter as practicable.

School districts do not use this form, but instead use Comptroller Form 50-859 *Tax Rate Calculation Worksheet, School District without Chapter 313 Agreements* or Comptroller Form 50-884 *Tax Rate Calculation Worksheet, School District with Chapter 313 Agreements*.

Water districts as defined under Water Code Section 49.001(1) do not use this form, but instead use Comptroller Form 50-858 *Water District Voter-Approval Tax Rate Worksheet for Low Tax Rate and Developing Districts* or Comptroller Form 50-860 *Developed Water District Voter-Approval Tax Rate Worksheet*.

The Comptroller's office provides this worksheet to assist taxing units in determining tax rates. The information provided in this worksheet is offered as technical assistance and not legal advice. Taxing units should consult legal counsel for interpretations of law regarding tax rate preparation and adoption.

### SECTION 1: No-New-Revenue Tax Rate

The NNR tax rate enables the public to evaluate the relationship between taxes for the prior year and for the current year based on a tax rate that would produce the same amount of taxes (no new taxes) if applied to the same properties that are taxed in both years. When appraisal values increase, the NNR tax rate should decrease.

The NNR tax rate for a county is the sum of the NNR tax rates calculated for each type of tax the county levies.

While uncommon, it is possible for a taxing unit to provide an exemption for only maintenance and operations taxes. In this case, the taxing unit will need to calculate the NNR tax rate separately for the maintenance and operations tax and the debt tax, then add the two components together.

## SECTION 2: Voter-Approval Tax Rate

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that a taxing unit may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate. The voter-approval tax rate is split into two separate rates:

- Maintenance and Operations (M&O) Tax Rate:** The M&O portion is the tax rate that is needed to raise the same amount of taxes that the taxing unit levied in the prior year plus the applicable percentage allowed by law. This rate accounts for such things as salaries, utilities and day-to-day operations.
- Debt Rate:** The debt rate includes the debt service necessary to pay the taxing unit's debt payments in the coming year. This rate accounts for principal and interest on bonds and other debt secured by property tax revenue.

The voter-approval tax rate for a county is the sum of the voter-approval tax rates calculated for each type of tax the county levies. In most cases the voter-approval tax rate exceeds the no-new-revenue tax rate, but occasionally decreases in a taxing unit's debt service will cause the NNR tax rate to be higher than the voter-approval tax rate.

**SECTION 5: Voter-Approval Tax Rate Adjustment for Unused Increment Rate**

The unused increment rate is the rate equal to the difference between the adopted tax rate and voter-approval tax rate adjusted to remove the unused increment rate for the prior three years.<sup>39</sup> In a year where a taxing unit adopts a rate by applying any portion of the unused increment rate, the portion of the unused increment rate must be backed out of the calculation for that year.

The difference between the adopted tax rate and adjusted voter-approval tax rate is considered zero in the following scenarios:

- a tax year before 2020;<sup>40</sup>
- a tax year in which the municipality is a defunding municipality, as defined by Tax Code Section 26.0501(a);<sup>41</sup> or
- after Jan. 1, 2022, a tax year in which the comptroller determines that the county implemented a budget reduction or reallocation described by Local Government Code Section 120.002(a) without the required voter approval.<sup>42</sup>

Individual components can be negative, but the overall rate would be the greater of zero or the calculated rate.
