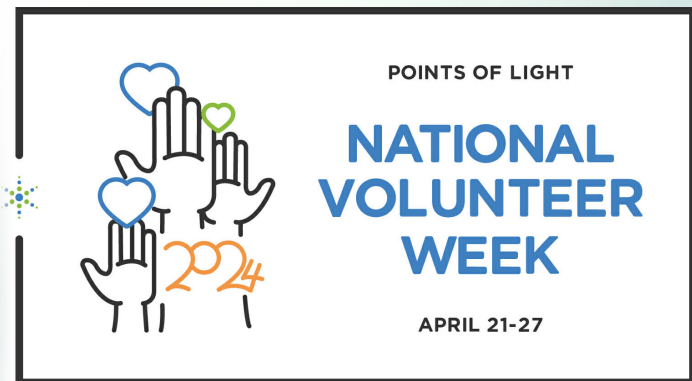
MONTHLY COFFEE & CONVERSATION

Although we're all eager to welcome spring, summer will be here before we know it!

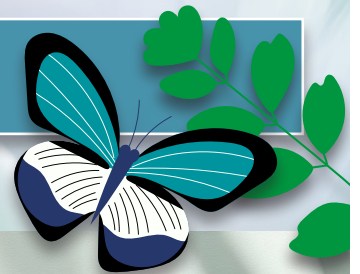

KETTERING LEADERSHIP ACADEMY



The Kettering Leadership Academy (KLA) is currently accepting applications for the 2024–2025 class. KLA is designed for people looking to take on leadership roles within our community, such as serving on a board or commission at the City of Kettering, or serving at one of our area non-profit organizations. Applicants are required to live or work in Kettering. The Academy begins in September with a mandatory overnight retreat at Camp Joy. Sessions are held once a month throughout the year until graduation in May. Topics include Kettering history, local government, community organizations, education, healthcare, business, public safety, service clubs, and volunteering. The fee for the Academy is \$800.
