The Council of the City of Kettering, Ohio, met in regular session on Tuesday, April 9, 2024, at 7:30 p.m. in Council Chambers at the Kettering Government Center South Building, 3600 Shroyer Road. Mayor Lehner presided and the Clerk of Council, LaShaunah D. Kaczynski, recorded. This meeting was telecast live on the cable access channel and streamed live at mvcc.net.

Mayor Lehner led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance and gave the invocation.

Mayor Lehner introduced the Miami Valley Communications Council TV Operator Mike Soproni. She thanked him for his assistance.

Mrs. Fisher reported that she reviewed the above minutes and moved the minutes be approved. Mr. Sullivan seconded the motion of the above minutes and there being seven (7) yea votes and no (0) nay votes for the March 12, 2024 Council Meeting and Workshop Minutes and the March 26, 2024 Workshop Minutes, the motion was declared carried followed by a roll call vote.

PROCLAMATIONS, SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS, AWARDS, SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS, APPOINTMENTS TO BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

Appointment- Volunteer Advisory Council- Megan Moon (Term ending 12/31/24)

Mrs. Fisher made a motion to appoint Megan Moon to the Volunteer Advisory Council. Mr. Sullivan seconded the motion. The motion was declared carried followed by a unanimous like sign vote to approve the appointment.

Proclamation- Arbor Day

Mr. Sullivan read the above proclamation and the proclamation was accepted by Kerri Miles, Environmental Education Supervisor. Mrs. Miles mentioned Tree Fest will take place on April 20 and the City will be celebrating the 17th year of this event. The Arbor Day tree will be planted at Tree Fest around 11:15 a.m. The public is invited to attend this event and help plant trees. The Arbor Day tree is a special tree this year because the Ohio Department of Natural Resources has given the City a tree to celebrate the 75th anniversary of ODNR. All 88 counties in Ohio will be given a tree and the City of Kettering will be planting the tree, on behalf of Montgomery County.

Mr. Sullivan asked what type of tree will be planted?

Mrs. Miles informed City Council she doesn't remember the type of tree but it is similar to a swamp tree.

Mrs. Miles informed City Council that hot dogs will be provided for participants of Tree Fest and it is a wonderful event. Residents of all ages are encouraged to come and plant trees and there will be demonstrations on how to plant trees. Over the past 17 years, there have been thousands of trees planted at Southdale and Pondview Park. Some of those trees are now producing other trees which it is rewarding to see this come to fruition. Tree Love is a new event and it will take place on April 20 from 1:00-5:00 p.m. to celebrate and educate residents about trees. There will be food, kids activities and the opportunity to speak to the arborist who will be onsite and able to answer questions. Smokey the Bear will be present at Tree Fest with ODNR teaching about preventing forest fires. The original artist of Smokey the Bear, Richard Black, is from Kettering, Ohio. Mrs. Miles informed the community the event is rain or shine and she is hopeful that the weather will be nice for Tree Fest. Mrs. Miles encouraged the community to come and plant trees at Tree Fest because trees are important to Kettering. Mrs. Miles thanked Mayor Lehner and City Council for all their support for environmental education.

Mayor Lehner thanked Mrs. Miles for all of her work with the environmental education program.

Proclamation- CDBG Week

Mrs. Hall read the above proclamation and the proclamation was accepted by Tom Robillard, Director of Planning & Development. Mr. Robillard expressed the City of Kettering has been participating in the Community Development Block Grant Program for over 40 years and funds from the program have been used for various activities including blight removal, fair housing activities, foreclosure prevention, first time homebuyer program and housing rehab. These programs assist low to moderate income families in the Kettering community. Mr. Robillard thanked Mayor Lehner and City Council for the proclamation.

Mayor Lehner thanked Mr. Robillard for all of his work with community development programs in Kettering.

Proclamation- Fair Housing Month

Mr. Suddith read the above proclamation and the proclamation was accepted by John Zimmerman, Vice President of the Miami Valley Fair Housing Center. Mr. Zimmerman expressed it was great that there was a proclamation for CDBG Week and Fair Housing Month and both proclamations are complimentary of one another. Mr. Zimmerman and Mr. Robillard were trading notes and they both realized they have over 20 years of service in improving housing for Kettering residents. The relationship between the City and the Miami Valley Fair Housing Center is vitally important and due to Kettering's support, the Miami Valley Fair Housing Center received an additional \$125,000 from HUD to further fair housing education which will include the City of Kettering. The money will be leveraged with the money that is given by the City of Kettering to provide free services to all Kettering residents. The Miami Valley Fair Housing Center is passionate about eliminating housing discrimination and ensure equal housing opportunities for all people in the region.

Ms. Duvall thanked Mr. Zimmerman for his involvement with fair housing seminars and the Board of Community Relations appreciates the educational seminars.

Mrs. Fisher expressed on the City Council agenda, there will be a vote to accept a donation from a former City of Kettering volunteer Jo Ann Keys. Ms. Keys volunteered thousands of hours and this represents the vital impact volunteers have on the Kettering community.

Proclamation- National Volunteer Week

Mrs. Fisher read the above proclamation and the proclamation was accepted by Dawn Kirchner, Volunteer Administrator. Mrs. Kirchner thanked Mayor Lehner and City Council for the proclamation. This year marks the 45th year of the City of Kettering's volunteer program. This volunteer program was one of the first local government volunteer programs in the nation and the City of Kettering's program continues to be a model program throughout the nation. Mrs. Kirchner expressed National Volunteer Week is an opportunity to recognize and thank volunteers who lend their time, talent, voices and support causes they care about to improve their communities. During National Volunteer Week, residents are encouraged to show appreciation to those generous individuals with thanks and any act of kindness. These simple acts perpetuate the good will fostered by their generosity. The City of Kettering is fortunate to have a community of individuals driven by passion and kindness. These acts help enhance daily operations, expand successful programs and events and strengthen Kettering neighborhoods. The City of Kettering Volunteer Program is not only successful because of the dedication of volunteers but because of the staff who work alongside them and the leadership of City Council. Mrs. Kirchner expressed the collaboration and support is appreciated.

Special Presentation- Mayor's Award for Volunteer Service

Mrs. Kirchner, Volunteer Administrator made the presentation. Mrs. Kirchner expressed the Mayor's Award for Volunteer Service was created in 1983, as a way to honor outstanding volunteers who are making valuable contributions to the Kettering community. Recipients of this award must either be a resident of Kettering or volunteer service should be performed in Kettering. In celebration of National Volunteer Week, a youth and an adult volunteer will be awarded the Mayor's Award for Volunteer Service.

Sophia Shank has been awarded the youth award. Sophia is a senior at Alter High School who has been highly involved as a volunteer, both in her school and throughout the community. She graduates in May, and plans to attend Miami University majoring in Political Science. Some of Sophia's volunteer work has been contributed to Leukemia & Lymphoma Society, St. Vincent de Paul, Learning Tree Farm, Girls Scouts, as an Alter Student Ambassador, as a Hope Squad peer facilitator, and as Co-Chair of the Key Club among others. During her high school career, Sophia has volunteered over 400 hours all while maintaining an impressive 4.2 GPA while taking AP and Honors classes.

Her nominator noted "She is a young lady who demonstrates respect, responsibility, kindness and perseverance, "and is a "humble role model for her peers and teachers". Mrs. Kirchner congratulated Miss. Shank and thanked for her being a positive youth in the community.

Mayor Lehner congratulated Miss Shank and presented her with a certificate.

Mrs. Kirchner mentioned Peggy Spencer is the adult award winner and had an impressive 18 nominations. Peggy Spencer has been a longtime volunteer at Greenmont Elementary School. When

her son and grandchildren attended Greenmont, Peggy actively volunteered with the PTA, coordinating fairs, fundraisers, and prepared Friday Folders. Although her son and grandchildren have long-since left Greenmont, Ms. Peggy still happily and tirelessly prepares daily and weekly materials for teachers. She creates folders, makes books and booklets, staples packets, sharpens the paper cutter, un-jams the copier, laminates, cuts out letters, shapes, and pictures, and hand-delivers finished items to classrooms. She often takes projects home to complete, collects recycling throughout the building, helps in the cafeteria, sooths nervous students on picture day, and even assists with kindergarten registration. In fact, Ms. Peggy is such a familiar smiling face to students at Greenmont, that many students lovingly call her "Nana."

In addition to all the volunteer work she does for the teachers, students, and staff daily at Greenmont, she is also the sole caretaker for her aging father, and manages his appointments, household repairs, and meals. Mrs. Kirchner thanked Ms. Spencer for her volunteer service and mentioned her dedication to serving educators and students is inspiring.

Mayor Lehner congratulated Ms. Spencer and presented her with a certificate.

Ms. Duvall expressed she often talks about Greenmont Elementary and their volunteers. Ms. Spencer embodies the spirit of Greenmont Elementary and her children have benefited from Ms. Spencer's volunteerism, and she stuffed many Friday folders with Ms. Spencer. This is an award well deserved.

Mayor Lehner expressed it is always fun to recognize special people within the Kettering community.
