AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INCENTIVE GRANT AGREEMENT WITH NORTHWESTERN TOOLS, INC.

WHEREAS, Northwestern Tools, Inc. ("Northwestern") desires to purchase the property at 4800 Hempstead Station Drive and relocate its business there from 3130 Valleywood Drive; and

WHEREAS, in order to do so, Northwestern requires an economic development incentive grant from the City of Kettering; and

WHEREAS, Northwestern intends to retain approximately 27 full-time equivalent employees after its move with a total annual payroll of approximately \$1.4 million;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Council of the City of Kettering, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into an Economic Development Incentive Grant Agreement with Northwestern and to provide Northwestern with an incentive estimated at \$65,000 over a 5-year grant period. AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF APPLICATIONS FOR FEDERAL FAST ACT FUNDS THROUGH THE MIAMI VALLEY REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission ("MVRPC") has solicited local government entities to submit new transportation projects for Federal FAST Act Transportation funds; and

WHEREAS, the following list of projects will be submitted to MVRPC, shown in order of the City's priority and including the required local match:

- East David Road Resurfacing Ackerman to Wilmington (Project No. 02-116Q). Estimated Local Share = \$707,484;
- 2. West Stroop Road Sidewalk Overland Trail to NW Southmoor Circle (Project No. 05-213E). Estimated Local Share = \$94,900;
- East Rahn Road Reconstruction Centerville Corp. Line to Bigger Road (Project No. 02-130i). Estimated Local Share = \$756,704;

WHEREAS, the City will request that the following exemptions to MVRPC's Regional Complete Streets Policy be granted:

- 1. East David Road Resurfacing: Exemption #4 the project consists of resurfacing of an existing cross-section only.
- 2. West Stroop Road Sidewalk: No exemption required.
- 3. East Rahn Road Reconstruction: Exemption #2 Rahn Road provides adequate infrastructure to accommodate all users, and is complete without further enhancements..

WHEREAS, the City of Kettering will commit to a timely project development schedule; and

WHEREAS, the City of Kettering will commit the necessary resources to support the local cost portion of the projects;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Council of the City of Kettering, State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1</u>. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to submit applications to MVRPC as set forth in the preamble.

<u>Section 2</u>. The City Manager is hereby directed and authorized to take or cause to be taken all other action necessary and proper to secure the funding sought by the application referred to herein and provide any additional information sought by reviewing agencies during the time the application is under review. The City Manager is further directed and authorized to cause compliance with all reporting requirements of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission as part of the funding process.

<u>Section 3</u>. Upon application approval, the City hereby states its commitment to the local contribution for the project as identified in these applications, including local contribution of costs exceeding the current estimates or subsequent revised estimates as accepted by the MVRPC.

<u>Section 4</u>. The Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law.

Planning Commission hereby certifies that a public hearing was held at their meeting on October 2, 2017 with a decision reached at that meeting.

Planning Commission hereby submits its recommendation to Council that the requested Zoning Text Amendment to EDO-15 be approved.

Vote of the Planning Commission

The motion recommending approval was passed by a vote of 3:0.

Reason for Request

The proposed request is for the modification of the approved EDO-15 Zoning Document to permit the installation of new entry signage for the Kettering Business Park. The original EDO-15 document was written very rigidly, with a complete set of design guidelines and a specific graphic for a <u>single</u> entry sign permitted for this 175 acre development. While the development has one main entry, since the Business Park also now houses the Kettering Municipal Court, some ground signage for this significant public facility is now also appropriate.
