# Office of the Mayor COLLAMATION Whereas: National Employ Older Workers Week

(NEOWW) was first celebrated during the Eisenhower Administration over 50 years ago. The U.S. Department of Labor recognizes it during the last full week in September and, with the ranks of older workers now growing to historic numbers, it is even more relevant today; and

WHEREAS: This year, NEOWW will occur September 25 - 29, 2017. According to the latest data from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, almost 20 percent of Americans 65 and older are still a part of the workforce. This represents the highest percentage of older people with a job since the early 1960s, before the U.S. enacted Medicare; and

WHEREAS: The average and median age of the U.S. population is rising, and the composition of the workforce with it. By 2020, it is estimated that workers 55 and over will make up 25% of the U.S. civilian labor force, up from 13% in 2000. In addition, individual workers are tending to remain in the workforce longer and retire later. Employers rate older workers high on characteristics such as judgment, commitment to quality, attendance, and punctuality; and

WHEREAS: Many companies are beginning to recognize the value in tapping into this talent pool in order to leverage the skills and experience of mature workers. In addition, that is the basic message for NEOWW: older workers are valuable economic contributors, and employers who develop strategies to recruit and retain them will benefit as their numbers continue to increase. It also presents an opportunity to educate the public about the value and benefits of hiring older workers; and

WHEREAS: National Employ Older Workers Week, held annually the last full week of September, recognizes the vital role of older workers in the workforce.

# AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A FAÇADE AND SITE IMPROVEMENT GRANT AGREEMENT FOR THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 2537 WILMINGTON PIKE

WHEREAS, in Resolution No. 9393-13, this City Council approved and authorized the City of Kettering Façade and Site Improvement Program ("Program") to provide financial assistance to property owners in order to improve and encourage reinvestment in the Wilmington Pike Corridor and thereby benefit the public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the owner of the property located at 2537 Wilmington Pike (the "Property") wants to make façade and site improvements to the Property (the "Project") but needs financial assistance in order to do so;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Council of the City of Kettering, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a Program grant agreement with the owner of 2537 Wilmington Pike to provide reimbursement of up to 50% of Project costs not to exceed \$25,000. The City Manager is further authorized to enter into any amendments to the grant agreement that, in the City Manager's opinion, are beneficial to the interests of the City and further the Program.

<u>Section 2.</u> As provided in Section 4-8 of the City Charter, this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

# ENDORSING ISSUE 3 TO PROVIDE LOCAL FUNDING FOR COMMUNITY HUMAN SERVICES IN THE CITY OF KETTERING AND MONTGOMERY COUNTY

WHEREAS, in Montgomery County, including the City of Kettering, over 50,000 vulnerable children, seniors, families, and adults receive community human services such as foster care, adoption, and family services. These services provide aid to individuals in a host of ways, including, but not limited to: protection services for abused and neglected children; immunization and health care for infants, toddlers, and preschoolers; home health care, home delivered meals, flu shots, and other services for seniors; early diagnosis and supportive services for children and adults with mental and other disabilities; medical care for individuals and families, who cannot afford health and hospital care; and employment training and assistance for the unemployed; and

WHEREAS, the local funding for these services is provided by two tax levies, one of which is expiring; and

WHEREAS, without the expiring levy, an excess of \$50 million will be lost which will result in drastic cuts in services, which cuts in turn will be felt by citizens in every community in Montgomery County including Kettering; and

WHEREAS, renewal of the 6.03-mill levy has been placed on the November 7, 2017 ballot as Issue 3; and

WHEREAS, the funds raised by the passage of Issue 3 will be distributed among several entities, each of which administers the various human services previously mentioned. These entities include: Montgomery County Children Services, Montgomery County Board of Developmental Disabilities, Montgomery County Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services, Public Health – Dayton and Montgomery County, and over 50 critical not-for-profit and faith-based agencies that work cooperatively with state and federal agencies to ensure the provision of services for the residents of the City of Kettering and Montgomery County;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it Resolved by the Council of the City of Kettering, State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1.</u> This Council hereby endorses the passage of Issue 3 to ensure continued local funding for community human services in the City of Kettering and Montgomery County and encourages all Kettering residents to vote for Issue 3 on November 7, 2017.

Section 2. This Resolution shall take full force and effect immediately upon its adoption.

# AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT GRANT FUNDS FROM THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF REHABILITATION AND CORRECTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Kettering, Ohio that:

<u>Section 1</u>. The City Manager is hereby authorized to apply for one or more grants from the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction ("ODRC") for Probation Improvement and Incentive Funding and to sign any related agreements and instruments and any amendments thereto.

<u>Section 2</u>. The City Manager is further authorized to accept an additional ODRC interim grant in the amount of \$33,689.00, awarded to the City for its successful implementation of the Kettering Municipal Court probation program, and to sign any related agreements and instruments and any amendments thereto.

Section 3. The grant(s) will be used to pay for the costs of SCRAM bracelets, ignition interlock devices, and other treatment options for indigent defendants, as well as for a portion of the salary and benefit costs for a probation officer to monitor defendants' treatment and progress. No matching funds from the City are required.
