LED STREETLIGHT FIXTURE PROJECT

Work is underway to upgrade nearly 2200 streetlight fixtures throughout the city of Kettering. New LED streetlight fixtures will replace outdated mercury vapor and high pressure sodium lighting fixtures.

The biggest change residents will notice is that the new LED lights provide a true-to-color, consistent white light whereas the existing streetlight fixtures cast an orange colored light that can vary in intensity.

Residents may also notice that the new fixtures concentrate the light directly over the roadway, as opposed to dispersing light across both roadway and

RESIDENTIAL LEAF COLLECTION SERVICE

The City of Kettering Street Department team is currently conducting residential leaf collection services. The City will continue the collection of leaves until December 4.

The city is divided by districts and crews work through the districts in numerical order in several rounds. Our recommendation is that you begin raking leaves as soon as they begin to fall and keep raking as needed throughout the fall. Simply keep the pile in your yard at the curb edge and rest assured that our team will be back around to collect them. As always, leaves will be picked up and taken to the City's leaf composting center where it will be converted to leaf mulch and compost. adjacent areas.

The LED fixtures have many benefits including increased energy efficiency, improved nighttime visibility and safety, reduced glare and reduced maintenance costs. The conversion project will be complete by the end of 2016. For more information please visit www.ketteringoh.org.

Did you know that in addition to our<u>City of</u> <u>Kettering Facebook page</u> and Twitter posts the City of Kettering uses a Please remember the following tips for leaf pickup:

- Call 296-3255 (FALL) or <u>click here</u> to find out the current district where crews are completing leaf pick up.
- Prior to collection, rake your leaves to the edge of your yard along the curb, but not into the street where they will block traffic and cause a hazard.
- Do not bag your leaves or block storm drains.
- Make sure leaves are not under, between or around parked cars.
- Please don't rake anything except leaves out to the curb for pick-up. Branches, sticks, grass and other yard waste clog the machinery and throw the crews off schedule. You may take your tree branches and brush to the City's Yard Debris Drop-Off Center located on Woodman Center Dr. or place them in your trash toter for pick-up by Waste Management on normal trash pick-up day.
- Remind your kids they should NEVER play in leaves piled along the roadway. Motorists, as well as the Public Service crews, can't see children hidden in leaves.

TRAFFIC ALERT FOR STROOP ROAD



The City of Kettering recently completed a repaving project on the portion of Stroop Road between Shroyer Road and Dorothy Lane. During the project, existing deterioration in the beams of the bridge on Stroop Road was exposed and in several areas the milling further compromised the integrity of the bridge.
