### RESIDENTIAL LEAF COLLECTION SERVICE BEGINS THIS MONDAY OCTOBER 17

Fall is here and the City of Kettering Street
Department team is preparing for leaf pickup
season. The City will begin in District 1 on October
17 and will continue the collection of leaves until
December 4.

The following short video explains everything you need to know about the residential leaf collection program.



The city is divided by districts and crews work through the districts in numerical order in several rounds. Our recommendation is that you begin raking leaves as soon as they begin to fall and keep raking as needed throughout the fall. Simply keep the pile in your yard at the curb edge and rest assured that our team will be back around to

collect them. As always, leaves will be picked up and taken to the City's leaf composting center where it will be converted to leaf mulch and compost.

Please remember the following tips for leaf pickup:

- Call 296-3255 (FALL) or <u>click here</u> to find out the current district where crews are completing leaf pick up.
- Prior to collection, rake your leaves to the edge of your yard along the curb, but not into the street where they will block traffic and cause a hazard.
- Do not bag your leaves or block storm drains.
- Make sure leaves are not under, between or around parked cars.
- Please don't rake anything except leaves out to the curb for pick-up. Branches, sticks, grass and other yard waste clog the machinery and throw the crews off schedule. You may take your tree branches and brush to the City's Yard Debris Drop-Off Center located on Woodman Center Dr. or place them in your trash toter for pick-up by Waste Management on your normal trash pick-up day.
- Remind your kids they should NEVER play in leaves piled along the roadway. Motorists, as well as the Public Service crews, can't see children hidden in leaves.

repaving project on the portion of Stroop Road between Shroyer Road and Dorothy Lane. The contractor was instructed by the City to mill the entire asphalt roadway surface at a consistent depth. In doing so, existing deterioration in the beams of the bridge on Stroop Road, approximately 1,600 feet east of Woodman Drive, was exposed and in several areas the milling further compromised the integrity of the bridge.

The Montgomery County Engineer owns the bridge, and has determined that temporary safety measures must be put in place until the bridge can be replaced. These measures include reducing traffic to one lane in each direction along Stroop Road, and a 15 ton maximum weight restriction for vehicles traveling over the bridge. These measures will be in place for the foreseeable future.

The City of Kettering and the Montgomery County Engineer are working in close coordination to ensure the safety of the traveling public who use Stroop Road and to work on a solution to replace the bridge as soon as funding can be secured.


