NEIGHBORHOOD PRIDE

Healthy neighborhoods make Kettering a great place to live! Good, stable, attractive neighborhoods maintain property values. The Neighborhood Pride Award recognizes residents who have made significant improvements to the appearance of their home or who have maintained their home impeccably year after year. Last summer over 400 properties were nominated for this award. You will receive a letter and postcard from Mayor Patterson in May. To nominate a property in Kettering, all you have to do is complete the postcard and return it to us or complete a nomination online at www.ketteringoh.org.

This Neighborhood Pride Award is a very prestigious award. Winners are recognized publicly at a City Council meeting, and an attractive sign is placed in the property owner's front yard.

A dedicated committee of 50 volunteers completes the judging of this award. These volunteers spend many hours observing all homes that have been nominated. The committee begins meeting in May and continues to meet throughout the summer. These volunteers are very
