INCOME TAX DEDUCTION

There are deductions you are allowed for volunteer service if you itemize using Form 1040 on your 2015 Federal Income Tax Return. Unreimbursed expenses while volunteering, that are deductible, include automobile mileage to and from your volunteer job, bus fare, parking fees, long distance calls, postage, uniforms and supplies. These deductions apply to your volunteer work for other places as well as the City.

The Charles I. Lathrem Senior Center will be taking reservations for income tax assistance. This service is free and available to seniors 60 and older, or if you are low income. Appointments are limited to one hour per client. Therefore, you must have all your forms, receipts and information ready and in order when you come in. Please call the tax hotline at 296-2480 to schedule your appointment.

Thanks so much to Bob Ellis and his awesome team of volunteers! Because of the dedication and commitment of these volunteers, nearly 2,000 tax returns will be prepared at the Lathrem Senior Center making the Center one of the largest tax assistance sites in the state! Way to go!



WINTER CHALLENGES

Winter is here and we want to ensure all of our volunteers stay safe. Please use good judgment during the snow, ice or extreme cold. It is the policy of the volunteer office for you to stay inside when the weather is nasty. Do not come in to vol

weather is nasty. Do not come in to volunteer! We need your assistance all year long, so please do not risk your health this winter by coming to volunteer during days of inclement weather!

KEEPING FIT

If you think like the majority of American people, after the holidays is the time to start your fitness program. The volunteer office can help you! Take advantage of KEEP (Kettering Employee Exercise Program). This program offers City employees and volunteers the opportunity to improve their personal health through exercise at a reduced cost. Volunteers who have contributed 100 hours of service and are currently volunteering are eligible for a 20% discount on the following fitness options: annual fitness room pass; seasonal pool pass; seasonal skate pass; annual aerobics pass; annual/seasonal combination pass or drop-in gym pass.

If you are interested in KEEP, please call the volunteer office, at 296-2433 for a letter of eligibility to take to the Kettering Recreation Complex before purchasing your pass.

OPPORTUNITIES

- Volunteer receptionists are needed in the different departments within the City. You would be called as needed for the various departments. Most of the assignments are a two-hour commitment and involve greeting visitors and answering the phones. What a great way to get out of the house and meet new people!
- During the months of January through April the City of Kettering tax department will rely on many volunteers to assist in opening and sorting mail and greeting the public when they come in to pay their taxes. These shifts are normally 2 to 3 hours. Volunteers can work one shift or multiple shifts. We'll work with your schedule!
- Looking for something to do this summer? Why not consider volunteering at Fraze Pavilion? Shifts are 2 to 3 hours. Volunteers are asked to work 6 to 8 shows, depending on the number of shows and the number of volunteers. Volunteers must be able to stand 2 to 3 hours and must be able to endure all types of weather.
- Volunteers are needed to scan documents. This position requires 2 to 3 hours a week.
- We are looking for volunteers to serve on our Neighborhood Pride Committee. This is an excellent opportunity for previous Neighborhood Pride winners, current volunteers and Master Gardeners to get involved in our neighborhoods. Volunteers will assist in reviewing nominations and judging properties to be awarded in June, July and August. Positions require 3 to 4 hours a month. What a wonderful way to help accent some of our well-kept properties in Kettering!
