THE POSITION

The City of Kettering's Award winning Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts Department is recruiting to fill the regular full-time position of Superintendent (Recreation). The Superintendent is a professional and administrative position responsible for directly managing and coordinating the activities and operations of the Recreation Division, including the associated recreation facilities, programs and staff. The Superintendent works closely with the Leadership Team members to ensure department communication, collaboration and accountability.
