Make A Difference Day Draws Hundreds of Volunteers

The last Saturday in October is an inspiring day across our nation. The City of Kettering has participated in National *Make A Difference Day*, the largest day of service, since it was created in the early nineties. Projects have varied throughout the years but each and every year hundreds of volunteers participate in our projects. The 2019 project consisted of both an indoor and an outdoor activity. Christ Church United Methodist served as

the host site as volunteers of all ages gathered to create holiday greeting cards for our active duty military and holiday placemats for those residing in area nursing homes. As part of the Cities of Service (COS) initiative, volunteers assisted with outdoor projects including tree planting in Irelan Park, outdoor yard maintenance and the distribution of emergency disaster preparedness starter kits in the COS neighborhood. Once again, the collaboration between

community partners and volunteers from all walks of life made this day a success! As a result, 1.75 tons of brush and debris were removed from the COS neighborhood; 6 properties were improved; 9 trees were planted; 175 holiday placemats were created; 279 emergency preparedness starter kits were distributed; 282 holiday greeting cards were created; and 450 hours of service were donated by nearly 200 volunteers!

Citizen Police Academy

The Citizen Police Academy (CPA) is designed to introduce the citizens of Kettering and surrounding communities to the operations of the Kettering Police Department (KPD). Those attending will experience an in-depth look at the job of law enforcement and the many challenges officers face on a daily basis. CPA is an interactive course that allows students to experience every facet of law enforcement in a controlled setting. This format provides an open forum to increase public awareness and support for the police department. The CPA classes are taught by KPD employees who believe that an informed citizen is an excellent resource for both the community and the police department. Classes are free of charge and take place on Wednesday evenings from 6:30 to 9 p.m. for eight weeks.
