her children, she began serving the City of Kettering by joining the Sister City Committee. She went on to serve eight years on city council. She then served two terms as Mayor from 1998 to 2006. She served on countless boards and committees including the Board of Community Relations; Alter High School Board of Trustees; Kettering Medical Center Board of Trustees; the city's 50th Anniversary Committee; just to name a few. As stated by Mayor Patterson, "Mayor Smith was the finest ambassador for the City of Kettering, a vital asset to the community, and was a genuine friend to all its residents. She was the People's Mayor."



We also mourn the loss of longtime Kettering Volunteer Advisory Councilmember, Pam Cochran. Pam recently retired as

property manager of Town & Country Shopping Center. In addition to serving on the Advisory Council, she was a graduate and board member of the Kettering Leadership Academy; a member of the Kettering Noon Optimist club and Optimist of the Year for 2003 - 2004; a former grand marshal of the Kettering Holiday at Home Parade; a Kettering Backpack board member and a member of the KMO Chamber of Commerce Board.
