



# AFFIRMING THE DECISION OF THE KETTERING BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS IN BZA CASE NO. 20-016 CONCERNING THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 3825 WILMINGTON PIKE

WHEREAS, on October 26, 2021, the Board of Zoning Appeals ("BZA") conducted a public hearing in BZA Case No. 20-016 in the matter of an appeal of the denial of an application for a structure permit (S19-05553) concerning the property located at 3825 Wilmington Pike ("the Property"); and

WHEREAS, on October 26, 2021, the BZA denied the appeal (the "BZA Decision"); and

WHEREAS, a complete written appeal of the BZA Decision was timely filed by William R. Jenkins (the "Appellant"); and

WHEREAS, Appellant waived the time requirement for this Council to hear the appeal so that Council could hear the appeal in person; and

WHEREAS, this Council heard the appeal on April 13, 2021; and

WHEREAS, Appellant was given prior notice of the day and time of the public hearing and the opportunity to appear before this Council and be heard regarding the appeal of the BZA's decision; and

WHEREAS, Appellant was not prevented from being represented at the public hearing or presenting written arguments to this Council; and

WHEREAS, at the April 13, 2021 public hearing conducted by this Council, the Appellant was allowed to: (1) present Appellant's positions, arguments and contentions; (2) offer and examine witnesses, under oath, and present evidence in support of Appellant's positions, arguments, and contentions; (3) cross examine witnesses purporting to refute their position, arguments, and contentions; (4) offer evidence to refute evidence and testimony offered in opposition to Appellant's positions, arguments and contentions; and (5) proffer any evidence into the record; and

WHEREAS, neither the Appellant nor any other person were prevented from presenting evidence to this City Council by reason of lack of the power of subpoena by the City Council or the refusal of City Council to exercise such power upon request;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Council of the City of Kettering, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The recital paragraphs are incorporated into this Section 1 as if fully rewritten berein

<u>Section 2.</u> Based on the record before this Council, Council finds that the Appellant did not meet the burden of proof for showing error in the BZA Decision. Therefore the appeal is denied and the BZA Decision is affirmed.

<u>Section 3</u>. This Council may subsequently enact a resolution to adopt its conclusions of fact which support this decision.

WHEREAS, on October 26, 2021, the Board of Zoning Appeals ("BZA") conducted a public hearing in BZA Case No. 20-016 in the matter of an appeal of the denial of an application for a structure permit (S19-05553) concerning the property located at 3825 Wilmington Pike ("the Property"); and

WHEREAS, on October 26, 2021, the BZA denied the appeal (the "BZA Decision"); and

WHEREAS, a complete written appeal of the BZA Decision was timely filed by William R. Jenkins (the "Appellant"); and

WHEREAS, at the April 13, 2021 public hearing conducted by this Council, the Appellant was allowed to: (1) present Appellant's positions, arguments and contentions; (2) offer and examine witnesses, under oath, and present evidence in support of Appellant's positions, arguments, and contentions; (3) cross examine witnesses purporting to refute their position, arguments, and contentions; (4) offer evidence to refute evidence and testimony offered in opposition to Appellant's positions, arguments and contentions; and (5) proffer any evidence into the record; and

WHEREAS, neither the Appellant nor any other person were prevented from presenting evidence to this City Council by reason of lack of the power of subpoena by the City Council or the refusal of City Council to exercise such power upon request;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Council of the City of Kettering, State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1.</u> The recital paragraphs are incorporated into this Section 1 as if fully rewritten herein.

<u>Section 2.</u> Based on the record before this Council, Council finds that the Appellant demonstrated error in the BZA Decision warranting reversal. Therefore, the appeal is granted and the BZA Decision is reversed.

<u>Section 3.</u> This Council may subsequently enact a resolution to adopt its conclusions of fact which support this decision.

# AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A FAÇADE AND SITE IMPROVEMENT GRANT AGREEMENT FOR THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 3035 WILMINGTON PIKE

WHEREAS, in Resolution No. 9393-13, this City Council approved and authorized the City of Kettering Façade and Site Improvement Program ("Program") to provide financial assistance to property owners in order to improve and encourage reinvestment in the Wilmington Pike Corridor and thereby benefit the public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the owner of the property located at 3035 Wilmington Pike (the "Property") wants to make façade and site improvements to the Property (the "Project") but needs financial assistance in order to do so;
