We were delighted to honor our volunteers in person this fall on November 18! The event was made available as a hybrid, offering two ways for volunteers to celebrate. From 10:30 - 11:30 a.m., volunteers were able to drive through and pick up a hot boxed lunch, thank you gift, and safely interact with Mayor Patterson, members of City Council, and City Staff. At noon, volunteers attending in person enjoyed a traditional roast turkey lunch, and Mayor Patterson awarded certificates and gifts to volunteers based on the number of hours contributed since they began volunteering for the City's program. Despite limited opportunities due to the pandemic, 316 volunteers were

still able to contribute 6,352 hours of service, saving the City \$166,543! Fabulous door prizes were also given away thanks to the generosity of local business owners!

All volunteers were invited to donate personal care items to Kettering Clean Care, dedicated to providing basic toiletry items to children in need in our community. Three large – and very heavy – boxes filled with a variety of items were gratefully accepted!

Make A Difference Day Success

For decades, **National Make A Difference Day** has successfully encouraged the involvement of individuals in being actively

engaged as change makers in their communities. The City of Kettering is proud to participate in this annual event, held the fourth Saturday in October. This year, 68 volunteers came together to plant 115 red oak seedlings donated by Cox Arboretum, and removed invasive honeysuckle from the trails at the Habitat Environment Center. Volunteers also helped create holiday greeting cards to be distributed throughout the world to our active duty military through Blue Star Mothers. A total of 75 hours were contributed from home by 37 volunteers who contributed 430 cards. At Christ Church United

Methodist, a total of 68 hours were contributed by 25 volunteers to create another 44 holiday cards, as well as 44 place mats distributed to area nursing homes.

A total of 130 volunteers of all ages, representing 12 organizations came together to donate 382 hours of time! This generosity improved the health of our outdoor environment for all to enjoy, and their creativity enlightened the lives of others locally and globally!





Volunteers Needed!

With increasing demand, the Lathrem Center is in need of volunteers to work as Transportation Services Dispatchers and Drivers. Dispatchers work with members by phone to schedule rides within the service area. Dispatch volunteers are needed between the hours of 8 –10:30 a.m. Monday through Friday. Volunteer drivers are responsible for transporting members to scheduled appointments. Drivers are most regularly needed between 8 a.m. – Noon Monday through Friday. Transportation vehicles are sedans or mini vans, so no special class of driver's license is required. If you enjoy chatting and interacting with a variety of individuals, one of these positions may be a great opportunity for you!

TAX SEASON IS APPROACHING!

But, that doesn't mean it needs to be a time to dread! If you enjoy helping with tax preparation, we are seeking volunteers to help at the Charles I. Lathrem Senior Center. If doing taxes makes you want to procrastinate to the fullest, the Lathrem Center will soon be taking reservations for income tax assistance. This service is free and available to individuals 50 and older who are unable to afford tax preparation services. Appointments are limited to one hour per client, meaning you must have all of your forms, receipts, and information ready and in order upon arrival. To take advantage of this opportunity, call the tax hotline at 937-296-2480 to schedule your appointment.

More good news: deductions are allowed for volunteer service if you itemize using Schedule A (Form 1040) on your 2021 Federal Income Tax Return. Unreimbursed, deductible volunteer expenses include automobile mileage to and from your volunteer job, bus fare, parking fees, long distance calls, postage, uniforms, and supplies. These deductions apply to your volunteer work for other places as well as the City. Consult your tax advisor for specific details.
