Mr. Schwieterman gave an update regarding electricity aggregation. Many residents have heard that the current rates under the standard service option for AES will be going up in June and will see a significant price increase in the supply cost. The supply cost is essentially doubling which will create a higher utility bill for residents that utilize the standard option. It is not a doubling of the bill it is a doubling of the supply portion. Bills will increase but they will not double. City administration and City Council have been receiving a lot of questions from residents wanting to know if the city will be offering an aggregation program. Years ago, the city did have an aggregation program for gas, but have not had an aggregation program for electric. However, the city is authorized to do so since the voters in the community passed a ballot issue years ago that would allow the city to do an aggregation program. City administration and City Council are looking into an aggregation program to see if that is an option to purse for the community. The aggregation program would apply to residents and small businesses within the community. The city is looking into this option and also the option to join an aggregation program with other communities in the region to see if utilizing larger buying power to create a better rate. This option is not a short-term solution. It takes a few months if not longer to create an aggregation program and to make it available to the community. Residents currently have choices in regards to their electric bills. The Apples to Apples website has comparison rates available for individual residential properties for purchasing alternative electricity supply. That is the short-term solution; the city may have an alternative to aggregation in the future. City administration is still in the process of researching and working on that topic. If residents have questions regarding aggregation they can contact the City Manager's Office at 937-296-2412.

Ms. Duvall informed the community that anyone who applies to host a block party for their neighborhood could receive free ice cream for their block party. This was made possible from a grant received by the Board of Community Relations.
