WHEREAS: The citizens of Kettering take great pride in supporting our namesake vessel, USS Ohio.



TO REPEAL SUBSECTION 941.05(d) OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES REGULATING KNIVES IN PARKS

WHEREAS, the Ohio General Assembly enacted section 9.68 of the Ohio Revised Code ("R.C. 9.68") which prohibited municipalities from adopting firearm regulations in conflict with the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Supreme Court ruled that R.C. 9.68 was a uniform law of the state, was constitutional, and that municipalities had to comply with it; and

WHEREAS, in Amended Substitute Senate Bill Number 156, the 134th Ohio General Assembly amended R.C. 9.68 to include knives and thereby created a statewide uniform knife law which prohibited municipalities from adopting or enforcing knife regulations in conflict with those contained in the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, the amendments made to R.C. 9.68 by Amended Substitute Senate Bill Number 156 will be effective September 13, 2022; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to reconcile Kettering Codified Ordinance Section 941.05 with the R.C. 9.68;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Council of the City of Kettering, State of Ohio that:

Section 1. Subsection 941.05(d) of the Codified Ordinances is repealed.

<u>Section 2.</u> As provided in Section 4-8 of the City Charter, this Ordinance shall be effective two weeks after adoption.
