WHEREAS, Resolution Nos. 10525-21, 10696-22, and 10716-22 (collectively, the "Resolutions") authorized the City Manager to purchase equipment through sealed bids, negotiated quotes, or a cooperative purchasing program; and

WHEREAS, due to prevailing market and supply chain conditions, the City Manager has been unable to purchase some equipment through sealed bids, negotiated quotes, or a cooperative purchasing program as such equipment is currently unavailable or only available on a "first come, first served" basis necessitating purchases from sole sources suppliers;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Council of the City of Kettering, State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1</u>. Resolution Nos. 10525-21, 10696-22, and 10716-22 are amended to authorize the City Manager to purchase equipment through sole source suppliers if the equipment could not be reasonably purchased through sealed bids, negotiated quotes, or a cooperative purchasing program.
