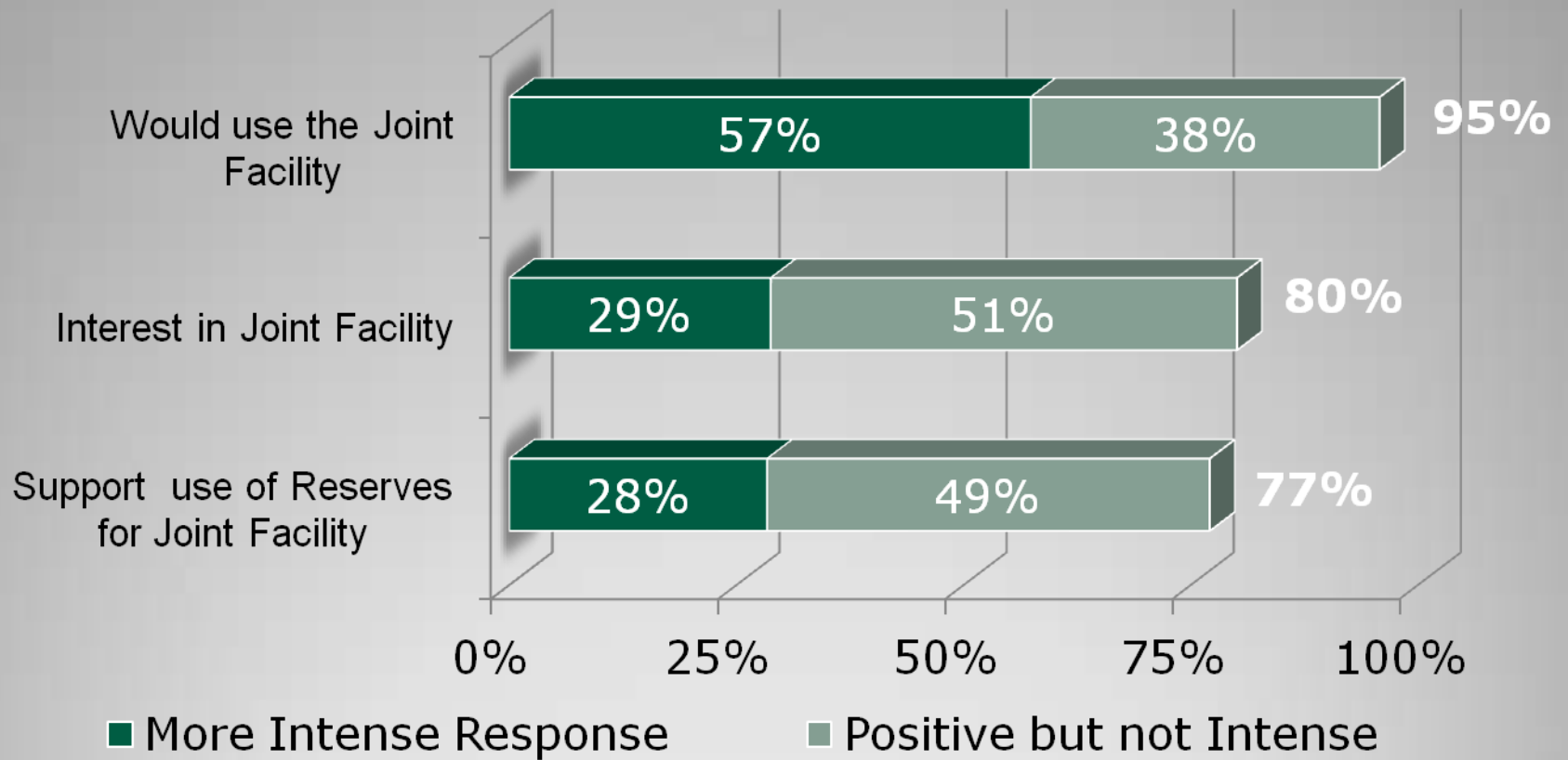

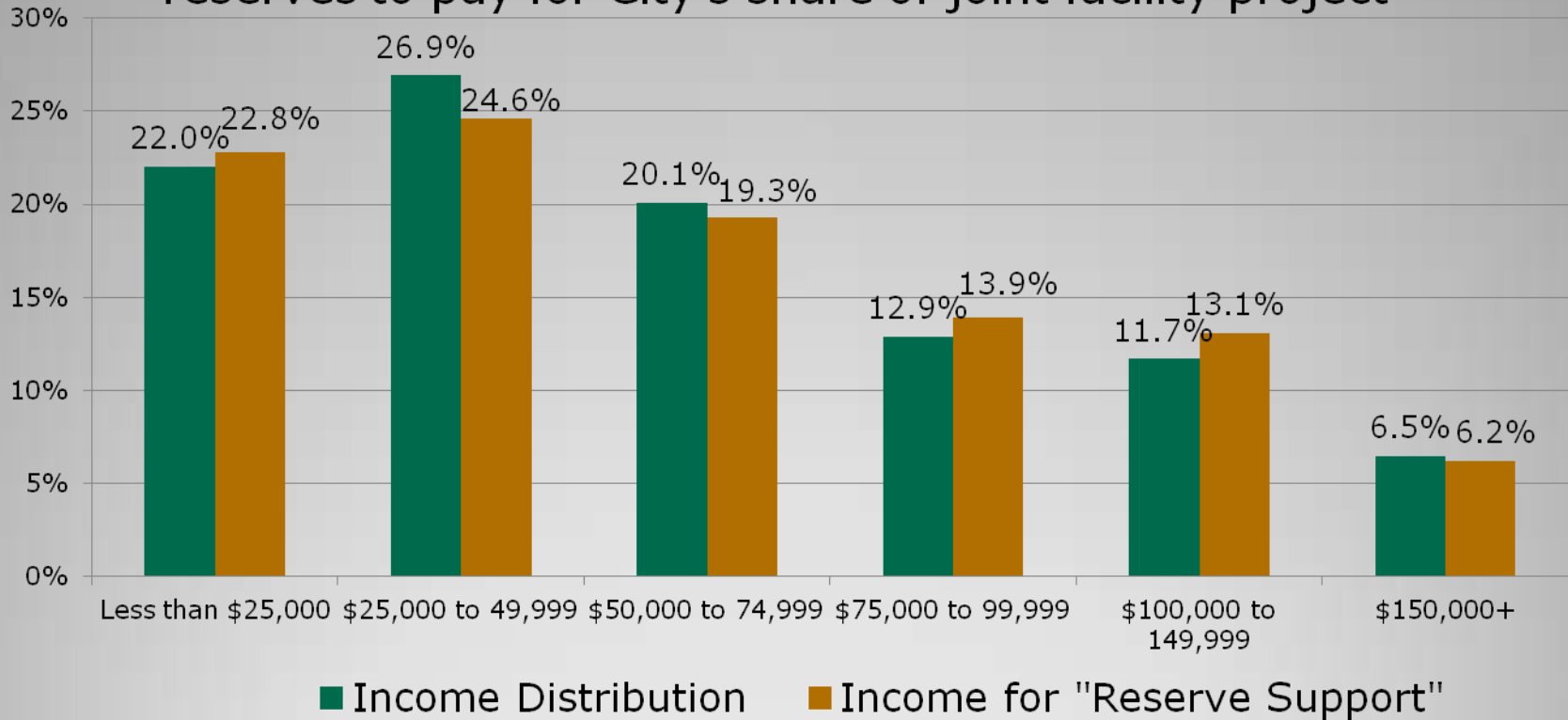

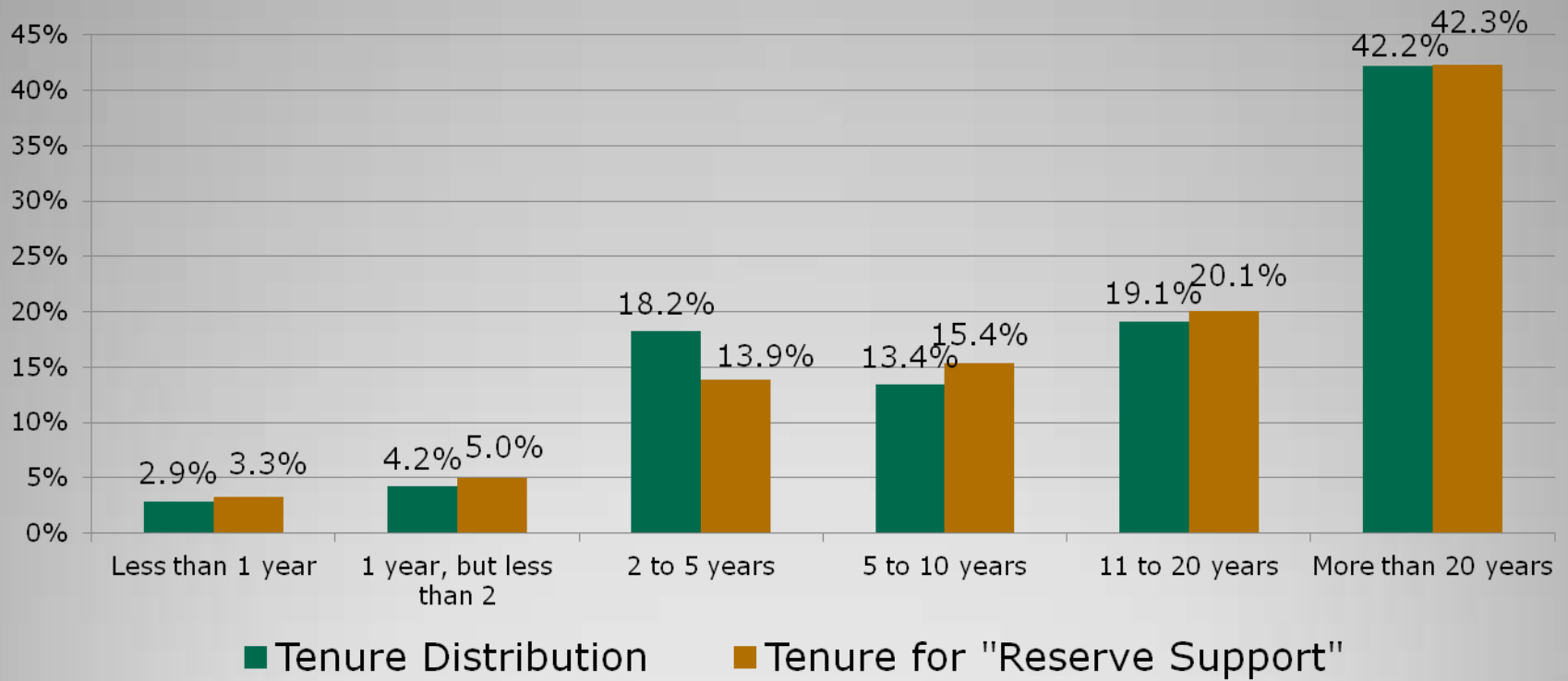
Wide use, wide interest, wide support for Joint Facility

Length of Residence by Support for use of City Reserves on Project

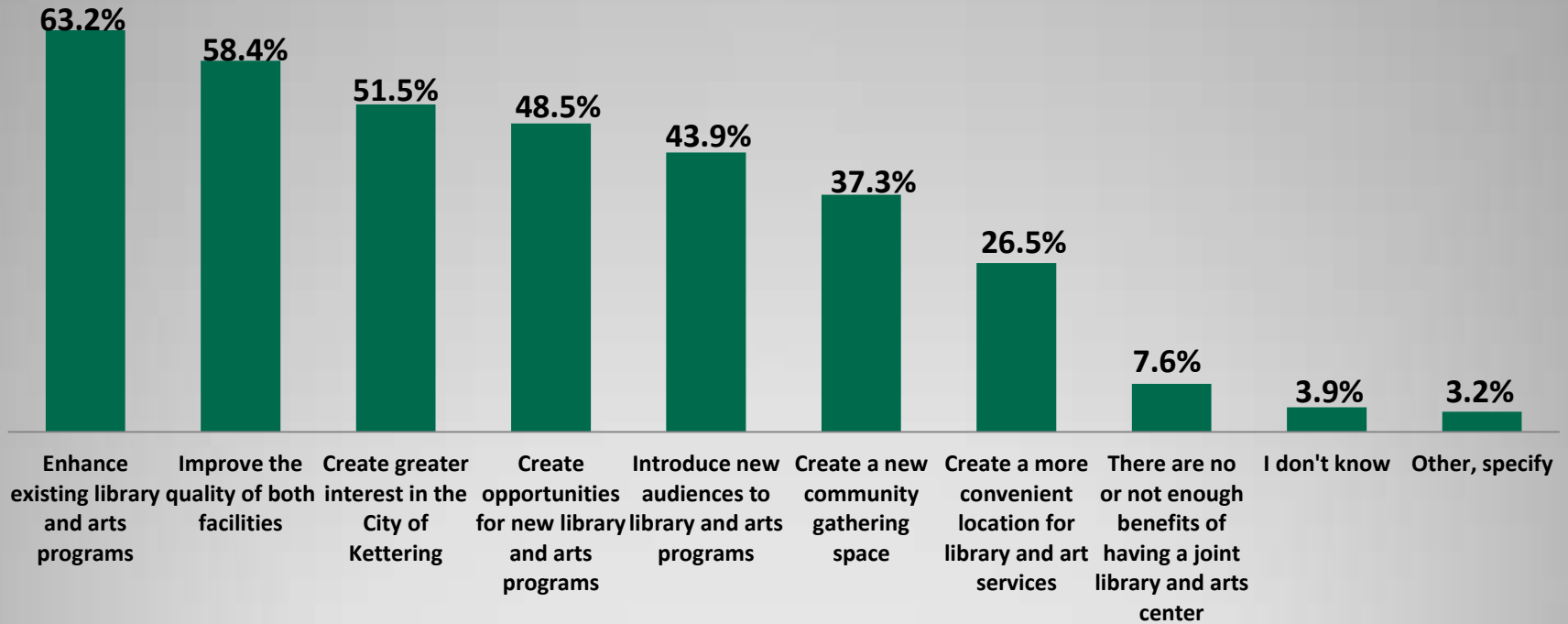
Own or Rent in relation to use of City reserves to pay for City's share of joint facility project

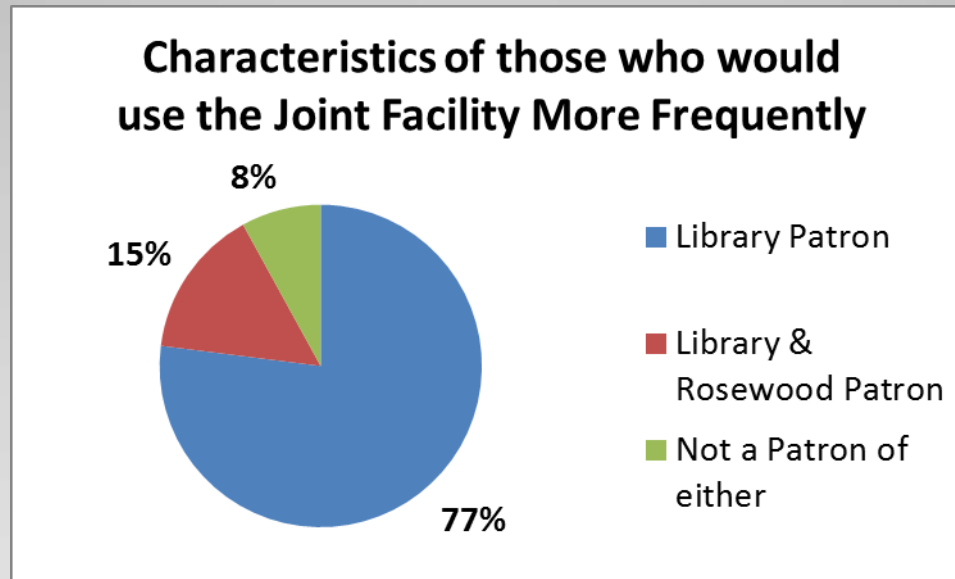
What would you say are the main benefits of having a joint library and arts center?

by percentage of respondents



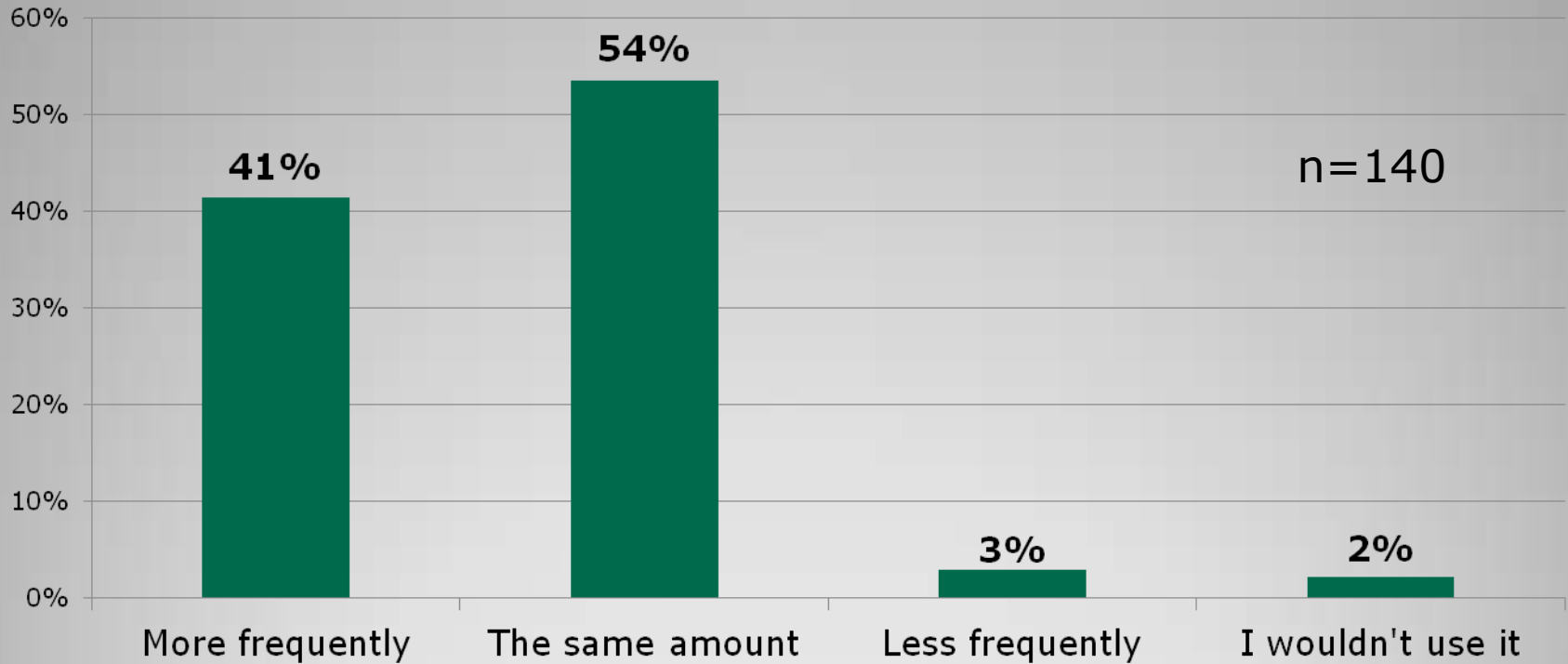
Community Impact of the Joint Facility

Shifting Preferences and Cross Pollination

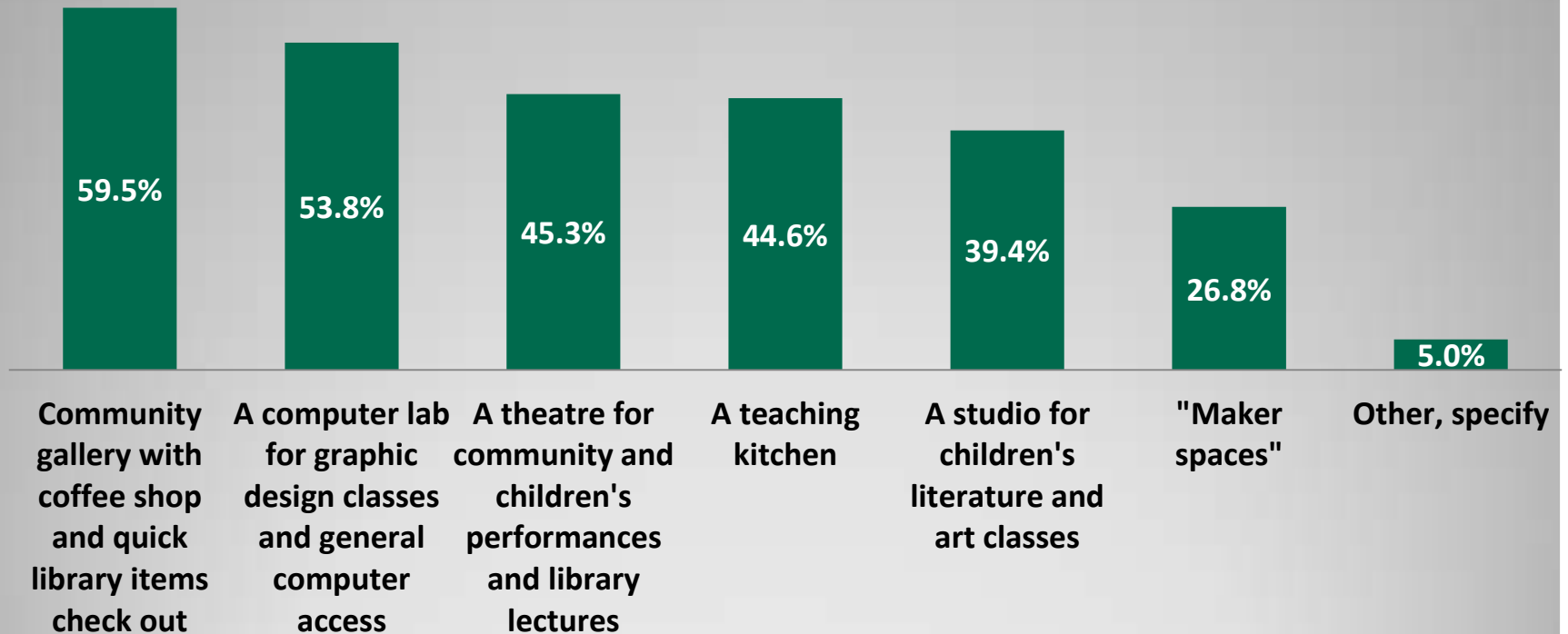
Use of Facility by those who currently don't participate in Arts Programs

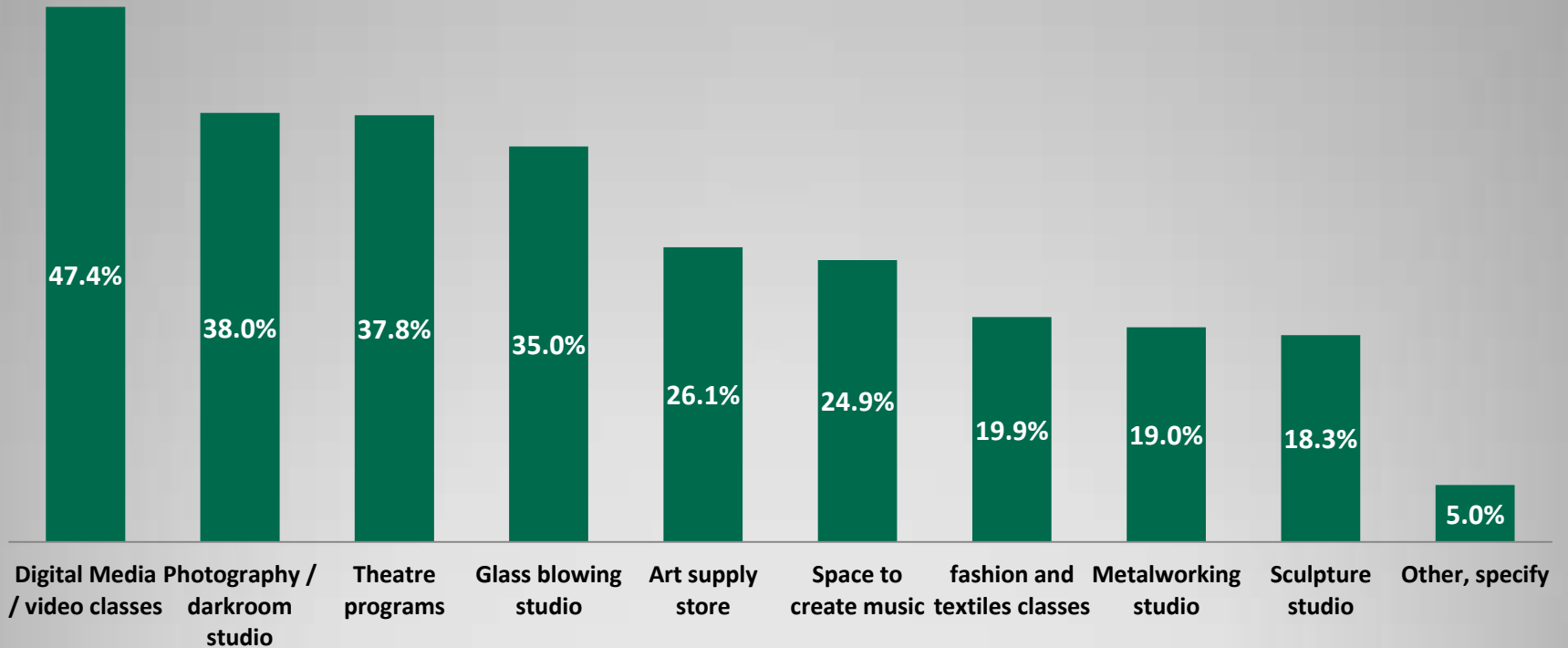

by percentage of respondents



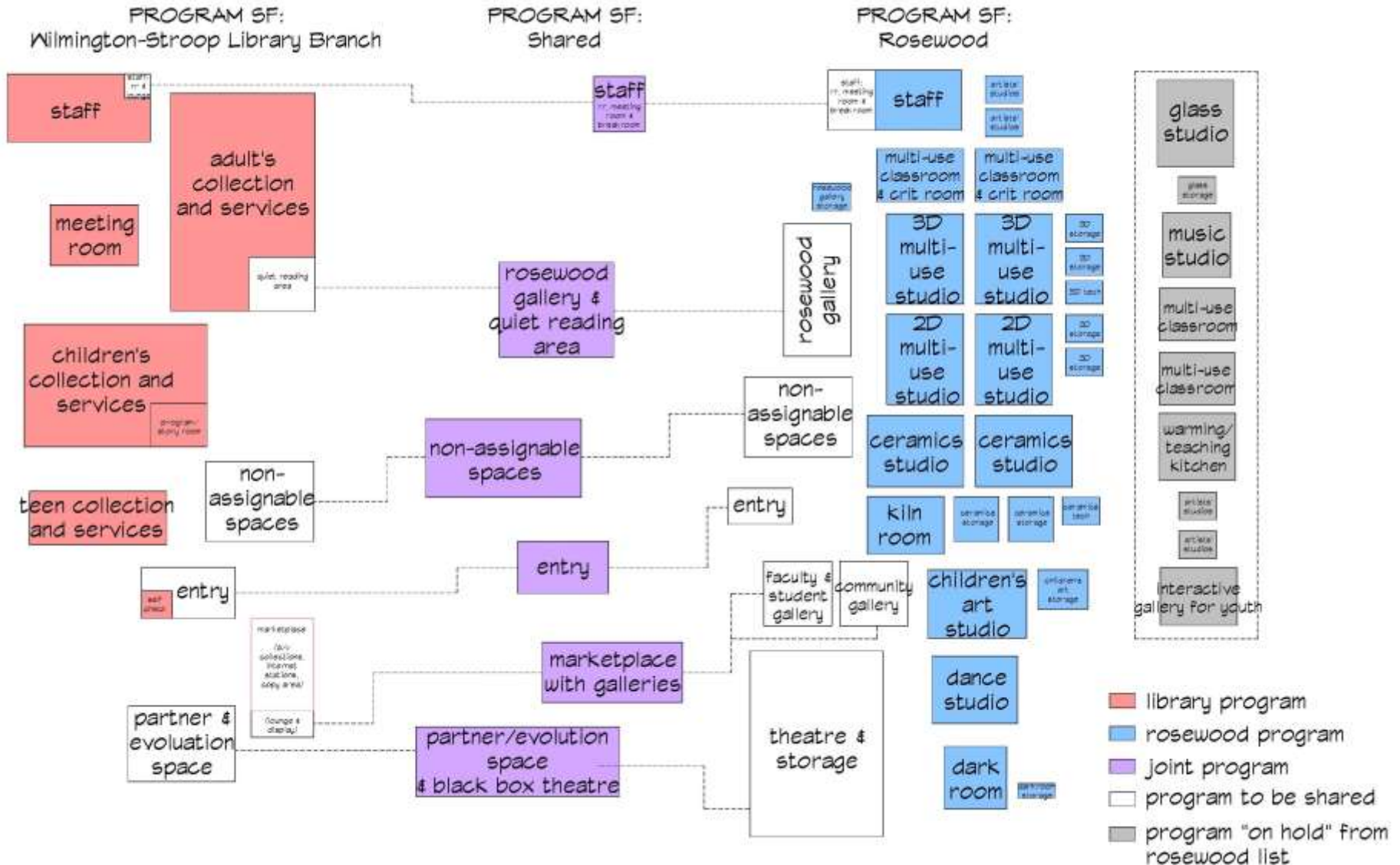
