PROGRAM ADVISORY COMMITTEE (PAC)

Program Advisory Committee (PAC) was established in 2010 as a volunteer committee under the governance of the Kettering Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Advisory Board (Park Board). PAC is made up of 10 - 24 Kettering residents focused on providing feedback and evaluation of Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Department (PRCA) programs, events and facilities.

PAC's purpose is to foster vision, advocacy and collaboration through frequent, focused communication with a group of residents.

PAC is recruited by the Park Board and members serve a 1-2 year term. The Park Board schedules regular meetings with PAC to review assignments and solicit feedback on any aspect of Kettering Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts and its programs. All five members of the Park Board will participate in leading PAC meetings through shared facilitation responsibilities.

PAC Committee Goals

Participate in the services and facilities offered by PRCA

Provide active feedback to the Park Board through online surveys and scheduled meetings

Be an ambassador to the community on behalf of Park Board and PRCA

Evaluation Format

PAC members are provided with a \$400 household credit and an individual fitness pass for each year of participation. The expectations for this \$400 credit and fitness pass are as follows:

- PAC members are responsible for attending three PAC meetings throughout the year. During the meetings, members will share feedback and provide input for Park Board and staff.
 - PAC members are expected to use the household credit to register or drop in to programs, events or facilities on the seasonally provided "menu" in order to evaluate their experience. Online surveys (via the PlayKettering app or website) will be the primary method of evaluation.
 - PAC members are the primary evaluator the experience. If a family member participates in a program using the PAC credit, the PAC member should be interacting or observing first hand during the duration of the experience.
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PAC members are welcome to contact any Park Board member and/or PRCA staff associated with the area to discuss any aspect of their experience.
