RE: Adopt a resolution to reallocate funds from Humphrey Ditch Undergrounding to Storm

Drain Culvert Replacement project.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Town Council adopt a resolution authorizing the Town Manager to proceed to reallocate funds from Humphrey Ditch Undergrounding project the Storm Drain Culvert replacement project.

Issue Statement and Discussion

Currently the Storm Drain Culvert Replacement project is in construction and is 55% complete. Due to unforeseen conditions of conflicting utilities beneath the existing pavement, change orders to the sum of \$240,681.96 is needed to complete the construction of this project. The Town Council awarded the project to The Design Build Inc on April 9th,2024 with an allocated total construction budget of \$800,000 which includes construction support and contingencies. Currently, the projects projected total cost with the change orders is \$946,717.97, which is \$146,717.87 above what was allocated by the Town Council.

To address the shortfall, it is the recommendation of the Town Engineer to reallocate \$165,000 designated for the Humphrey Ditch Undergrounding to the Storm Drain Culvert replacement project. The revised total construction cost is \$965,000. The excess will be used for construction contingencies. To minimize risks for this project, Staff has negotiated with the contractor the final construction change order and does not foresee any additional change orders associated with the project.

The Humphrey Ditch Undergrounding project was not identified as the three remaining critical drainage culverts that need to be replaced, see Attachment C. A letter of support was provided by the Town of Loomis Public Works Director citing that the defunding of the project will not negatively impact maintenance operations and is not maintenance critical.

CEQA Requirements

The proposed reallocation is not subject to review under CEQA pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3), which exempts administrative items since they will not result in any direct or indirect physical change in the environment.

Financial and/or Policy Implications

Funding for the reallocation of \$165,000 is available from the Drainage Development Impact Fees (Fund 318) encumbered by the Humphrey Ditch Undergrounding project. The revised construction allocation for the Storm Drain Culvert Replacement project is \$965,000, includes \$800,000 from the American Rescue Plan Act (Fund 131).

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Loomis hereby authorizes the Town Manager to proceed with construction of the Storm Drain Culvert Replacement project.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the budget will be incorporated to the Storm Drain Culvert Replacement project (22-14).
