8. CAMPAIGN UPDATE (PUBLIC COMMENT)

Jan-Clark Crets for Protect Loomis Library & Community Center Services Commitee reported the April Flower Farm Get-Together went well

Planning for outreach in neighborhoods, meet and greets, parties, etc. during June, July and August Hoping to outreach toward those who feel negative towards proposed tax

At next Loomis Town Council meeting considering combination of measure on November 2024 ballot (Has to be on Major Ballot consideration to get full approval)

The campaign would like to send more mailers and put up more signs

Phirippidis suggested the end of August would be a good time for mailers and signs, Placer County has a large number of absentee voters and grass roots campaigns work well in Loomis

Campaign isn't allowed to campaign on Loomis Library grounds, only education material is allowed Campain is talking to a consultant on fundraising

Mallory – Ideas for meet and greets at the Concert Series in Loomis, pool community days, 4th of July picnic

David Green – Q. Has the campaign talked with the schools considering the LUSD has a Bond Measure on the same ballot?

Campaign agreed there is a big difference between the two taxes; property vs sales Both campaigns agreed to not talk each other group down

9. LOOMIS LIBRARY AND COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTER OPERATIONS REPORT (PUBLIC COMMENT)

Sarah Comstock reported new items were added to the electronics collection

Comstock presented the operations report for the quarter of February 2024 – April 2024

The State now wants Electronics Report added, answers for this report are hard to find

Many electronics resources are available including through Hoopla

There are close to 3000 users, field trips have helped boost membership

TK class is coming Tuesday, May 13th. This will be the youngest group in a field trip so far

June 5th is Loomis Grammars 1st grade field trip

Puzzle swap will be coming back in the fall

The DYI Valentines Wreath class was Brittany's first full event alone

They held a Barbie Birthday tea party

There was a rock painting event in honor of the garden opening, rocks are at the gate

Sherriff Deputy Storytime was really popular and went well

Summer Reading Program: Quest for the Reading Torch Summer Read, Olympic theme

Kicks off June 15th with a party from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm

Program runs from June 15 through July 21st

A sign-up genius will be sent out for help to volunteers

Plans for three to four programs a week, sports theme once a week, crafts, these helps get families into the library

Phirippidis – Q. How is the Zip program going? Comstock A. - Program has slowed a down. We will be applying for the next Zip program that starts in July. Library pays for the books if program isn't approved. Approval depends on the States budget. 98% of books received through program stay in circulation collection.

The Ribbon Cutting was fabulous, many attended

Every second Saturday a docent is available in the garden. Currently working on how to schedule things in the garden, such as gatherings and meetings.

a. 2024 Strategic Plan Information (PUBLIC COMMENT)

Jennifer Sweeney, Consultant reported that the Strategic Planning Subcommittee have met. A traditional process is the plan in place; gathering data, SWOT analysis, mission and vision workshop with the subcommittee, community survey, interviewing stake holders and lasty a workshop planned for late august. The next part of the plan consists using the collected data and drafting a survey. Followed by a community forum. Lastly a final workshop to put all the goals and plan ahead together.

Garcia – Q. Is the timing for everything planned?

Sweeney – A. yes, loosely. Planning to talk to town people, different age groups. Would like to have surveys available at the library.
