PUBLIC HEARING

11. Sale of Town Owned Property Located at 3800 Taylor Road

At the December 11, 2018 Council meeting the Council awarded the exclusive development rights to the Town owned property located at 3800 Taylor Road, (APN's 044-121-074, 044-080-063, 044-133-003) to a joint venture between High Hand Nursery & Café and Loomis Basin Brewing Co. That joint venture has now been incorporated as Loomis Mill Group, LLC (Developer). Council directed the Town Manager to begin purchase negotiations with the Developer. Government Code Section 52201 authorizes local governments to acquire, sell or lease property for the "furtherance of the creation of an economic opportunity." In order to consummate the purchase and sale agreement, the Town needs to follow a specific process to either sell or lease the property that includes approving the sale at a public hearing, which is scheduled for tonight.

Recommended action: Take public comment; adopt resolution authorizing the Town Manager to enter into a Purchase and Sale Agreement for 3800 Taylor Road, currently identified as Assessor Parcel Numbers 044-121-074, 044-080-063, and 044-133-003. **Public comment:**

13. General Plan Update 2020

State General Plan Guidelines and good planning practice recommend that a community's General Plan be updated on a regular basis, typically at five and twenty-year intervals. The Town adopted its General Plan in 2001 and with the twenty-year life span of the 2001 General Plan nearing, it is appropriate to update the General Plan to reflect the Town's existing conditions, changes in Federal and State regulations, changes to the State General Plan Guidelines, changes in technology, changes in the economy, and to assure the General Plan is internally consistent.

Recommended action: Take public comment; receive information and discuss the Town's next steps.

14. King Road Interchange Update (Continued from April 9, 2019 Council meeting)

In 2000 the Town sought an opinion from Caltrans regarding an interchange at King Road and Interstate 80 (I-80). At the time Caltrans indicated that the Horseshoe Bar Road and Penryn Road interchanges were too close together to warrant another interchange and that it would need to be demonstrated that existing interchanges or local roads can neither provide nor be improved to provide a satisfactory accommodation for future traffic demand. In 2018 the Town requested Caltrans to consider the interchange again.

Recommended action: Determine whether the Town should pursue an Interchange at King Road and I-80 or not.

PUBLIC HEARING PROCEDURE:

- 1. Town staff makes its presentation on the Project and outlines all recommended actions
- 2. Commission/Council asks questions of staff
- 3. Chair/Mayor opens the public hearing
- 4. Applicant makes its presentation 15 minutes (At the discretion of the mayor or chair, time may be extended depending on the size/scope of the proposed project. The applicant must make the request for a time extension prior to the beginning of the meeting.)
- 5. Commission/Council asks questions of the applicant (and staff)
- 6. Public comment maximum 3 minutes per speaker, one opportunity to speak each
- 7. Applicant opportunity to respond to public comments 5 minutes (At the discretion of the mayor or chair, time may be extended depending on the number of comments made during public comment.)
- 8. Chair/Mayor closes the public hearing is closed
- 9. Staff responds to all public comments; Commission/Council asks any additional questions of staff
- 10. Council deliberates and acts on requested entitlements
