5. LOOMIS COSTCO

Presentation by Town Staff and Costco representatives regarding the Loomis Costco Project process and revisions. Staff and Costco representatives will be available to answer questions on the CEQA process and project modifications. Comments on the Revised Draft EIR will be accepted by the Town in writing starting on Monday November 25, 2019.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Receive information and take public comment.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

<u>Richard Jackson-behind Brace Road:</u> Voiced concern over headlights at night shining in his windows; the volume of traffic on Sierra College Blvd, and Brace Road and the weed control issues on the vacant lots.

<u>Bob Auguscik- Sierra Meadows Apt-Brace Road</u>: Voiced concern about Costco entrance on east side of property, about Brace Road improvements and the effect on his property, and the accuracy of the site plan. Mentioned an agreement he has with Costco for Starlight Lane.

<u>Daljit Baines- Owner Arco AM/PM</u>: Voiced concern over the negative impacts caused by the traffic generated by Costco, citing up to 16,000 cars per day); the one NB and SB lane into Costco and the intersection improvements at Sierra College Blvd and Granite Drive. Also voiced infrastructure concerns.

Laurie Eastman- (outside of town): Concerned pollution and caused by the project. Asked about mitigation process.

Ron Hallmayer: Voiced concern about the intersection of Brace and Sierra College and who absorbs the cost. Also asked about no left turn lane at WB Sierra College Blvd.

<u>Adam Noorani</u> – Homewood property owner: Asked that the Town "be sensitive" regarding the issues of the Brace Road access and semi-truck deliveries.

<u>Marilyn – out of area</u>: Voiced concerns about traffic at Sierra College Blvd and Brace Road, asking about the ownership on the west side.

<u>Roger Smith – Wells Ave:</u> Voiced concern about the Downtown Loomis Traffic, and the project affect on "everyday" traffic in Loomis. Level of service a concern. Stated I-80 access at King Road would be a solution.

<u>Pat Bach – Unincorporated Loomis:</u> Concerned about traffic impacts, asked about the data in the Kettelson report – if current or outdated. Asked about the mitigation for arterial feeder roads.

<u>Tyler, Rocklin (Western Care Construction)</u>: Asked about the drainage impacts and potential property loss on the Harmon property. Angela – Saunders Ave: Stated the Webb street at Taylor needs restriping and stop signs.

<u>Miguel Ucovich – Craig Court:</u> Stated Webb stripping is needed. Complimented Costco. Voiced concern about the architectural design and suggested exterior decorative concrete.
