13. #17-01 LOOMIS COSTCO PROJECT - ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT CERTIFICATION, ZONING CODE AMENDMENT, LOT LINE ADJUSTMENT, CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT, AND DESIGN REVIEW (PUBLIC HEARING CONTINUED FROM AUGUST 4, 2020 SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING)

The Project is located on 17.41 acres at the southeast intersection of Sierra College Blvd. and Brace Rd. on the following parcels: APN 045-042-011, 045-042-012, 045-042-023, 045-042-034, 045-042-035, 045-042-036, and 045-042-037 owned by Costco. In addition to the parcels listed above, the proposed Lot Line adjustment includes parcel APN 045-042-016 which composes a portion of the Sièrra Meadows Apartments owned by Robert Auguscik. The Project site is served by SPMUD, PCWA, PG&E, South Placer Fire Protection District, and Recology Auburn/Placer, and the site is vacant.

The Loomis Costco Project includes the construction and operation of an approximately 155,000-square-foot warehouse retail facility and an associated fueling station at the corner of Sierra College Boulevard and Brace Road. The warehouse retail space would provide approximately 149,500 square feet of floor space dedicated to storage, retail goods and services.

Recommended action: Staff recommends that the Town Council:

- 1. Conduct a public hearing on the proposed Zoning Code Amendment, Lot Line Adjustment and Conditional Use Permit for the Loomis Costco Project.
- 2. Adopt the following ordinance and resolutions:
  - a. Resolution 20-29, certifying the Environmental Impact Report for the Loomis Costco project, adopting the Findings of Fact and Statement of Overriding Considerations, and approving the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program.
  - b. 

on August 4th; take public testimony. Public testimony will close. The staff is probably going to want a small break to go and discuss the comments that had been made. Then we will come back, make a presentation to you, and at that point in time, it will be opened for you to make a decision on the Costco project.

We're recommending tonight that you certify the Loomis Costco environmental impact report; you adopt the CEQA findings, you adopt the statement of overriding considerations, and you adopt the mitigation monitoring and reporting program, in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act.

We're recommending that you amend the Town of Loomis Zoning Code and have the second reading. You had the first reading on August 4th. We also recommend that you approve the lot line adjustment, and we recommend that you approve a conditional use permit and design review for a warehouse retail use, with the accessory fueling station, subject to the conditions of approval.

If you have any questions of staff since the last meeting, we're here to answer

1 those. Does anybody 2. MAYOR JAN CLARK-CRETS: No? No? have any questions for staff? No? 3 Okay. All right. The project applicant will be 4 speaking now or --5 ANDERS HAUGE: I see him online, so if 6 7 you would like to speak, Michael? MICHAEL OKUMA: Good evening, Mayor 8 Clark-Crets and the members of the Loomis Town 9 Council. I'm Mike Okuma. I'm the Director of 10 Real Estate Development for Costco Wholesale. 11 This has been a long journey to get to this point 12 I don't (sound drops). Hear me now? 13 tonight. How about now? 14 Okay. Good evening, Mayor and the members of 15 the Loomis Town Council. My name is Michael 16 I'm the Director of Real Estate 17 Okuma. Development for Costco Wholesale. 18 This has been a long journey to get to 19 this point tonight. I really don't know what 20 else to say, except that your staff, your Town 21 Manager, has been great to work with and has 22 enabled this project to move correctly through 23 2.4 the process. I humbly request that you vote in favor 25 Page 11

of the project tonight and thank you for all the 1 hard work of everyone to get us here tonight. 2 MAYOR JAN CLARK-CRETS: Okay. 3 anybody have any questions for the applicant? 4 Okay. Okay, please. No? 5 COUNCILMEMBER TIM ONDERKO: Michael, 6 Tim Onderko here. A question; so, in the event 7 that Council approves the item tonight, what is, 8 in a normal world, what's your estimation of 9 getting your building permits, your applications 10 for building permit, into the city, or the Town, 11 12 rather? And then, when would your target date be to start construction and finish the project? 13 And I know that's a moving target because of many 14 15 things, but what's your thinking there? MICHAEL OKUMA: As soon as we received 16 17 our approvals tonight, if that's the decision, we would launch immediately into construction 18 19 drawings. That will take a couple of months, and then it will go straight into plan check. 20 soon as we get permits -- get all of our 21 necessary permits, and approvals with the county, 22 the state, the town, we would launch into 23 24 construction. Typically, construction takes about 25

eight months, eight to nine months to get to 1 2 grand opening, and that's basically assuming the best-case scenario. 3 COUNCILMEMBER TIM ONDERKO: Thank you. 4 MAYOR JAN CLARK-CRETS: Will there be a 5 presentation by the co-applicant? 6 ANDERS HAUGE: I don't see her here. 7 MAYOR JAN CLARK-CRETS: Okay. 8 ANDERS HAUGE: I don't see the co-9 applicant in the audience. 10 MAYOR JAN CLARK-CRETS: All right. So, 1.1 then we'll go ahead and open this up for public 12 comment. I think the location is superb for a Costco. Sierra College was there long before 20

knew that Loomis owned that 19 acres -- or didn't own it; the owners owned it, but it was in the

Town of Loomis. And they knew that that was

Someone also asked about the possibility of fewer gas pumps on that site. And I would like to hear someone on the Council, or from Costco, address that possibility. Thirty pumps, to me, seems a little excessive, considering that there are already about 40 gas pumps on the corner of Sierra College and Granite Drive already.

And finally, I understand that the need for an additional traffic light at Sierra College Boulevard entrance, as it's been proposed, that's definitely necessary, as long as the Granite Drive entrance doesn't exist. But there are currently seven stoplights within a one-mile stretch along Sierra College Boulevard, from Taylor heading towards Rocklin. And I wonder if there was a traffic study done that included an entrance on Granite, but didn't have a stoplight at the entrance on Sierra College. And if so, would it be possible to require that if the Granite Drive entrance is actually built, or allowed by the city, that Costco would build the entrance on Granite, but then remove the light on Sierra College?

at in the environmental document, but the access off of Sierra College Boulevard into the Costco project is essential. It is what Sierra College Boulevard is designed to do. And that the Granite access is supplemental to the Sierra College Boulevard access, the main access. But that has to remain open under the design of the project.

Regarding the noise levels with the sound wall, I think I'm going to have Matthew address that, about the sound wall.

So, Matthew is now going to address the issues dealing with the environmental document and your ability to certify this environmental document as being complete.

I'm Matthew Gerken from AECOM. I was the project manager for the environmental document. There was a very good question about existing noise levels compared to future noise levels, that is based on testimony from last week. The question was something to the effect of, "Did I hear you say that after the project, noise levels will be lower than existing conditions?" And I wanted to clarify that we took a noise measurement in

approximately the location of the Brace Road access point, which will, during the daytime, handle some truck deliveries. On the day we took that short-term noise measurement, we happened to get a maximum measurement of, I think it was around 82 decibels. And what I mean is that the maximum noise level attributable to truck movements is between 70 and 78, something like that. So, the max from trucks would be less than the maximum measurement we happened to take during short term conditions on one day when we were out there. That's what I meant by that, not that the project is necessarily going to overall reduce all types of noise levels.

2.0

There was also a question about sight distance along Brace Road, relative to the sound wall and whether that requires new analysis of the effectiveness of the sound wall. And what we're talking about there are -- would be minor design features, looking forward. That would violate the requirements of mitigation if the sound wall was moved to no longer be effective in reducing noise levels for the apartment buildings. So, we're not talking about the sort of design change that's going to require a new

1 noise analysis.

I think that was it for me. And I'll just re-, re-, reiterate that, for those interested in additional details related to noise, or any other topic, please see the final EIR, where the treatment is comprehensive and the various responses to late comments that have come up that are in the revised attachment seven for tonight's agenda.

ANDERS HAUGE: And to reiterate what Matthew just said, is when Costco comes in with the building designs, which Michael mentioned earlier, the town is required to review those and assure that they meet the requirements of the conditions of approval and the standards of the town of Loomis. So, when those designs come in, we will make sure that it is in compliance with the decision you make.

And with that, it's time for you to have your discussion and make a decision.

MAYOR JAN CLARK-CRETS: Okay, thank you, both of you. Does anybody have any comments that they'd like to make prior to -- do you have a comment? Go ahead, please.

COUNCILMEMBER BRIAN BAKER: I think my

CONCILMEMBER JEFF DUNCAN: I just wanted to comment on how we in Loomis are smack dab in the middle of a tremendous population

growth in Lincoln and Rocklin, and we have no control over that. And I don't think anyone can deny that Sierra College Boulevard is the main artery that will be carrying that traffic.

When I first moved to Placer County in '83, on the I-80 exit, off of Sierra College Boulevard, there were two gas stations there; an old Chevron and an old US 76 -- traditional is what I meant to say, not old -- but had the mechanics, less pumps than are allowed now. But I've done a lot of cross-country traveling and one thing that is consistent is gas stations are always off the freeway exits, and they're usually on the corners of intersections.

Just like in Rocklin, we have three gas stations; Arco, Chevron, 7-11; they amount to 40 gas pumps. And when we first started with our two gas stations on Sierra College, the population, I believe, was around 100,000. Our population in Placer County is pushing 400,000. So, to say, well, there's, you know, 24 to 30 gas pumps, that's too many, that's kind of disingenuous when we have 30 gas pumps within 100 yards of each other. And the other thing is, with the population growth and Sierra College

being that artery, main artery from Lincoln, we 7 2 need gas pumps. Otherwise, talk about a mess at Arco station now, with weaving in and out, you 3 know, we need more to move the traffic along. 4 And that's the other thing about Costco 5 6 is it's very well organized. It's one way in, one way out. You're not dilly-dallying around 7 going to the bathroom, buying soda, or anything 8 like that. It's all about gas and getting out of 9 10 there. So, I just wanted to talk about the 11 appropriateness of the location of the Costco and 12 the gas station. It is an appropriate place. 13 To the Loomis neighbors that live off 14 of Brace Road, I totally understand your 15 I've had concerns regarding traffic 16 concerns. 17 throughout Loomis, especially on the country roads that are connectors to other areas. 18 19 Horseshoe Bar Road, Laird, Barton Road, Del Mar, I've lived in Loomis since '86. 20 King Road. commuted to Folsom on Laird Road and Auburn 21 Folsom for 24 years. I've seen the traffic in 22 the past 15 years have been twice as much, double 23 24 the amount of the previous 20 years. At the July 7th Planning Commission 25

meeting, Mike Hogan said that traffic has increased 15 percent, and Loomis population has only increased 2.7 percent. That is a study that I believe that we can attest with our own eyes.

I have seen dangerous drivers everywhere, not just in Loomis. But it is especially difficult for a small town that has limited resources, to address these issues. seen Brace Road at Barton Road become a game of Russian roulette as I'm trying to turn left onto Brace, but my sightline is not sufficient for someone that is headed in my direction at 50 miles per hour. I would like to slow down traffic on Brace Road, as well as all of these other roads. But in order to do so, we have to have the ability to allocate law enforcement offers and enforce traffic laws. The speed limit signs are being ignored. Enforcement would slow the through travelers down, at least make other alternate routes more attractive and we could do this with extra revenue.

Now, will Loomis survive without

Costco? We can. We can survive. We've survived

for a long time. But it would really help us,

you know, as far as enforcement and improvements

during infrastructure.

Rocklin. I'm really at a loss of words for here when it comes to Rocklin. For whatever reason, it does not seem what they know what they really want. Loomis and Costco has offered to do more than just what would normally be required of a project. When Rocklin wanted Costco to address the Granite Drive access to the project site, Costco happily, and the Town of Loomis, happily, of course, did so. Then Rocklin changed their mind. This is what would be advantageous to everyone.

Our plan, the Costco plan now, stands on its own. We have addressed the traffic concerns and I believe that the light, entrance and exit, is a great idea compared to, you know, people wanting to compare us with the Costco at Roseville. Well, Roseville doesn't have a dedicated light. It has three entrances and exits on Five Star, that get clogged by other businesses that are coming to the light, that turns onto Stanford Ranch. And I believe one of the studies talked about how much traffic goes down Stanford Ranch, you know, even more so than what is in front of our Sierra College at this

time.

So, the fact that the studies have been done, the traffic studies have been done; the fact that Rocklin asked us to do a study that they use now, and we complied, and the fact that they -- I'm not really sure why they would, you know, ask us to do another study when the study we're using is the one that they've used for all of their projects on Sierra College Boulevard, or most of them, at least.

The other thing is, it's frustrating, like Brian was saying, is when -- oh, let's look at the Grant Drive, and then we look at it and then they walk away from that. I mean, really, is the Grant Drive dead-end part of Rocklin plan? I don't think that's a plan. You just look at the timeline of the discussions that's presented in the final EIR under comment number 57, pages 3-287 through 3-288, or attachment six, Agency Coordination or Efforts, gives you an idea what we have been dealing with.

Another request listed by Rocklin was to move the main entrance to Costco 100 feet north and to have two right-hand turn lanes into the entrance. This request does nothing to make

traffic safer or more efficient. It actually can lead to more unsafe conditions. I know that if anybody's been in that situation, it does clog up traffic more. Just from a layman's point of view, I've seen that happen on more than one occasion.

to apologize to staff, to you, for the nasty behavior and the disrespect you've had to endure. At what point do you stop accepting harassment that is cloaked in endless questioning on phone calls? It is uncalled for and it is what some people do when they have nothing of substance to say.

I would also like to thank the residents of Loomis that have made suggestions and statements of concern that I believe have made this a better project. I'm very glad to have a company like Costco involved, that will do the right things to make a better project.

Costco has been proven to be that type of quality business that, as you can see by the way they treat their employees. We know that unlike some other retail giants, they are not the type of business to abandon their store and move away. Their positive reputation proceeds them.

I want to thank the Planning

Commissioners for the work that they do. The

comments that they made at the July 7th meeting

were thoughtful regarding all aspects of the

And I do believe 3 that after reviewing the FEIR and investing the 4 issues brought up by residents in neighboring 5 interested parties, I find the final EIR is 7 valid, and this is to be a good project, and is in the right location. With the help of our 8 neighbors -- sorry, got a little excited here. 9 With the help of our neighbors working 10 with Costco in Loomis, the concern for traffic 11 12 issues can be remedied. I just hope that everyone else that has 13 been involved in this really looks at the 14 15 totality of the EIR and how well done it's been. And they're really excited. 16 They don't really care that Costco's going to be 17 in Loomis or whatnot. They're just happy that 18 they don't have to go to Roseville, and it may be 19 20 a shorter commute for them. So, I would caution Rocklin politicians 21 to be careful, because a lot of their 22 constituents are very supportive of this project. 23 So, having said that, the Two-by-Two's 24 been interesting. You know, I ran into a city 25

manager at a breakfast in 2019, at the end of the 1 year, and we exchanged pleasantries. He's a nice 2 And he offered -- I said at the time, I 3 said, "You know, you've been very provocative 4 5 with some of your comments towards Loomis; in fact, untruthful. And I've got a problem with that, " sticking up for my town as I should. 7 he was nice enough to invite me to come to his 8 office. And he said, "Well, I'd like to sit down 9 10 with you, " and this was his idea, Madam Mayor. He said, "I'd like to sit down and talk to you 11 about some of my concerns, all right?" 12 said, "No problem. I think that's a great idea. 13 I think communication is important." 14 15 And so, I offered to come in. I asked staff, Loomis staff, to make the appointment. 16 17 They reached out to him and he said, "Well, I'm too busy, not going to make it happen this week." 18 And so, we did a follow-up a couple of weeks 19 20 later, and he gave me the same kind of line, "Too busy, not going to make it happen." 21 22 And I bring this up, Madam Mayor, because this really is a good summary of the 23 24 relationship, or the attitude or approach that Rocklin has brought to the table. And I think 25

it's important to separate what management is doing in Rocklin, and what the people want in Rocklin. And I think that's important.

So, you know, listen, there's a lot more to come between Loomis and Rocklin. I hope that we can join together, because I think that we're more alike than we are different, between the two towns -- the city and the Town of Loomis. And I want to see that relationship grow. And I think we've done a -- we've put a lot of work in over the last three or four years to make that happen. It hasn't been perfect, but I will extend an olive branch to our colleagues or our counterparts, rather, in Rocklin.

You know, there's going to be other things that happen on the border that we ought to be able to work together on. And if I have anything to do with it, we will not give them the cold shoulder when they're trying to negotiate their projects. So, that's that.

I do have to say, you know, I know some people in Loomis are not happy. There is a concerted effort with the business owner that Councilmember Baker referenced. And, you know, there's really two competing theories here that

exist. One is that, well, all the gas pumps are going to create competition, and competition isn't good for one side.

Then the other side of it, which I agree with, is that a Costco will drive more people to the area and lift all the businesses.

And I subscribe to that. I don't think that competition is the greatest problem here. I think it's the theory that we just can't have too many gas pumps in the area. I think AMPM offers a lot that Costco won't, right? A lot of people go to get gas at AMPM, they go get a bag of chips and a soda pop. You can't do that in Costco -- at Costco. So, I think that Costco is a good thing for the region.

And I would just ask the people of
Loomis who are getting fired up about, quote,
traffic. That really is a strategic effort by
people to get Loomis people excited. And I think
that that's really a disgraceful tactic. People
from outside our town should not be coming to our
town and trying to divide us, all right. I've
got a problem with that. And the good people of
Loomis should not be treated as pawns in
someone's made-up competition game. So, that's

what I've got to say about that. 1 Councilmember Duncan did a great job at 2 3 thanking staff. This has been a long haul. have excellent staff here at Town Hall, and I 4 5 thank all of them. We put a great team of consultants together for this. I'm happy. 6 7 satisfied with the EIR and the traffic analysis. Bottom line, I think what I want people to know 9 is, our experts are telling us, and the reports are telling us, that we've got this right, right? 10 The traffic plan is a really good traffic plan. 11 It's really not fair to compare what's going on 12 in Roseville to Loomis. They're different 13 traffic patterns, these are different plans, 14 15 different mitigation measures that we're putting 16 forward. So, I'm satisfied with the EIR. We've 17 18 studied this hard. We've reviewed all the comments. I have personally read every comment 19 20 and reply. And we're getting it right. I'm happy about that. 21 22 And lastly, I just want to, in the event that we pass this tonight, welcome Costco 23 to Loomis. With that, thank you, Madam Mayor. 24

But all of our citizens will benefit from having a Costco, obviously, by helping to generate revenue to repair our roads and make our town's infrastructure even safer, but also, some of the other great factors this business brings to the table, which I will talk about in a bit.

Here's a fun fact. Just think, our citizens that do have memberships, will not have to drive to Roseville anymore. And you are welcome, Rocklin. It will make it easier for people to shop in Rocklin as well.

First, I want to emphasize that we are very sensitive to the citizens of our town who live near the project. We honor you and endeavor to help guide us all through the impacts of our new Costco. The town of Loomis pledges to be your advocate for any issues. Costco has assured us that they value being the best neighbor and to be available immediately for any problems.

Costco has very family-friendly hours and the warehouse is always closed on holidays so that their employees may enjoy family time. This

warehouse has a potential to bring in 175 jobs, potentially. Costco is also known to carry local goods, and our businesses here in Loomis have an opportunity to get their products sold there, which is super very exciting.

Thank you to the Town of Loomis staff for your incredible hard work over the last three We are so blessed to have you on our team. You are amazing professionals at the top of your field. You are honest and you have the best integrity. You have also remained focused and not retaliatory in the face of adversity with Rocklin's smear campaign. We cannot be prouder of your excellent work. Again, thank you, Town of Loomis staff, along with Town Attorney Jeff Mitchell. And thank you planning consultant Anders Hague and Christy. Thank you all for your incredibly hard work and important business done for our traffic consultants at Wood Rodgers who peer reviewed the original traffic study by Kittelson & Associates.

Thank you, Matthew, for all your hard work. Thank you to our Planning Commission as well. I think most of us mentioned them. They worked incredibly hours going through all these important documents to make sure that what is presented to us is a good fit in their opinion. Thank you, Planning Commissioners.

Costco, thank you for picking Loomis.

Thank you very much.

We have made a concerted effort over the last four years to improve and work on our relationship with Rocklin. We made it clear that we wanted to be good neighbors. When the Costco project came forward, Rocklin asked for more time to go over it, and they asked for six months. It ended up being 18, total. We gave them over a year. We did this because of our relationship with Rocklin, and we wanted to be good neighbors; not to give you time to wage war with us. It just went downhill from there.

In the beginning, Rocklin wanted money. This we agreed to because we want to pay for our fair share and be good neighbors. Rocklin wanted access at Granite Drive. We agreed. Then they changed their minds. Rocklin wanted a second

access point at Brace Road. This was added into the project. And the only thing this request did was enrage our citizens on Brace Road. And just like before, Rocklin eventually said, "We don't want that, after all."

2.0

Rocklin said our traffic studies were flawed and didn't agree with the SimTraffic methodology, even though that is the methodology that Rocklin uses for its traffic analysis. So, we agreed to work a traffic study with the Synchro software. We sent over our study that was requested by Rocklin, which clearly showed that we can mitigate the issues, and we never heard back from them.

Over the past 18 months, I have spoken with most, if not all, of my counterparts on the Rocklin City Council, and was met with mostly positives regarding our Costco. The one sticking point seemed to be that location; the main entrance on Sierra College Boulevard, and they wanted it to be moved north 100 feet. During my meetings it was clear that the Rocklin City Councilmembers were receiving misinformation from their staff. I asked for us to meet so that we can all go through the traffic studies, experts

meeting experts.

2.4

A few of the councilmembers agreed with me and wondered why there was such a disconnect between what their staff told them and what we were saying. Meetings were scheduled and then cancelled. Why does the staff over in Rocklin fill its councilmembers misinformation about Loomis? It really baffles my mind. It's very, very frustrating.

If the problem is just the 100-foot issue at the entrance, why did we get a 65-page letter of issues from Rocklin? What is the meaning of that? We cannot move the entrance to the Costco, because you can't flesh out the entrance traffic without running into pedestrians entering the facility. Look back at the document; it clearly shows that people are, you know, taking their carts and trying to get safely. It's an obvious problem. Why can't they see the safety issue?

Is it an issue with the property owner, Westcore, across the street, as some councilmembers alluded to? No, it's not. We met with them and they have no issue with the entrance where it is. Okay. So, what gives? Is

it really a traffic issue? Our traffic studies 1 show that we can mitigate all issues as long as 2 we have agreements with Rocklin. 3 We have had our traffic studies peer reviewed. Remember, Rocklin asked us to do 5 another traffic study using their methodology, 6 with their data inputs. We did that. 7 submitted that, and we heard nothing. 8 The Petrovich property, southeast of 9 10 the Costco project, is in the preplanning stages, and they have an agreement with Costco on an 11 entrance to Granite Drive. This mitigates much 12 of the Rocklin argument, yet they act as if this 13 is coming out of thin air. 14 Why did countless meetings get 15 cancelled at the hands of Rocklin? Why did they 16 post a smear campaign a few days before the 17 public hearing on Facebook and their website, and 18 Doesn't sound not reach out to us all along? 19 like good neighbors. What do they really want? 20 Doesn't seem like they want us to have Costco. 21 It sounds like they want it all. 22 The Sierra College corridor is jammed 23 with Rockland businesses big and small. In terms 24

of big box stores, Loomis has Raley's, so this

25

would be two for us. 1 We all want to get this project right. 2 We believe we have. We have been communicative 3 with Rocklin. We've worked hard at trying to 4 build a relationship with Rocklin, to no avail. 5 And I say this to my counterparts on the City Council: You know we've been working sincerely 7 to build our relationship with you. We were adamant when we said, "Your staff has misrepresented our town to you in the worst way. 10 And last year, Mayor Onderko hand-delivered 11 documents that clearly and honesty told the truth 12 from Loomis's standpoint. The Rocklin City staff 13 that has worked on this project has 14 systematically and strategically torpedoed it 15 from the beginning. Why? 16 It seems like your City Manager and 17 staff only sees us as an enemy. Why is that? 18 they have it out for us, from the past? If so, 19 just say it. Would it be better to be 20 transparent than waste all this precious time? 21 22 In addition, you say that your traffic consultant, Fehr & Peers, somehow was able to 23 24 dispute two other nationally and respected 25 traffic consultants. Why is Fehr & Peers better

than our initial traffic study in its peer review? And why were all of us never allowed to meet?

Your claim that our Costco will impact our businesses on Sierra College -- and yes, we have heard from one gentleman who wants -- who owns that Arco station and has the newest of the three gas stations on this side of the freeway. Clearly, he is fighting the project because he feels that Costco will be competition and he's protecting his own interests. I really don't think he cares much for our town at all. To you, sir, and with all due respect, this will only affect your customers who have Costco memberships and those that have more time to get gas. Costco present, you will still have a steady flow of customers to your gas station and minimart, which is a totally different business plan.

Rocklin is quoted as saying Rocklin's concerns focus on the glaring inadequacy of the analysis of traffic impacts of the project, as well as the unreasonableness of recommended mitigation measures to Rocklin streets and intersections. Glaring inadequacy? We have a top notch CEQA document that begs to differ.

What unreasonableness of mitigation measure of 1 Rocklin streets and intersections do you refer 2. to? 3 Rocklin says that this project presents significant challenges to Rocklin's 5 transportation infrastructure, public services 6 and business viability in the area. 7 Specifically, what do you mean by this? Rocklin, 8 you have so many businesses already located along 9 10 this stretch of Sierra College; we have one, and are proposing one more. How can one business 11 that has less vehicle miles traveled than current 12 zoning, cause significant challenges to your 13 transportation infrastructure that you were 14 responsible for? Your public services? 15 a Town of Loomis business, and no matter what 16 gets developed there, both of our public services 17 would be involved. So, really, that's a moot 18 19 point. 2.0 With respect to business viability, you will actually gain momentum in that department. 21 Why don't you ask Mr. Petrovich what he thinks? 22 I believe he came to one of your City 23 24 Councilmembers and came before you to provide public comment on this exact subject. 25

Having a Costco nearby is a huge boon to all the surrounding businesses.

Rocklin goes onto state that Loomis has mostly ignored concerns formerly expressed by Rocklin. This is a false statement. We have been actively trying to work out concerns by Rocklin since the inception. Rocklin had original concerns, mostly centered around money. And once that hurdle was done, we received more requests. The list got longer and longer. The requests are asked and answered and then withdrawn. Reminds me of Cinderella.

Here's your laundry list, which we will add to incessantly and never have any end to it.

The goal is to stop and delay our project for some benefit to Rocklin.

Finally, we heard the audacious comment that the leaders met multiple times to try and reach a consensus, but to no avail. I cry foul here. Hey, now, Rocklin, you know better than that. We never gave up, you did. You refused to meet with us. You refused to communicate, and we asked and we asked and we asked. It's quite apparent that you never wanted to work anything out.

1	A quote from Shakespeare comes to my

4	Yes, Loomis did make a mistake. We had
5	a glimmer of hope that Rocklin would be a good
