11. Vaping and Electronic Cigarette Epidemic

During the September 10, 2019 Council meeting, Mayor pro tempore Clark-Crets and Councilmember Baker requested staff to look into how the Town could potentially curb the proliferation of electronic cigarettes (e-cigs) and vaping use by our local youth.

Recommended Action: Staff requests Council direction on how the Town should, if at all, address the vaping and e-cigs epidemic. The Town has two options at this

oint:

- 1. Direct staff to prepare an ordinance to ban the sale of e-cigs and vaping products throughout the Town, and direct staff to work with the Placer County Sheriff's Office and our local schools on other educational programs to curb the proliferation of vaping by youth; or
- 2. Direct staff to prepare a Council Resolution that encourages residents to immediately stop the use of e-cigs and other vaping products due to significant health concerns.

12. <u>League of California Cities Conference Resolutions</u>

At the League Conference, scheduled for October 16-18, there is the annual business meeting when cities are asked to vote on various League issues. Two resolutions have been submitted: 1) Amendment to Rule 20A – calls upon the California Public Utilities

Commission (CPUC) to expand its Rule 20A program for undergrounding overhead utilities to include projects in high fire hazard severity zones; and 2) International Transboundary Pollution Flows – calls upon the state and the federal governments of the U.S. and Mexico to address water quality issues resulting from transboundary flows from Mexico's Tijuana River into the United States.

Recommended action: Take public comment, consider the resolutions and determine the Town's position so that the voting delegates Mayor pro tempore Clark-Crets and alternate Councilmember Duncan can represent the Town's position on the resolutions.

13. Referendum (The Village) Properties Status

The Town Council requested a description of the status of the various properties within the Referendum Area. Staff has prepared a table that identifies the parcel number, site number (parcels with different Land Use Designations within a parcel), the site acreage, the General Plan Designation, the existing zoning, a determination if the Land Use Designation and Zoning are consistent, the required process to develop the site and zoning designations that are compatible with the Land Use Designation.

Recommended action: Receive and file.

PUBLIC HEARING PROCEDURE:

- 1. Town staff makes its presentation on the Project and outlines all recommended actions
- 2. Commission/Council asks questions of staff

- 3. Chair/Mayor opens the public hearing
- 4. Applicant makes its presentation 15 minutes (At the discretion of the mayor or chair, time may be extended depending on the size/scope of the proposed project. The applicant must make the request for a time extension prior to the beginning of the meeting.)
- 5. Commission/Council asks questions of the applicant (and staff)
- 6. Public comment maximum 3 minutes per speaker, one opportunity to speak each
- 7. Applicant opportunity to respond to public comments 5 minutes (At the discretion of the mayor or chair, time may be extended depending on the number of comments made during public comment.)
- 8. Chair/Mayor closes the public hearing is closed
- 9. Staff responds to all public comments; Commission/Council asks any additional questions of staff
- 10. Council deliberates and acts on requested entitlements
