Please describe the meaning and symbolism contained in the design and why you think it represents the Town of Loomis. (attach extra sheet if needed).

At first glance, the flag appears to be simply a yellow sun rising over green hills, however, there is much symbolism hidden in plain sight. The golden color of the sun is a tribute to the gold mining heritage of Loomis. The specific gold color is also the same shade used by Del Oro High School. Upon closer inspection, the sun's rays bring to mind a wagon wheel, honoring the gold miners' journey to the Loomis area in 1849. The sun's resemblance to a sliced citrus fruit represents the fruit orchard economy that followed the gold rush. A traditional railroad sign can also be inferred from the sun's shape, in appreciation of the Central Pacific Railroad's significance in the development of Loomis.

The green hills represent the fertile rolling hills of Loomis. They adjoin in the middle of the flag forming a ravine, symbolizing Secret Ravine and its importance to the area's early history. The hills on the flag are embracing the sun as a reflection of the town motto: "A Small Town is Like a Big Family." The hills are embracing the sun in the same way that the Town of Loomis embraces its residents, like a family.

The optional text on the bottom of the flag, "TOWN OF LOOMIS," can be used when the flag is printed flat on a document, but should not be used on the fabric flag. The text is Cambria typeface, known for its contrast between heavy vertical serifs and hairlines. The text is crisp so the design will always look beautiful, no matter the size it is printed.

The lively imagery depicted in the flag recalls the town's rich history, while the breadth of symbolism evokes a unique personal experience for residents and visitors alike. The overall design and vibrant colors of the flag truly embody the spirit of Loomis.



The Eagle presents my school.


Eggplants represent the Eggplant Festival that occurs annually.

I only found out about the flag contest today, and I sincerely hope my submission isn't too late. I have seen both Sep 30 and Oct 30 listed as the deadline, so I know it may be too late.

I originally created this design for a contest on Reddit's flag enthusiast community: r/Vexillology. The contest was held in August of 2018 and the prompt was to create a flag design for a town with a population of less than 10,000. I chose Loomis and my design placed 7th out of 152 entries.

I chose to use an eggplant color as the background to pay homage to the town's annual <u>Eggplant Festival</u>. The golden color of the symbol honors the local high school, <u>Del Oro</u>, of which I am a proud alumnus. The symbol in the center represents a mandarin orange in a wooden crate as a symbol of the fruit industry which was so important in the city's past. The symbol also contains an L for Loomis and a shape that resembles the <u>general layout of the city</u>.
