<u>Jesse Lunsford</u>: Asked about existing State and Federal regulations and how the town's regulations fits into this; specifically discussed permitting process and monitoring following approval. He suggested we encourage the establishment of volunteer groups to inspect wetlands, streams and creeks compliance.

<u>Brian Baker:</u> Commented that much of our creeks, streams and wetland areas fall on personal property and voiced caution sending volunteers on private properties.

<u>Rogers Smith</u>: Discussed a report that was submitted by a citizen group regarding open space in Loomis that included suggestion and policies to strengthen the protection and preservation in the Town of Loomis. Follow up discussion determined that this report and its suggested policies was never adopted by the Town Council. Roger suggested follow up on this.

<u>Mary Beth</u> discussed a 12 year stream bed and corridor maintenance program that the town public works department is working on in conjunction with Dokken Engineering. The environmental documents will be posted on line in the next couple of days.

<u>Sylvie Fournier</u>: Commented on the need for increased wildlife species – wetlands etc education as a valuable tool to protect and preserve the town's waterways.
