TOWN REPORT

LOOMIS CHAMBER OF COMMERCE UPDATE

Jenny Knisley, Executive Director of Loomis Chamber, stated the following;

- last month they co-hosted a mixer at the Blue Goose with the Doupnik family, Loomis Soroptimist, the South Placer Heritage and raised almost \$9,000 for the Loomis Christmas Basket program
- we presented our Discover Loomis passport program and it was a huge success getting people to shop local
- they worked on the Discover Loomis Visitors Guide (passed out to each Council) to help those that are visiting Loomis
- tomorrow they have a business walk and they will be walking down Swetzer Road asking questions and will give a full report to the Council
- they will be offering free google classes on the fourth Thursdays at the train depot
- Thursday is their awards dinner with the Town Manager as the guest speaker

BUSINESS

11. Measure for June or November Ballot Regarding The Loomis Library

Discussion and possible action on proposed general transaction and use tax measure and advisory measure for June or November ballot for funding of the Loomis Library

Recommended action: Hear staff presentation, hold discussion, hear public testimony and take action as determined by the Council.

Public comment:

Jenny Knisley, Hunters Drive, asked Council to postpone voting on this while negotiations with the County proceed and suggested appointing another library ad hoc committee for research and gathering information.

Justin Masters, Thornwood Drive, stated that he agrees with the recommendation to postpone a vote to get some affirmative answers.

Jean Wilson, Barton Road, stated she is in favor of postponing the decision tonight and appointing an ad hoc committee to research and come up with more information.

Bonnie London, Shady Canyon Court, expounded on advantages of having our own library.

Linda Sandal, Circle Drive, expounded on the programs they have been having at the Loomis Library.

Ronada Brockman, Horseshoe Bar Road, discussed options that have been given from the research on the services and budgets.

Councilmember Morillas stated that she would like to have an ad hoc committee again, while we are in negotiations with the County.

Councilmember Ucovich stated the following:

- he would like to give the County 30 days to come up with the cost figures for running the library
- he would like to see what the County would charge for circulation and delivery
- he would like to see a non-profit run the library and put a measure on the ballot in November
- he asked if the Mayor could appoint a new ad hoc committee to work on the library

Councilmember Wheeler stated the following:

- we don't have a partnership with the County and they have not provided us any information we have asked for regarding the cost of running the library
- he cannot support a tax measure when we don't know what the cost is to run the library
- he supports continuing to work on this but we need to get information before we can make any action on this

Councilmember Black stated the following:

- we want a Town library, but what we are seeing from the County CEO is that it isn't a fiscal matter, it's a matter of control of the library
- he has a problem with obligating the Town when we don't know what the economy is going to be, what if it cost \$350,000 a year and we are only getting \$125,000 than we will be \$225,000 in the hole for the year
- the only option he sees is number four, "do not declare an emergency, do not place the measure on the June or November 2016 election"

Roger Carroll, Town Finance Director/Town Treasurer, stated the following:

- in 2008 our sales tax was \$125,000
- there are indicators that say we are in for another recession

Jeff Mitchell, Town Attorney, stated the following:

- If Council is not going to put a measure on the June ballot than they don't have to do anything tonight
- the examples that we were given are all great, but they require cooperation between both parties and the hard part is figuring out what the County is willing to do, other than closing the Loomis Library
- it seems that the two main ideas are a traditional system, which is to stay within the County system and the Town contracts with the County and provides financing
- or, a system where in some fashion, it is an operation outside of the Town system and we contract with the County for circulation and delivery services
- we need to ask the County for those two answers and then we can come back to Council and give an idea of what they will do and what it will cost under either, if both are available
- then you can make that next round of decisions regarding a tax measure and what kind

No action was taken.

BUSINESS

1. Loomis Library

Oral presentation on results of the polling.

Recommended action: Hear presentation, discuss and direct staff.

Public comment:

Walt Scherer stated the following:

- their best option is to work with the County
- on number 18 of the survey 75% of the people did not want the library closed and that is without any campaigning or marketing

Jenny Knisley stated the following:

- they have a fact sheet that they use to talk to the Supervisors about and asked if they could give that to the Council
- the Chamber Board is in full support of the tax and they will talk to some of the businesses about this

Linda Sandal, Circle Drive, stated the following:

- they want to keep children and high school age kids coming to the library
- the two programs they had this weekend brought 80 kids to the Loomis library (one was Lego Robotics)

Jean Wilson, Barton Road, stated the following:

- the sales tax will hit the higher end businesses, 25 cents on a \$100 purchase and \$2.50 on a \$1000 purchase
- only half the people that answered the survey are library card holders, but they are still willing to support the library

Ralph Wilson, Barton Road, thanked the Friends of the Library, the Chamber, the Ad Hoc committee and the Council for being in support of this.

Rick Angelocci, Town Manager, stated the following:

- internally, their next step will be going over the polling results in a lot of different ways and looking into the details a lot further
- we are up against a difficult task, most Boards don't like to go against their staff's recommendations
- the Council did adopt a resolution and unanimously voted in support of keeping the library open
- he will be at the meeting on December 8th

Councilmember Wheeler stated the following:

- he talked to four supervisors separately and they all have said it is an uphill battle
- he is uncomfortable with accepting the liability of the library without knowing what the budget is and what is it that is going to be sustainable on the revenue and expense side

Councilmember Ucovich stated the following:

- you will have the ¼ cent sales tax based on sales today and with the potential development in Loomis the retail should go up
- the survey shows the people want the library and they are willing to pay for it
- we need to agendize this so we can come up with some guidance on how we will proceed

Rick Angelocci stated what comes out of the December 8th County Board of Supervisors meeting will direct what actions we need to take.
