LOOMIS CHAMBER OF COMMERCE UPDATE

LIBRARY UPDATE

Walt Scherer stated the following:

- they are surveying the community to determine what they want to see in a library in Loomis
- they have been touring libraries to find out how they are funded and operate their programs
- they are expanding their ad hoc committee to add members of the education community
- libraries today are integrated with the education communities
- they are on schedule and Supervisor Jim Holmes will be meeting with them tomorrow
- they will be examining all of the aspects of funding a library

CONSENT ITEMS FORWARDED

PUBLIC HEARING

11. Mitigated Negative Declaration for the South Placer Municipal Utility District (SPMUD) Diversion Line Project

At the May 10, 2014 Town Council meeting, the Council approved the designation of the Town of Loomis to act as Lead Agency pursuant to CEQA for the SPMUD Sewer Diversion Line Environmental Document. The Draft Mitigated Negative Declaration is completed and was submitted to the State Clearinghouse on June 18, 2015 for a 30 day circulation period.

Recommended action: No action is requested. This is a public hearing to request comments during the public circulation period for the Mitigated Negative Declaration for the SPMUD Diversion Line Project.

Public comment:

Andy Hauge, with Hauge Brueck Associates, stated the following:

- the Town's role is only as the lead agency and SPMUD will build and operate the pipeline
- he expounded on the projects objective for the diversion pipeline, the schedule and different phases, the project mitigations prior to construction and the preferred route through the Turtle Island property

Walt Scherer, Frost Lane, pointed out that he had friends who live on Betty Lane that will need to be notified on the extension down Betty Lane.

Rick Angelocci, Town Manager, stated that if they extend down Betty Lane then they will go door to door and let them know.

Pat Brechtal, 6815 Brace Road, asked if they can tie into the sewer when they come down during the construction and what will the cost be.

Rick Angelocci stated that residents will be given the option to tie into the sewer if they want but not sure when or the cost to do it.

12. Recology Auburn Placer Request for Annual Rate Increase

Pursuant to the Town's agreement with Recology Auburn Placer, a rate change is being requested that will increase rates from 1.22% to 1.78%.

Recommended action: Hold public hearing and approve Resolution of the Town Council of the Town of Loomis approving a rate increase to the Solid Waste Refuse Collection and Hauling contract for Recology Auburn Placer.

Public comment:

John Rowe, General Manager with Recology Auburn Placer, stated they will pick up any dead animals (deer, dogs, skunks, etc.) in the Town and haul it to the County.

Jean Wilson, 4301 Barton Road, asked if senior small can rate will be continued?

John Rowe said yes.

Following further discussion on the matter, a motion was made to approve Resolution 15-14, approving a rate increase to the Solid Waste Refuse Collection and Hauling contract for Recology Auburn Placer. 13. Selection of Consultant to Update the Town's Website

At the February 28, 2015 Council Strategic Plan Retreat, the Council set a goal for this year to have the Town's website updated.

Yvonne Heimann, owner of Ask Yvi, expounded on her company, the scope of work – website design, maintenance, marketing and answered questions.

Shaun Lupton, CEO – Creative Director for Doodad Studios/Designwerks Media, expounded on their company, the development of the website, the support and answered questions.

David Lucht, owner of Tech-Line Computers, expounded on his company, design goals for the website, the support and answered questions.

Walt Scherer stated he liked Yvonne's proposal ("Ask Yvi").

14. Del Oro Aquatic Center Update

At the May 12, 2015 Council meeting, Councilmember Ucovich requested an update regarding the Del Oro Aquatic Center. The friends of the Del Oro Pool will be making a presentation at the Council meeting.

Public comment:

Grace Kamphefner gave an update on the Del Oro Aquatic Center, funds that have been raised, and answered questions.

Casey Feickert showed the new location for the pool, the conceptual plan for the new softball field, the new restroom that can be used by the soccer field and tennis courts (portables are being used right now) and answered questions.

Lindi Callahan has meant with the Placer United Soccer Group who are excited to use the field year round and also met with the tennis coach who is excited to have the new restrooms and a snack bar to help raise money.

Sean Erickson, Del Oro Soft Ball Coach and lives on King Road, stated that this change will give them the opportunity to bring their Junior Soft Ball team back from the Loomis Park, where they pay a fee for the rental usage, to the Del Oro campus.

John Williams, liaison for the Five Cities Softball and the Del Oro soft ball and the JV soft ball coach at Del Oro, stated that he had a concern with the freshmen and sophomore girls that are walking from class with their bags across the overpass on King Road to practice soft ball at the park.

Tim Onderko asked if they will be putting in lights?

Sean Erickson said yes.

Pat Brechtal thanked those that are working on the funding and design of the pool.

A resident, who just moved into the Loomis area, stated he had done research on Loomis before he moved here and is very proud to be a part of this community.

15. Voting Delegates To League Conference

The League of California Cities Conference in September 2015 will include League business and cities are asked to appoint voting delegates to conduct that business

Recommended action: Appoint a voting delegate and alternate to act on behalf of the Town and give direction.
