



TOWN COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS FOR JUNE

Mayor Baker:

Placer County Transportation Planning Agency -

- The Board directed staff to begin the process to place a Transportation Expenditure Plan and Sales Tax Ordinance on the November 2016 ballot. The Board also did another review of the Transportation Expenditure Plan and the principles of the Transportation Sales Tax Ordinance, as well as the process for the placement on the ballot. Key elements include a specific list of projects and distributions to be funded by the sales tax, as well as taxpayer safeguards and a sunset date.
- The Board reviewed the results of public comment on the draft environmental document for the I-80/SR 65 Interchange Improvements and SR 65/Galleria Boulevard/Stanford Ranch Road Northbound Ramps, which we just call "the Ramps." The Board concurred with the recommendation that alternative 2 for the I-80/SR 65 Interchange Improvements and the build alternative for the Ramps project.
- Other Board actions and activities included adopting the final FY 2016/17 Overall Work Program and Budget and accepting the Rural Transit Study as final.

Councilmember Robert Black:

Placer County Air Pollution Control District – The Board conducted a preliminary budget review, Air Pollution Control Officer Performance Evaluation, hearing on the reappointment of the Engineer Representative to the Hearing Board, budget authorization for Contracted Technical Support and to purchase a replacement vehicle. Also a hearing was conducted on the budget for the match funding for the CEC's DC Fast Electric Vehicle Charger Grant for the I-80 corridor. Approval for Erik White's contract amendment, overview of the Regional Spare the Air program.

Business Liaison – the meeting was cancelled due to one of the members illness.

SACOG -

- The SACOG Board authorized subrecipient agreements with the Cities of Sacramento and West Sacramento to conduct planning work for the [Streetcar Toolkit](#) project using funds from a Federal Transit Administration Pilot Program for Transit-Oriented Development Planning. The work will result in a Toolkit of policy and regulatory changes to remove barriers and facilitate transit-oriented development in the comprehensive planning area around the streetcar.
- The SACOG Board adopted the Fiscal Year 16-17 [Budget](#) and [Overall Work Program](#) (OWP). The OWP guides the agency's work for the fiscal year July 1, 2016, to June 30, 2017.
- SACOG is hosting the Public Health Officers and Planning Directors Convening on **Thursday, May 26**, from 8:15 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The convening will look at planning codes, design guidelines and policies for updates that would promote more active design/transportation and health. Planning Directors and SACOG Board members/alternates are encouraged to attend.
- [May is Bike Month](#) continues with activities across the region toward the goal of riding two million miles in May. Shop Dine Bike Day is on **Saturday, May 28**. Participating businesses are helping to spread the word and encourage people to consider using their bike instead of their car to visit local restaurants, stores, farmers markets, grocery stores, and breweries.
