CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM – MID-YEAR BUDGET

ADJUSTMENT CONSIDERATION

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the Resolution for the Mid-Year Budget Adjustment for the 2012-2017 Capital Improvement Program for Transportation and Parks, Recreation and Open Space, and incorporate any revisions made to the document during discussions.

ISSUE STATEMENT AND DISCUSSION:

Attached is the proposed 5 year Capital Improvement Program (Exhibit A). The Program is divided into two sections. The first section is the Transportation Improvement Projects which are separated into unscheduled and scheduled projects. The second section covers Parks, Recreation and Open Space Improvement Projects. These projects are also separated into unscheduled and scheduled projects.

Staff has received the following requests to consider as part of the CIP Mid-Year adjustment:

- Repair Bankhead Road Staff received a letter from Gina Georgiou who lives at 3760 Bankhead Road (letter attached). She is concerned with the condition of Bankhead and would like it repaired. At a minimum, she would like to see the segment of Bankhead Road from King Road to Saunders Avenue completed. Bankhead Road is covered under the Unscheduled portion of the CIP. The estimated cost to reconstruct the entire roadway from King Road to Sierra College is \$500,000. The cost to reconstruct the segment of King Road to Saunders is estimated at \$120,000. The next paving project is in the 2013/2014 CIP improvements (Taylor Road). Combining this work with other paving reconstruction locations will provide cheaper unit costs.
- At the December 11th Town Council meeting, the Council discussed the consideration of improving additional segments of the Loomis Town Center Implementation Plan. Currently, the CIP covers the Taylor Road segment from Walnut Street to Oak Street and four proposed crosswalks from Oak Street to Shawn Way. Attached is a table of the

proposed segments on Taylor Road showing construction and engineering costs for each segment.

Staff contacted Caltrans and received the following schedule for the Bridge Raising Project:

January 15, 2013 - Plans & Estimate completed and under review

Late March/Early April 2013 - Plans, Specs, & Estimate (PS&E) completed

June 2013 – Advertise project

September 2013 – Award Contract. Will go into Winter Suspension and Construction will begin in Spring/Early Summer 2014. This project is a two season job.

Spring/Summer 2015 - Horseshoe Bar Overcrossing scheduled in Season #2

CEQA REQUIREMENTS:

The majority of proposed projects are contained within the Town's existing right-of-way and could be categorized as an exemption status. Projects in the Trails Master Plan will require an environmental document and studies.

FINANCIAL AND/OR POLICY IMPLICATIONS:

The total Unscheduled and Scheduled CIP projects are estimated at roughly \$73 million dollars. The Town currently has \$322,650 under the development fee account that would cover projects identified in the General Plan Circulation Element. The CIP improvements will be funded by various funding sources. Transportation Development Act money (\$0 to date), Gas Tax Funds (\$280,000), Bickford Ranch Mitigation funding (\$200,000), General Fund Reserve (\$1.0 Million), Passive Park Open Space Funds (\$91,500), Tree Mitigation Fund (\$294,000) and Heritage Park Estates Assessment Funds (\$7,330). Staff may also receive State grants, Federal and outside mitigation funding to supplement projects.

My name is Gina Georgiou and I live on Bankhead Rd. and I am the one that collected the signatures for the speed bumps to be installed on our road. From Saunders / Bankhead Rd stop sign and going toward King Rd, the road is in very bad shape. It is not a road for cars but for off road vehicles. It is full of ripple, holes, and uneven pavement. I am driving this road at least 8 times a day to take my grand kids to and from school. My son and daughter drives this road as well. I am to the point where we are driving toward king road using the other side of the road to avoid the mess not to say the other side is bad as well.

This is hard on car tires, shocks, shaking of the car which can loosen every bolt on the car. All I hear from the town of Loomis, "that there is no money." But from what I see behind Subway in the main town you have installed a paved road and installed a playground as well. Where did that money come from? Almost all main streets off of King road has been paved and well taken care of, well what about Bankhead Rd.

I am not asking to pave the whole bankhead Rd (it would be nice) but I can meet half way and ask you to pave from Saunders stop sign to the end where King Rd meets. Winter time is coming and that will be the worst of all, because the pot holes will loosen and come apart from the water sitting in it. We are tax payers and but we don't get much in return. I hope the Town of Loomis and Councilman takes this under consideration before winter hits.
