1. <u>Loomis Library</u>

Presentation and Request from the Loomis Library Ad hoc Committee Report; Possible Action to Award Grant to Friends of Loomis Library to Retain Election Consultant

Recommended action: Hear presentation, discuss and direct staff.

Public comment:

The following Library Ad Hoc Committee members addressed the Council:

Jenny Knisley read a statement on the importance of libraries.

Bonnie London gave a power point presentation on the research they have done, the history of the library, on literacy, library programs and resources, and how Libraries build communities.

Ramona Brockman expounded on the managing of the survey (over 800 responded), the purpose of the survey, and some of the key findings from the survey.

Walt Scherer discussed financial considerations in contracting with the County library system, funding methods, and answered questions.

Following further discussion on the matter, a motion was made to approve a grant to Friends of Loomis Library which would not exceed \$20,000 for the polling consultant; the Town Manager must approve the consultant selected and the scope of work, which would include helping write the measure; direct staff to begin negotiations with the County on keeping the library open until after the June vote on the ballot and the Town begins to receive tax revenue from the ballot; if it passes, negotiate acquiring the library building and land; and negotiate the terms on which the County will provide library services. On motion by Councilmember Black, seconded by Councilmember Ucovich and passed by the following roll call vote:
