2021 -2026 STRATEGIC WORKSHOP

Town Manager Sean Rabé reviewed the status of each area of the Strategic Plan and requested the Council provide staff with direction on any modifications.

The Following was discussed and suggested:

Use of technology to increase services to Town residents:

- Add text message notification system

Community Development:

- Bring back master tree list
- Engage with partner agencies on solutions to regional issues (traffic, etc.)
- Work to include bicycle lanes throughout Town
- Provide more shade in areas around the Train Depot and Blue Anchor Park

Operations:

- Release RFP for plan checks; look at in-house staff for building inspections
- Work with PCSO to address ongoing speeding issues

Financial Resiliency

- Add inclusionary housing ordinance to fee study
- Repost an RFP for 3800 Taylor Road along with an RFQ for Broker Services for assistance with the marketing

Build Community and Transparency

- Look at moving July 4th bike parade downtown
- Coordinate National Night Out at the Depot
- Create and maintain a historic building inventory for Downtown Loomis

PUBLIC COMMENT

Ed Horton: Noted the positive change in government practices in Loomis. Voice concern that the General Plan process is taking too long.

Alina Miller: Commented on the increase in vehicles using the area next to the Railroad accessing Sierra College Blvd. She also inquired about traffic enforcement on Sierra College Blvd, and the Fair market of the WW Moulding property. She also suggested the site be used a possible location for a building of historic value to be relocated to – suggesting a historic museum.

Cheryl Benson: Commented on the Costco litigation and voiced concern over the proposed text amendment. She also asked that the website be updated to a more usable format and requested greater transparency.
