RE: Public Hearing – Recology Request for a Rate Increase

Recommendation

Hold a public hearing on the proposed garbage collection service rate increase requested by Recology Auburn Placer. Consider all protests, including any written protests submitted prior to the close of the public hearing, tabulate ballots, and if no majority protest exists, approve a resolution establishing new Town of Loomis customer rates for garbage collection service, effective July 1, 2023.

Issue Statement

The Town of Loomis has a long-standing contractual relationship with Recology Auburn Placer to provide solid waste collection services for the Town. The franchise agreement with Recology includes the ability to make annual requests for rate adjustments to reflect the cost of doing business. Recology has requested such a rate adjustment to cover both an increased tipping fee charged by the Western Placer Waste Management Authority for the disposal of municipal waste, and a cost-of-living adjustment, capped at 4.0%, to cover an increase in labor costs.

Recology Auburn Placer provided written notice of the proposed rate increase (Attachment B) to its customers along with the date and time of the public hearing to consider the proposed rate increase, not less than 45 days prior to the public hearing, in compliance with California Constitution Article XIII D (Proposition 218).

On Tuesday, June 13, 2023, beginning at 7:00 p.m., the Town Council of the Town of Loomis will hold a public hearing at its regularly scheduled meeting, at the Town Council Chambers located at the Loomis Depot, 5775 Horseshoe Bar Road in Loomis, to consider a garbage collection service rate increase as proposed by Recology Auburn Placer, the Town's franchised solid waste hauler. The proposed rate increase reflects an increase to the average residential customer's monthly garbage bill of between 9.2 to 14.8 percent, depending upon the type of service provided. If adopted, the proposed rate increase will go into effect on July 1, 2023.

Owners of property and customers served by Recology Auburn Placer may protest the proposed increase in fees by addressing the Town Council at the public hearing or by filing a written protest with the Town Clerk at P.O. Box 1330, Loomis, CA 95650.

The written protest must identify the parcel served by address or APN (assessor's parcel number) and be received (not postmarked) by the Town Clerk before or during the public hearing. Only one protest per parcel shall be counted for purposes of establishing a majority protest to the proposed fee increase.

Discussion

The franchise agreement with Recology Auburn Placer grants Recology the exclusive right to collect, transport and dispose of solid waste material from residential and commercial customers in the Town of Loomis. This includes the collection of non-hazardous trash, garbage, recycled material, discarded household appliances, and yard waste.

The yard waste collection program was initiated in 2004 in response to California statues that required all state agencies to divert at least 50% of their solid waste from landfills. Recology provided this at no cost to Loomis residents in exchange for a 10-year contract extension that is set to expire in September 2024.

By collecting and processing the disposal of yard waste separately, the Town has remained in compliance with the 50% solid waste diversion requirement, and more recently the State mandated SB 1383 50% organic waste landfill diversion requirements.

Recology is a trash hauler and does not operate a disposal facility in our area. The regional agency responsible for the processing and disposal of solid waste is the Western Placer Waste Management Authority (WPWMA). Their facilities include an active landfill in Roseville and a Material Recovery Facility in Lincoln which includes trash sorting, composting, household hazardous waste collection, and a recycling buyback facility.

The WPWMA has determined that their Material Processing Facility needs to be modernized and expanded in order to support the anticipated long-term growth in Western Placer County and to comply with the waste diversion goals required by CalRecycle, and the California Green Building Standards Code. This expansion, valued at \$120 million, is being financed through the issuance of bonds which require a debt coverage ratio of at least 125% to achieve a credit rating of BBB. To achieve this, in July 2022, the WPWMA Board of Directors approved an adjustment to their tipping fee rate structure that included an 8.5% increase effective January 2023, to be followed by an additional 8.5% increase that would take effect in July 2023. (Attachment C).

The 17% increase in the tipping fee imposed by the WPWMA must be recovered by Recology as a pass-through cost. Additionally, since Recology typically only requests a rate adjustment annually, 6-months of increased tipping fee costs have already accumulated, since the tipping fee rate increase went into effect in January 2023. Finally, included in the proposed Recology rate increase is a cost-of-living adjustment, capped at 4.0%, for costs associated with previously negotiated labor agreements.

The cost of a 96-gallon toter, the most common residential service, is proposed to increase from the current rate of \$31.92 to \$34.89 per month (9.30% increase). A typical five cubic yard bin used by commercial customers, serviced one time per week, is proposed to increase from the current rate of \$453.94 to \$493.14 per month (8.60% increase).

The percentage increase proposed by Recology, compared to past rate increases is shown below.

Absent a majority protest, staff recommends proceeding with the requested garbage collection rate increases to ensure adequate operating revenue.

CEQA Requirements

Under CEQA Guidelines Section 15273 there are no CEQA implications associated with the proposed rate increase as they do not increase or expand service.

Financial and/or Policy Implications

The approval of the proposed rate increase will result in rate increases for residents of between 9.2 to 14.8% depending upon the type and level of service. Collection fees for garbage service are paid directly to Recology by their customers. As a result, the proposed rate increase has no direct impact on the Town's General Fund.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the franchise agreement, Recology Auburn Placer has requested a rate adjustment to the collection service rates charged to its Town of Loomis customers to cover both an increased tipping fee charged by the Western Placer Waste Management Authority and a cost-of-living adjustment; and

WHEREAS, Recology Auburn Placer provided written notice of the proposed rate increase to its customers along with the date and time of the public hearing to consider the proposed rate increase, not less than 45 days prior to the public hearing, in compliance with California Constitution Article XIII D (Proposition 218); and

WHEREAS, the duly noticed public hearing, for the proposed solid waste collection service rate increases, was held before the Town Council on June 13, 2023; and

WHEREAS, at the conclusion of the public hearing, the Town Clerk tabulated the number of written protests received and reported that there was not a majority protest of the proposed collection service rates by owners or authorized representative of the identified and affected properties; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has reviewed the information submitted by Recology Auburn Placer proposing to raise rates within the parameters of the contract, and after considering public testimony, the Town Council has determined that the proposed collection service rates are appropriate, lawful, and should be adopted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Town of Loomis, that the rate increases requested by Recology Auburn Placer, as stated in the public notice, are approved; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the collection service rate increases will be effective as of July 1, 2023.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED GARBAGE COLLECTION SERVICE RATE INCREASE

SOLID WASTE RATE INCREASE

On Tuesday, June 13, 2023, beginning at 7:00 p.m., the Town Council of the Town of Loomis will hold a public hearing at its regularly scheduled meeting, at the Town Council Chambers located at the Loomis Depot, 5775 Horseshoe Bar Road in Loomis, to consider a garbage collection service rate increase as proposed by Recology Auburn Placer, the Town's franchised solid waste hauler.

The proposed rate increase reflects an increase to the average residential customer's monthly garbage bill of between 6.2 to 11.0 percent, depending upon the type of service. The cost increase is necessary to cover a Cost-of-Living Adjustment, which was capped at 4.0% and the change in cost to process and dispose of collected waste at the Western Placer Material Recovery Facility.

If adopted, the proposed rate increase will go into effect on July 1, 2023. Owners of property and customers served by Recology Auburn Placer may protest the proposed increase in fees by addressing the Town Council at the public hearing or by filing a written protest with the Town Clerk at P.O. Box 1330, Loomis, CA 95650.

The written protest must identify the parcel served by address or Assessor's Parcel Number and be actually received (not postmarked) by the Town Clerk before/during the public hearing. Only one protest per parcel shall be counted for purposes of establishing a majority protest to the proposed fee increase.

SUBJECT: TIPPING FEE INCREASES FOR FY 2022/23, FY 2023/24 AND

FY 2024/25

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

After conducting a public hearing:

1. Adopt Resolution 22-06 that increases tipping fees effective January 1, 2023, July 1, 2023, and July 1, 2024; and

2. Find this action exempt from CEQA pursuant to Section 21080(b)(8) of the Public Resources Code.

BACKGROUND:

Your Board periodically adjusts the WPWMA's tipping fee structure to reflect current and future financial needs while ensuring that the WPWMA remains competitive in the marketplace. The last time your Board adjusted rates was at the March 10, 2022 meeting with the adjusted rates effective July 1, 2022. At that time, the cost implications of issuing bonds to finance improvements to the MRF were not well known enough to justify further adjustments to the tipping fees.

Over the past two months, staff has worked closely with the WPWMA's financial advisor and bond underwriter to develop a financial pro forma model intended to identify the ongoing revenues necessary to meet the WPWMA's operational cost obligations, support at least a BBB credit rating from S&P Global Ratings and meet the anticipated bond covenant of maintaining an annual debt coverage ratio of at least 125%.

At the May 12, 2022, June 9, 2022, and June 29, 2022 meetings, staff and the financial team presented information to, and answered questions from, your Board related to the necessary adjustments to the tipping fee structure to meet the goals noted in the preceding paragraph. At the June 29, 2022 meeting, your Board directed staff to take the necessary actions to conduct a public hearing to adjust rates, including conducting the appropriate noticing, for the current fiscal year as well as the next two fiscal years that identified a range of possible tipping fees based, in part, on waste stream tonnage commitments from the Member Agencies. As noted elsewhere in this agenda package, on July 6, 2022, the Roseville City Council approved the First Amendment to its flow commitment agreement with the WPWMA which results in the delivery of all wastes collected within the jurisdictional boundaries of the City for a period of three (3) years. Should your Board authorize the Chair to execute the First Amendment, staff estimate that the lower end of the recommended tipping fee adjustment will generate sufficient revenues to meet the necessary rating and bonding metrics.

Notice of the public hearing to consider the proposed tipping fee increases was published in the Roseville Press Tribune, Placer Herald, Lincoln News Messenger,

Loomis News and Auburn Journal newspapers the week of July 11th and July 18th and was sent via email and US mail to WPWMA account customers. Information related to the proposed rate increases was posted on the WPWMA's website and social media sites, shared with Public Information Officers of the Member Agencies, posted at the WPWMA's scalehouses, printed on all customer disposal tickets generated by the WPWMA from July 12 to July 21, and distributed to the Participating Agencies administrative offices the week July 11th.

ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE:

The recommended action is exempt from CEQA under Public Resources Code Section 21080(b) (8), provided your Board adopts findings that the rates are necessary to meet current and anticipated near-term operating expenses necessary for the maintenance of services

FISCAL IMPACT:

Staff recommend your Board increase rates by approximately 8.5% for the second half of FY 2022/23, 8.5% for FY 2023/24 and 2.5% for FY 2024/25.

The recommended adjustment to the FY 2022/23 tipping fee structure, effective January 1, 2023, is anticipated to generate an additional \$1.84 million in gross revenues this fiscal year, based on the lower end of the recommended tipping fee adjustments.

The recommended tipping fee adjustments are expected to demonstrate a sufficiently strong economic position to result in a credit rating of at least BBB and provide for estimated debt coverage ratios of between 133% and 144% over the current and next two fiscal years.
