- Tax rate of 35.5 ¢, a decrease of 13.5 cents
- Elimination of 6 staff positions
- Water rate increase of 6%
- Sewer rate increase of 3%
- Stormwater fee decrease of \$2 per month
- Elimination of tag fees

The City Council reviewed their FY 22-24 Goals during the budget retreats in early 2024 and plan to complete a new strategic vision during the 24-25 fiscal year with increased citizen involvement. - Develop Land Use Master Plans for Target Areas
