Great things are happening in Lowell. The announcement of Sonic Automotive locating their call center here was great news. Their investment in Lowell and 500 jobs was the largest white collar job announcement in the history of Gaston County. We were happy to learn that we were successful in our Community Development Block Grant Application. The City was awarded \$750,000 to provide assistance for housing repairs for low

income residents in a specific target area. A portion of the grant money will be used for repairs to the community center. Once the city receives the grant guidelines from the State (probably this spring) we will begin to inform you of how to apply for the grant funds. We also applied for a grant to help pay for sewer line replacement and are awaiting the grant award announcements.

Communication with you, the citizen, will be greatly improved as you will be able to sign up for text or email alerts for the specific information that interests you.
