
COMMUNITY FOCUSED WATERING AND CONSERVATION

While the beginning of February may not feel like it, we are slowly getting closer to warm weather days. This seasonal change comes with a renewed focus on water conversation. Maintaining efficient water usage is not only important to yard maintenance, but also to maintaining safe water supply in city storage tanks. Luckily, the North Texas Municipal Water Utility District (NTMWD) provides resources to help residents maintain water use while also considering the stress placed on water levels during high usage months. Here are some tips on how to have a community focused watering perspective.

- Follow City of Lucas watering day schedule The City of Lucas has revised its watering schedule. Following your watering day is a crucial part of water conservation and community focused watering. The schedule takes effect every year on April 1 and ends October 31. The watering day schedule can be downloaded online at: www.lucastexas.us/watering-days.
- Water before 10:00 am and after 6:00 pm Did you know that 50% of water is lost to evaporation when used during peak times of sun exposure? When watering on your designated watering day, be sure to water before 10:00 am and after 6:00 pm. This will help community conversation and monthly water costs.

Tricks like planting native plants and installing timed watering mechanisms will help maintain City of Lucas water supplies.

TRASH, RECYCLING & BULK/BRUSH REMINDERS

Community Waste Disposal (CWD) picks up all trash, recyclables, bulky waste, and brush weekly on your regular service day. Please follow the below guidelines for trash and recycling:



REMINDER

- Place all trash, recyclables, bulky waste, and brush out no later than 7:00 a.m. on your service day. CWD picks up all items between 7:00 am and 7:00 p.m. on your service day.
- All household trash must be placed inside the CWD
- gray trash cart. Only use CWD carts as other carts will not be picked up.
- All recyclables must be empty, clean, dry, and placed loosely inside the CWD blue recycle cart.
- DO NOT leave household trash bags next to the carts as they will not be picked up.
- DO NOT bag recyclables.
- DO NOT tie down or place an object on top of your trash and recycle cart lids.

Please keep in mind that the City does have regulations regarding trash and recycling cart placement, and when these carts can be put out and when they should be brought back to the residence. The carts should be placed at the street no earlier than 6:00 a.m. on the day of scheduled collection. Carts should be removed from the street location and <u>out of view from the street</u> no later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of scheduled collection.

CITY OF LUCAS 2025 GENERAL ELECTION

The City of Lucas general election will be held on May 3, 2025. There will be two City Council seats on the ballot, City Council Seat 5, and City Council Seat 6. Each City Council seat serves a three-year term. Applications for a place on the ballot will be available from the City Secretary's office beginning January 2, 2025. Candidates may file an application with the City Secretary beginning Wednesday, January 15, 2025, through Friday, February 14, 2025. Please note that electronic application submittals will not be accepted.

To be eligible for office, the City Charter states the following criteria must be met:

- Resident of the City for 12 continuous months
- Qualified voter of the City
- Have never been convicted or not currently charged with a felony or crime involving moral turpitude
- 18 years of age
- Not delinquent on ad valorem taxes due to the City

Over the past twelve months, households in Lucas have recycled an impressive average of 684 pounds of material—equivalent to 57 pounds per month. To put this into perspective, the national average is just under 21 pounds per month.

CRACK SEALING LUCAS ROADS: SAFETY & LONGEVITY

The City of Lucas is committed to ensuring its roadways remain safe, smooth, and well-maintained for all residents and visitors. As part of this commitment, the city has initiated a comprehensive crack sealing program aimed at preserving the quality of its roads and extending their lifespan.

Drivers may have noticed some new black markings on some of Lucas' streets. These black marks are crack sealant. The City of Lucas recently completed a round of crack sealing as part of our commitment to ensuring that roadways remain in good condition.

Crack sealing is a cost-effective pavement maintenance technique that involves filling cracks in the asphalt sealant. This process prevents water, debris, and other damaging elements from penetrating the road's surface, which can lead to potholes, further cracking, and costly repairs. Crack sealing helps to improve safety and extend the life of existing road infrastructure. This is typically prioritized on

newer pavement sections as first line maintenance since it is most effective early in the pavement Lifecyle.

DRONE AS A FIRST RESPONDER

After almost a year of research and collaboration, the City of Lucas and the Lovejoy Independent School District (LISD) have jointly purchased a drone. This exciting collaboration between the City of Lucas and LISD is a major step forward in enhancing community safety and security. This first-of-itskind partnership will equip both agencies with a powerful drone equipped with advanced sensors, thermal imaging, autonomous deployment, remote piloting, live feed monitoring, and automated reporting. The DJI-M30 drone along with the Internet based software "Watchtower" can be remotely flown by our trained pilots with an on-scene "visual observer".



Special recognition to Firefighter/Paramedic Andrew Fulton for bringing the research and collaboration idea to Fire Chief Ted Stephens. After multiple meetings with the LISD personnel, specifically Casey Littlefield-Director of Safety and Security, Kyle Pursifull-Executive Director of

District Support Services, and Katie Kordel-School Superintendent, City officials and School officials decided to pursue the interlocal agreement to secure the purchase. A huge thank you to the LISD School Board and the City of Lucas City Council for unanimously approving the agreement and the purchase of the drone.

Firefighter/Paramedic Andrew Fulton has been named LFR's lead pilot and is currently training additional pilots for the City. School Marshals Jorge Jacquez and Shaun Tomlinson are lead pilots for the school district.

All paperwork and compliance documents have been submitted and approved by the FAA and the drone is ready for its first mission. The City's primary use of the drone will be for structure fires and missing persons, but additional responses may include horse accidents on the trail, motor vehicle collisions, water line breaks, and survey flights for the city's engineering department.

The drone system, tailored specifically for governmental use, will significantly elevate safety and security measures for both the school district and the community. The City of Lucas Fire-Rescue will house the drone, with personnel from both the Fire Department and Lovejoy ISD trained as operators - providing critical redundancy to support rapid response during emergencies.
