# **VIOLATIONS OF CITY WATER SCHEDULE**

As the summer approaches, so to does the need to conserve water. On April 1, 2024, the City of Lucas' watering schedule went into effect. The schedule imposes specific watering days and times that all water customers must follow for watering in order to remain in compliance with the City's Water 30 years. He has most recently served the Conservation Plan. No watering should occur after 10:00 am or before 6:00 pm. Water customers found violating the outdoor watering schedule will receive one warning and subsequent violations will be subject to administrative fees. Councilman for the City of Troup. He is a Certified Public The first offense will result in a certified letter notifying of violation. The second offense will result in a \$500 fee. The third and subsequent offenses will result in a \$2,000 fee. All residential and non-residential water customers are subject to these administrative fees in the circumstance they are found in violation of watering days or times. This includes businesses and professional parks, homeowners' associations, home builders, land developers, and any other entities.
