The City of Lucas wants everyone to have a safe Fourth of July, but please do not include discharging fireworks as part of your festivities. We want to remind everyone that the use of fireworks is prohibited. More importantly, the City of Lucas prides itself on being animal friendly and fireworks can be very dangerous to our pets and livestock. Discharging fireworks can also cause problems for our veterans and families with voung children as well. Using fireworks is prohibited by City ordinance in the city limits of Lucas. Law Enforcement and Code Enforcement Officers will be patrolling throughout the Fourth of July holiday weekend and any person found in violation will have their fireworks confiscated and may also receive a citation. Here are some helpful tips about the use of fireworks.

Q What should I do if my neighbor is setting off fireworks?

A Call 972-547-5100 and press option "2" to reach the non-emergency dispatch operator.

Q Can I shoot fireworks from land that I own in the City of Lucas? A No. This is a violation of City ordinance.

Q I have lived in Lucas for years and discharged fireworks, is this a new regulation?


A No. Fireworks have been prohibited since November 1979.


If a fire is found to be started accidentally and damages the property of another, you may be subject to a fine. In either case, you may be held civilly liable for damages.

Outdoor Burning Regulations & Fire Prevention Tips

POSESSION & USE OF FIREWORKS

IS <u>ILLEGAL</u> IN THE CITY OF LUCAS

As wildfire season approaches in Texas, Lucas Fire-Rescue wants to remind residents to follow outdoor burning regulations to help prevent fires. If you plan to burn outdoors, you must meet these safety requirements:

- ♦ No county burn ban in effect
- Fire must be constantly attended
- Burn pile must be 3 feet or smaller in diameter and 2 feet or less in height
- Only firewood and natural tree branches from your property may be burned
- Fires in approved containers must be at least 15 feet from structures
- Open burns must be 25 feet from property lines
- Keep a fire extinguisher, water hose, or shovel with dirt nearby
- Ensure fires do not create smoke nuisances or traffic haz-
- Fires must be in open areas with a clear sky view (not under trees or canopies)

Forest Creek Park Playground Improvements



Construction on the new playground at Forest Creek Park will commence during the week of June 16th. This work includes replacing the twentyyear-old playground equipment with new equipment, improving the playground area surface, and adding seating. The City of Lucas received funding for this

project from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's Local Parks Grant program, which is funded through a portion of the state sales tax on sporting goods. The state has agreed to provide 50% of the funding for this project, up to a maximum state cost share of \$118,163. The actual cost of the planned improvements for this phase is estimated at \$144,176.

2024 Annual Drinking Water Report

Each year the City of Lucas and the North Texas Municipal Water District (NTMWD) produce a report to inform our water customers about the quality and safety of our drinking water. The 2024 Annual Drinking Water Quality Report (Consumer Confidence Report) can be found on the City's website at the following link: www.lucastexas.us/drinkingwater-quality-report-ccr-latest/. The source of drinking water used by the City of Lucas is purchased surface water from the NTMWD. The City of Lucas estimated that 16,390,000 gallons of water were unaccounted for during the 2024 calendar year. Unaccounted water use is attributed to leaks, hydrant flushing, water works maintenance and firerescue operations. McKinney Airport Update

The McKinney National Airport, situated approximately 8.7 miles from Lúcas City Hall, is accessible via multiple routes that traverse the heart of our community. The City of McKinney has proposed a substantial expansion of the airport to support anticipated growth in both passenger and commercial air traffic. This initiative is backed by approximately \$52 million in committed funding.

In January, the City of Lucas formally submitted public comments expressing significant concerns about the proposed expansion. City staff highlighted the potential negative impacts on the quality of life and the distinctive character of the Lucas community.

More recently, the North Texas Conservation Association filed a federal lawsuit challenging the adequacy of the environmental review conducted by the City of McKinney. While the outcome of the lawsuit remains uncertain, it could potentially delay the introduction of passenger services at the airport for an indefinite period.
