Water Conservation & Outdoor Watering Schedules

As summer temperatures rise, so does the demand on our water supply. That's why the City of Lucas is committed to enforcing its Outdoor Watering Schedule to protect this essential resource for current and future generations.

On April 1, 2025, the City's outdoor watering schedule went into effect. All water customers—residential and non-residential—must follow the assigned watering days and times to remain in compliance.

Watering is *prohibited* between 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., when evaporation is at its peak.

Violations & Penalties

To ensure fair and effective water use, enforcement measures are in place:

1st Violation: Certified letter warning **2nd Violation:** \$500 administrative fee

3rd & Subsequent Violations: \$2,000 administrative fee

Water is a finite resource, and compliance is not just encouraged —it's required. By working together and following the schedule, we can reduce waste, protect our infrastructure, and ensure there's enough water for all.
