## The History of the City of Lucas and Collin County, Texas



#### First Settlers before 1836

Before 1836 only Indians were living in an area known later as the present Collin County. When the first settlers came there were a few bands of Tonkawas, Cherokees and Delawares, plus a few Kickapoos.



#### First Settlers before 1836

In 1841 a camp of Delawares were at the big spring which was later called Fitzhugh Mills near Fairview. A small village of Tonkawas was located two miles north of present McKinney and another Tonkawa village seven miles northeast. In all, there were not over 200 Indians then in the county.



In 1836, Texas became a Republic. Men who fought in that war were awarded land. Some of this land was in Fannin County (part of which was Collin County), but many owners never saw or inhabited the property. In a few cases up to 1,280 acres or more, had been given to those who fought in that Revolution. These were called grants, and in almost all cases they were sold or traded off without ever seeing it. 
had selected their land from crude maps in Austin. Almost all the land in the present county was owned by The Republic of Texas and free to settlers who wanted it.




The main reason for the influx of early settlers into what is now Collin County was due to free land. In the states of Kentucky, Missouri, Tennessee, Georgia and Alabama, where most of the settlers came from, free land had been taken up. During a time period where owning land was the only way to get ahead, ownership of a square mile of virgin land in the new country was attractive enough to outweigh the hardships incidental to the long journey and the danger of Indian attacks after they arrived into the County.



Fannin County was organized in 1838, and that county then included all the territory of present Collin County.





Fort English (later Bonham) was the capital and general headquarters for all the settlers in this part on northeast Texas at the time.





The people living there had heard of the fine land lying on the East Fork of the Trinity River through hunters and trappers. A party was organized at Fort English to go and look at the virgin territory.



This party composed of Daniel Rowlett, Jabez Fitzgerald, Edmund Todd, Pleasant Wilson, Dr. William E. Throckmorton, William Garnett and Littleton Rattan left Ft. English the first week in November 1841 and explored the country as far as present Rowlett Creek.



They returned to Fort English and then brought out their families and household goods, intending to make their homes here. With them this time came three additional men and their families. These men were Garrett Fitzgerald, M.C. Westley and Bluford Clements.

They selected land 7 miles North of present McKinney on what became Throckmorton Creek, erected log cabins and built a stockade around them. This in January, 1842 was the first white settlement of now Collin County.

#### WILLIAM EDWARD THROCKMORTON (1795-1843)

One of the First Collin County pioneers, built a very important stockade. Indians at that time were so dangerous he built this stockade around his settlement. Other first pioneers built their cabins inside this stockade even though they owned land elsewhere in the county. He died on October 2, 1843, and was buried in the Throckmorton Cemetery, two miles northwest of Melissa. In 1936 the Commission of Control for Texas Centennial Celebrations erected a monument at his grave.

Throckmorton County, which was established on January 13, 1858, was named in his honor, probably as a compliment to his son, James W. Throckmorton, then senator and later governor.

### **WILLIAM F. FITZHUGH** (1818-1883)

Soldier, Texas Ranger, and farmer, was born in Kentucky in 1818. In 1845 he moved to Texas with his parents and settled just south of the site of present Melissa, Texas. He married Mary Rattan and received a 640-acre headright. During the Mexican War he served in the First Regiment, Texas Mounted Volunteers, commanded by Col. John Coffee (Jack) Hays. Fitzhugh returned to Collin County after the war and divided his time between farming and serving with the Texas Rangers on the Indian frontier. In March, 1862 he entered the Confederate service as first colonel of the Sixteenth Texas Cavalry, a regiment that served in the Trans-Mississippi Department. After the war Fitzhugh resumed farming at Melissa. On October 23, 1883, he was killed when he was thrown from a wagon. He was first buried in Forest Grove Cemetery but was subsequently reinterred in Fairview Cemetery in Denison. He was survived by seven children.

Lucas pioneers George Fitzhugh, Robert Fitzhugh and Gabriel Fitzhugh were all 3 sons of William and Mary Fitzhugh.

#### THE FITZHUGH BROTHERS

The three Fitzhugh brothers, George, Gabriel, and Solomon, arrived at the Forest Grove area and settled on large tracts as early as 1844. Besides farming, the East Fork of the Trinity River afforded them a perfect place to erect a grist mill that was used by all settlers of the area. This mill was built near Wilson's Creek and it was near a spring called Fitzhugh's Spring. Before the mill was built the families had to make the long road to Bonham on horseback to have their grain ground into meal.

Solomon Fitzhugh lived out his life in Forest Grove. All of the children of these early settlers married other children of early settlers, so that most of the first settlers are related by marriage.

#### **Indian Problems 1842**

Around Christmas of 1842 Wesley Clemmons, Collin County settler, and a man named Whistler were clearing land around Honey Creek for farming. The Indians attacked. The men ran to their house for their guns. They were killed before they got there. One of the wives and the wife of Sam Young held the Indians at bay from the house until nightfall when they escaped. The other wife was at the creek at the time of the attack. She hid in the water using a reed to breath until she thought she was safe. The women ran toward the Throckmorton settlement for safety. Sam Young was in Bonham at the time of the attack getting supplies.

#### **Indian Problems 1843**

In the fall of 1843 Jeremiah Muncey and his family were massacred by Indians at their home in north Plano between Plano and Jupiter Roads on the south bank of Rowlett Creek. The Indians had camped upstream the night before. As they proceeded down Rowlett Creek, they came upon two young boys hunting. The Rice boy was killed and the Searcy boy escaped. The Indians continued down the creek to the Muncey place. The Muncey home was a lean-to that they were using while they constructed their home. Jeremiah Muncey, his wife, a three-year-old Child, and neighbor McBain Jameson were all killed. Two of Muncey's boys were taken by the Indians and never seen again. The site of the massacre is marked, as well as the spot where the Munceys were buried.

# FITZHUGH SPRING FITZHUGH SAW MILL AND THE FITZHUGH GRIST MILL

Robert Fitzhugh's headright was 490 acres northeast of the present intersection of Stacy Rd. and Country Club (FM1378). To the east of his land was Calvin Boles league.

In 1853, he bought the near east 160 acres from Boles for 50 cents an acre. Sometime in the mid-1850's John, William and Robert Fitzhugh built mills at this site near the large spring.


In 1858 John and William Fitzhugh sold their interest in the mill to Robert. According to tax records Robert owned a thresher in 1853. This could have been the steam engine to power the mills.

The 1870 Manufacturers Census shows the size of the operation of Fitzhugh's gristmill. In the year ending June 1870, the mill had ground 3,300 bushels of corn meal, value at \$2,200, and 65,000 pounds of flour, valued at \$4,800. Fitzhugh's Mill was a thriving industry in its day.

The mill fell into disuse after Robert died in 1872.

During that time the railroad came to the county and larger mills were built in larger towns.





### Winningkoff Texas


In 1884, A.J. Winningkoff, who owned 204 acres of the Calvin Boles league, "in consideration of the imperative public want of a school and church building in the Winningkoff School Community" gave two acres to the county. The Winningkoff school house was built for the large numbers of children in this farming community.

A.J. Winningkoff was listed on the 1880 census as a barber in McKinney. He was born in Louisiana of parents from Prussia. His wife, Lizza, was born in England and they had 4 daughters.

### Winningkoff Texas

In 1893 the Methodists started meeting in the schoolhouse. By 1895, Dr. Ellsworth S. Blythe gave an acre of land on the northwest corner of the school ground for a church. He was the physician for the community. A 30ft by 50ft building was built and became known as the Blythe Chapel Methodist Church.




