CITIZENS ON PATROL PROGRAM BEING CONSIDERED IN LUCAS

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Breast cancer is a description that refers to a family of cancers that can occur in any part of the breast tissue. The disease is caused when malignant cells have formed in the tissues of the breast. When the DNA of these cells has become damaged the cells divide and grow in an uncontrollable way and form a lump called a tumor.

Breast cancer is the second most common cancer, and is the most common cancer in women. The United States has the highest incidence rate of women's breast cancer in the world. Breast cancer can also occur in males as the breast tissue is composed of identical tissue but is 100 times less common. Survival rates in men are the same as in women suffering from breast cancer. One in nine women will develop breast cancer during their life.

Surprisingly, breast cancer has been known for over 3,500 years. In some forms, it has been treatable for around 130 years, mainly through mastectomies and removal of lymph nodes. Today's surgical advances have reduced the need for such radical surgeries in many cases.

Current tests include mammogram, ultrasound, needle aspiration, needle biopsy and excision biopsy. The rate of survival is very high with today's early detection methods.

On October 25, 2008 Susan G. Komen for the Cure celebrates the 25th anniversary of the Komen Race for the Cure, the largest series of 5K runs/fitness walks in the world, with well over 1 million participants since 2005. Komen Race for the Cure events are scheduled in cities across the country.

Please encourage your loved ones to have a check-up. Believe us, there is nothing more devastating than to hear your doctor say, "You have breast cancer". However, with the support of our doctors, family, and friends, we are "BREAST CANCER SURVIVORS".

SEPT. CITY COUNCIL REPORT

Sept. 4 Regular City Council Meeting

- Approved minutes from July 23rd, July 24th, August 7th, August 15th, and August 21st meetings.
- Approved ordinance annexing 803 Amblewood (located in Claremont Springs subdivision.)
- Agreed to new fiscal year tax rate of .34177.
- Agreed to adopt Budget for Fiscal Year beginning 10-1-2008.
- Received presentation by Weather Service official and certificate and road signs that Lucas meets or exceeds "Storm Ready City" requirements.
- LVFD presented with \$1250. check from Huntwick HOA in appreciation for services to the neighborhood.

Sept.16 Special City Council Meeting

 Approved Resolution #R-2008-09-00318 reconfirming decision to deny petition for creation of the water control and improvement district #3 consisting of approx. 592.744 acres of land within City of Lucas extraterritorial jurisdiction.

Sept. 18 City Council Workshop Meeting

- Final approval of Ordinance #2008-09-00629 adopting Budget for Fiscal Year of 10/1/08-09.
- Final approval of **Ordinance # 2008-09-00628** adopting tax In the next few months ahead, there will be more work on rate of .374177 per \$100 valuation of property for fiscal tax year of 10/1/08-09. HELP...HOW DO I GET OUT OF TOWN!

Interim City Manager Stacy Caudell recently contacted the Engineering Department of the City of Allen for an update on the status of the roadwork being done on Stacy Road. As Stacy Road is one of the three major access roads to Lucas, the construction has had an impact on our residents, particularly those who live in the northern area of town. Per a representative of Allen, extensive work at the Stacy and US 75 intersection has caused inevitable delays to the construction on Stacy Road. It was necessary to connect the new pavement section to the hwy. frontage road, replace the old signal with a temporary span-wire signal, and construct two northbound right-turn only lanes.

Even though lane closures are restricted to off-peak hours (9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.) delays are unavoidable. Unfortunately, it is not anticipated that the congestion will be alleviated any time soon on Stacy. It will likely continue until traffic can be switched to utilize the new lanes. As of Sept. 25th, this was anticipated to take an additional two to four weeks. At that time, two lanes will then be open in each direction until the median improvements are completed. When construction is finished, there will be three lanes in each direction.

In the next few months ahead, there will be more work on the US 75 frontage road, which will impact the frontage road fluidity as well. This work will include a ramp reversal project for northbound US 75 at Stacy, switching the locations of the on and off ramps. It will also involve intersection improvements at Stacy and US 75, as a lane will be added under the bridge as well as added lanes to the southbound approach to the intersection.

Work at the SH 5 (Greenville Ave.) intersection will continue for the foreseeable future, as TxDOT continues their work of
