PUBLIC WORKS

The McGarity Water Tower passed all tests and went online in early May. Please monitor your sprinkler systems. Due to increased water pressure, you may need to make adjustments, such as reduced watering time or coverage spread.

The new road crew has successfully patched Blondy Jhune Road and is now working on other areas of the City. Please exercise caution when driving by road repair operations.

Clean-up of the Public Works facility on West Lucas Road is nearly complete. All that remains to be done is the installation of some shrubbery screening.

DO YOU NEED A BUILDING PERMIT?

Building permits are needed for add-ons to structures, including existing homes, barns, & accessory buildings. Remodeling jobs also need permits in certain cases. For example, when the electrical or plumbing system is being updated or added, a permit may be re- 🥌

quired. When in doubt, please call the building inspection department and ask for specifics. Inspections are performed by the City as a way to help insure the health and safety of our community. When structures are built using current, accepted codes, we all are safer.

NEW WATER RATES

On May 2nd, the City Council approved new water rates which will go into effect with your July water usage. The rates are lower for those using less than 20,000 gallons per month, and higher for those using more. The primary goals of the new rates are to reduce the water bill for most of our citizens and to encourage water conservation.

The complete breakdown of rates split into 1,000 gallon increments is available on the city's website in the Public Works & Utilities section. Here is a subset of the rate changes:

NEW SUBSCRIPTION RECYCLING PROGRAM FOR LUCAS RESIDENTS



Barnes Waste Disposal Service is now offering a voluntary, bi-monthly, subscription-based recycling program for Lucas residents. If interested, all you need to do to participate

is complete the service card you will have received in the mail or call them at 972-396-1139.

Fees:

- \$2.86 per month (\$17.16 billed semi-annually by Barnes if you supply your own clear or translucent bags.
- \$4.40 per month (\$26.40 billed semi-annually by Barnes) if Barnes supplies you with 1 box of 25 blue bags quarterly.
- With either program, additional boxes of bags may be purchased for \$4.00 each.

Schedule:

Pick-ups are the first and third Fridays of each month. Please have bags out at the curb by 7:00 AM. For the remainder of the year, the dates are June 3 & 17, July 1 & 15, August 5 & 19, September 2 & 16, October 7 & 21, November 4t& 18, December 2 & 16.

Collection Limitations:

Place separate or mixed contents in "Blue" recycling bags or clear plastic bags <u>ONLY</u>. No contaminated or "wet" recyclables will be collected. Black or opaque bags will be taken to the landfill. No single bag heavier than 35 lbs. will be collected.

Acceptable Items:

Corrugated cardboard; Moving boxes; Box board, chip board; Junk mail; Magazines; Telephone books; Newspapers; Paperback books; Office/white paper; Aluminum containers/cans, Glass containers/bottles; Tin/steel containers/cans, Plastic bottles/jugs/jars.

Unacceptable Items:

Plastic bags, including grocery bags; Carbon/thermal paper; Yard waste; Food waste; Batteries of any kind; Car tires; Styrofoam; Bubble wrap; Bathroom waste; Wooden pallets; Waxed/milk containers; Plastic pesticide bottles; Medical waste.

Remember: it only takes a few contaminants to have an entire load declared unfit for recycling, especially when it comes to bathroom and kitchen waste.
