

Food served all afternoon beginning at 2:00PM


Trunk or Treat 6:00-7:00 PM

When Disaster Strikes, Seconds Count

When an emergency occurs, responders are called to assist. It is often necessary to try to make contact with a loved one, or family member. For several reasons, obviously we would all want to know immediately if one of our loved ones were experiencing an emergency situation, by contacting a family member or loved one the emergency responder can alert them to what is occurring and what actions are being taken. This is also valuable to emergency personnel, especially during medical emergencies, because loved ones can often alert the responders to any preexisting medical conditions or prescribed medications.

Unfortunately it is not always easy for emergency crews to determine who to contact in an emergency situation. Cellular phones have become increasingly prevalent in the U.S. and today most individuals, young and old, carry a cell phone with them on a daily basis. Even so, responders often have difficulty determining which phone number in our patient's contact list is the one we should be calling and we lose valuable time scrolling through their contact list. Sometimes children program their parents' phone numbers as "mom" or "dad", but older individuals do not always have these in their phones. Siblings or spouses are often programmed under their first name making it impossible to distinguish them from any other name on the list.

Recognizing that this was a reoccurring problem, a paramedic from England developed the concept of ICE, or In Case of Emergency. He promoted the idea of programming emergency contact information into cell phones by simply programming the number under the name ICE. By doing this, emergency responders can quickly scroll to the "I" section in your cell phone's contact list and immediately call the number labeled ICE knowing that they would be talking to the appropriate person. You can also identify your emergency contact by name by simply placing the name after the ICE acronym. For example, if you wanted your brother to be contacted you would label it as "ICE-brother", or "ICE-mom", or "ICE-dad". If your spouse is named Bob, you could program the number under the name "ICE-bob" or "ICE-husband". This simple method saves emergency personnel valuable time simply by knowing where to look for your emergency contact info.

The Lucas Fire Department encourages the citizens of Lucas to take a moment to program an ICE contact into their cell phone, preferably with two or three different contact numbers in the event that we cannot get through to the first one that is tried.

We also encourage parents to program several ICE contacts into their children's cell phone in the event that the child experiences an emergency so that we can rapidly contact you.



Outdoor Burning

Though somewhat controversial, pile burning is probably the most environmentally friendly way to dispose of the excess yard waste material such as tree limbs, bushes, and brush. The cut material is piled by hand in locations that minimize the scorching of trees and surrounding vegetation. Once the pile is constructed, a small amount of flammable fluid is added, the fire is lit, and the pile is burned. The amount fuel to light the fire is minuscule in comparison to the amount expended in hauling the material to a disposal location to then be chipped for mulch or composting.

Consider alternatives to burning. Some types of debris, such as leaves, grass and stubble may be of more value if they are not burned. Composting can yield valuable organic matter that can be used to enrich the soil, while helping extend the useful life of landfills. Household trash such as glass, paper, plastic, and metal that can't be composted can be hauled away to a recycling center or landfill.

When conducting an outdoor burn, it is **VERY IMPORTANT** to follow local fire and air quality regulations! Fire service in Lucas is provided by an all-volunteer fire department, and burn days for the City of Lucas correspond with Collin County burn days. Before you light up you are required to do the following:

- * Call the **Burn Day Information** number first to determine if outdoor burning is allowed that day.
- * If it is NOT an authorized burn day, you may not proceed with your burn.
- * If it is an authorized burn day, call **Plano Dispatch** and inform them that you are about to conduct an outdoor burn. You will need to provide your name, address/location, and the intended time of the burn.


