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OTHER CITY ROADWAY PROJECTS – September 2016

COUNTRY CLUB ROAD/W LUCAS ROAD INTERSECTION PROJECT – This was completed in the fall of 2013. There is approximately \$65,000 in the intersection project that must be returned to the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) unless additional work is done at the intersection. Staff is reviewing the possibility of removing the metal beam guard fence on the northwest corner and improving the drainage to use the last of the funds. (07/2016)

WEST LUCAS ROAD WIDENING – BW2 Engineers, Inc. has submitted 30% plans to staff. BW2 has completed the Environmental Assessment and has submitted it for a second review by the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG). The funding limits for this project are from Angel Parkway to Country Club Road. On June 2, 2016, the City Council approved shortening the construction limits. The new limits are from Ingram Lane to Country Club Road. The Lucas Mayor and City of Parker Mayor plan to meet to discuss funding assistance from the City of Parker for portions of the roadway in Parker. In round numbers, the \$1.5 million West Lucas Road Project is being funded by the following: NCTCOG (\$1,200,000), Collin County (\$250,000), and City of Lucas impact fees paid by developers (\$50,000). City taxes are not being used to fund this project. The construction of the three-lane, asphalt roadway is anticipated for late of 2016 and should last eight months. The current design is for West Lucas Road to have one lane in each direction with a continuous left-turn lane in the middle from Country Club Road to 700 west of Ingram Lane. The City of Lucas 2014 Thoroughfare Plan contemplates Lucas Road being a four-lane, undivided roadway. (09/2016)
