


This parcel has an approved Development Agreement with an approved Concept Plan that gives consideration to the zoning. This plan adheres to the approved layout.



Road. This is the 2nd Public Hearing, the 1st Public Hearing was held on September 12, 2013 at the Planning & Zoning Commission Meeting]

On August 1st the City Council approved a Development Agreement for this property to include additional right-of-way dedication and improvements to the 90° turns on Forest Grove (raised medians, greater radii). The agreement required upgrading the waterline and remediating drainage issues on Forest Grove. The developer would be reimbursed through Impact Fee credits, applied against the actual improvement costs only. The developer is responsible for cost averages of improvements.



The current zoning allows approximately 5-7 acres of 1 acre lot minimums. The remaining lots, approximately 46-48 acres, will be a minimum of 2 acres in size. Overall the 27 lots would be an average of 1.75 acres in size; the minimum being 1.5 acres and maximum of 2.67 acres as called out in the Development Agreement.

Homes built in the development will be approximately 3,500-5,700 square feet and proposed price range will be \$500,000 - \$800,000.



Harry Purdom has made application for a preliminary plat for an eight (8) lot subdivision located on 18.0007 acres at the intersection of Winningkoff and E. Lucas Roads.

The property is currently zoned R-2. There are some existing homes and barns to be removed, one is dilapidated. This is a low impact development designed to conserve trees. Only one point of access is required being that the development is less than ten (10) lots. The water main is looped from Winningkoff Road to Lost Valley, with a fire hydrant on Lost Valley.




10) Discuss and Consider the schematic design of the Lucas Fire Station Expansion Project and authorize Staff to move forward into the design phase of the project. [City Manager]

The architect, Doug Edney, came forward to discuss the changes to the project with the Mayor and City Council.





11)Discuss and Consider the approval of **Ordinance # 2013-10-00772** of the City Council of the City of Lucas, Collin County, Texas, amending the Lucas Code of Ordinances by amending Chapter 14, titled "Zoning", by amending Article 14.03 titled "Districts" by amending Division 7 titled "CB Commercial Business District" by amending Section 14.03.354 titled "Special District Requirements" by amending requirement for Special Districts; providing a repealing clause; providing a severability clause; providing a savings clause; providing a penalty of fine not to exceed the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) for each offense; and providing for an effective date. **[Hilbourn]**

The code currently requires a public hearing. Section 14.03.354 Subsection (3) the site plan may only be approved following a public hearing before the Planning & Zoning Commission and the City Council. State Law says that site plans are an administrative approval. Administrative approval means that if it meets the city's requirements by law it must be approved. The public hearing gives the citizens a false sense that they have input whether or not the site plan is approved. Staff recommends that site plans continue to be approved by the Planning & Zoning Commission and City Council, not necessary to be presented as a public hearing.
