This change was made due to the chlorine residuals in the water line and once a week watering will continue until October. In October, North Texas Municipal Water District will reevaluate this.

She talked about how traumatic it is to need and call an ambulance. "The first responders went above and beyond to assure me I was in good and capable hands. AGREEMENT FOR EMS MEDICAL CONTROL

This Agreement for EMS Medical Control (this "Agreement") is entered as of September 05, 2013 (the "Effective Date"), by and between Lucas Fire and Rescue, Lucas, Texas ("Client"), and Questcare Medical Services, P.A. ("Questcare") (Client and Questcare being referred to collectively as the "parties").

WHEREAS, Client desires to obtain medical supervision of its emergency medical service ("EMS") activities in the form of a Medical Director, as required by Texas law, and oversight of Client's education of its emergency medical technicians and paramedics (the "Services"); and

WHEREAS, Questcare desires to provide the Services upon the terms and conditions set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants made herein, Client and Questcare agree as follows:

- 1. **Medical Director.** Questcare shall appoint a physician employed by or under contract with Questcare to serve as medical director for Client (the "Medical Director"). The Medical Director may appoint other physician employees or contractors of Questcare to conduct all or part of the activities required of the Medical Director under this Agreement. As of the Effective Date, the Medical Director will be Scott Corcoran, MD. Questcare will have the right, however, to appoint any other physician as the Medical Director in place of Dr. Corcoran in the event Dr. Corcoran leaves Questcare's employment or otherwise ceases to serve as Medical Director. Client also consents to performance of assistant medical director services by Mark Gamber, DO, and William T. Hartman, DO. The physician(s) at any time serving as the Medical Director must be reasonably acceptable to Client and must meet the following requirements:
 - a. Maintain a current license to practice medicine in Texas;
 - b. Maintain current board certification in Emergency Medicine with the American Board of Emergency Medicine, the American Board of Medical Specialties, the American Osteopathic Association, or the American Association of Physician Specialists;
 - c. Provide current evidence of credentials, curriculum vitae, and continuing education activities;
 - d. Provide documentation of current medical malpractice insurance with specific coverage for emergency medical services activities;
 - e. Provide current DEA license for controlled medications; and
 - f. Maintain active involvement in the provision of emergency medical services in the North Texas vicinity.
- 2. **Questcare's Obligations.** In addition to complying with Section 1, Questcare, through the Medical Director and/or his assistants, shall provide the Services, which will consist of the following services:

- a. Provide on-line medical control for Client's emergency medical technicians, paramedics, and related staff ("Client Staff") through a base station located at the emergency department at The Medical Center of McKinney (the "Hospital"). As set forth in Section 14, this Agreement is expressly subject to and conditioned upon Questcare's ability to secure the Hospital's consent to the operation of the base station at the Hospital. This on-line control will include all on-line control functions and duties that Texas law requires an EMS medical director to provide. Client will pay the cost of all equipment Questcare determines is required for the operation of the base station, and such payment, at such time or times as Questcare may reasonably specify, shall be a condition to Questcare's obligations under this Agreement.
- b. Provide off-line medical control, which will include all off-line control functions and duties that Texas law requires an EMS medical director to provide.
- c. Supervise the continuing education program Client provides for Client Staff and advise Client about what changes, if any, in such education program are necessary from time to time to cause the program to be sufficient to permit all Client Staff to meet all state licensing, certification, or other requirements for continuing education.
- 3. **Compensation.** For performing the Services, Client shall pay Questcare the following compensation:
 - a. \$150.00 per hour of services document by the Medical Director or an assistant medical director, payable within 15 days after the date of Questcare's invoice for the services. Beginning on the Effective Date, Questcare will provide up to three hours of service per month. Beginning October 1, 2013, Questcare will provide up to six hours of service per month. Beginning when Client places a second ambulance into service, Questcare will perform up to 12 hours of service per month; and
 - b. \$50.00 annually, payable on or before the Effective Date and each anniversary of the Effective Date, to cover the cost of Questcare's medical malpractice insurance coverage with respect to this Agreement.

4. Term; Termination.

- a. **Term.** The term of this Agreement will commence at 12:01 a.m. on the Effective Date and continue through 12:00 a.m. one year thereafter, subject to subsection b below. After such term, this Agreement will automatically renew for additional consecutive one-year periods, unless either party gives the other party at least 30 days' notice of nonrenewal prior to the expiration of either the original term or any such additional term; provided that an automatic renewal will not occur unless the amount specified in Section 3.b has been paid prior to commencement of the renewal term.
- b. **Termination.** Notwithstanding Section 4.a above, either party may terminate this Agreement by giving the other party 30 days' written notice of termination. The compensation provided in Section 3.a (but not the amount described in Section 3.b) will be prorated accordingly in the event of such a termination.
- 5. **Insurance.** Questcare shall maintain in effect at all times during the term of this Agreement medical professional liability insurance with coverage limits that are standard for the type of services in question in the applicable geographic area. Such insurance shall expressly cover the activities of the Medical Director in his role as Medical Director.

- 6. **Independent Contractors.** The parties' relationship to each other at all times and for all purposes under this Agreement shall be that of independent contractors. Neither party will be considered to be an agent or employee of the other party.
- No Waiver. The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement will not constitute a waiver by it of that or any other provision.
- Default by Questcare. Notwithstanding Section 4, Client may terminate this Agreement immediately by giving Ouestcare written notice of termination if Questcare defaults in the performance of the Services and fails to cure the default within 30 days following its receipt of written notice from Client specifying the nature of the default.
- THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE GOVERNED BY AND Governing Law. CONSTRUED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS, OTHER THAN ITS RULES CONCERNING CONFLICTS OF LAW.
- Notices. Any notice required or permitted by this Agreement will be sufficient if delivered by certified mail, return receipt requested, or by hand-delivery to the party intended to receive same at the following address for such party or at such other address as such party may hereafter provide in accordance with this section:

- Severability. If any provision of this Agreement is declared by a court of competent 11. jurisdiction to be illegal or invalid, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement, and the parties' respective rights and obligations shall be construed and enforced as if the Agreement did not contain the provision declared to be illegal or invalid.
- No Assignment. Neither party may assign or transfer its rights or obligations under this 12. Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Questcare may not enter any subcontracts for the performance of the Services without Client's prior written consent, except that Questcare may subcontract its obligations to the Medical Director.
- No Influence Upon Referrals. It is not the intention of either party to this Agreement that any remuneration, benefit, or privilege provided for under this Agreement influence or in any way be based upon the referral or recommended referral by either party of patients to the other party or its affiliated providers, if any, or the purchasing, leasing, or ordering of any services other than the specific services described in this Agreement. Any payments or other consideration specified in this Agreement are consistent with what the parties reasonably believe to be the fair market value of the services provided in consideration of such payments or other consideration.
- Subject to Hospital Approval. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, 14. the effectiveness of this Agreement is dependent upon the parties' receipt of approval by the Hospital of the use of the Hospital's emergency department as the location for the base station referred to in Section 2.a. In the absence of such approval, this Agreement shall not take effect.

15. **Miscellaneous.** This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous written or verbal agreements regarding such subject matter. This Agreement may be amended only by a written instrument signed by both of the parties. This Agreement shall bind and shall inure to the benefit of the parties' respective successors and permitted assigns. Each party represents that the individual signing this Agreement on its behalf is the duly-authorized representative of such party with the power to bind the party to this Agreement.

This Interlocal Cooperation Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the City of Lucas, Texas, ("City") and the Seis Lagos Utility District ("Seis Lagos"), (each a "Party" and collectively the "Parties"), acting by and through their authorized officers.

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the Parties previously entered into that certain Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for Emergency Services dated November 16, 2009 (the "Agreement");

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into a new Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for the purposes of adding emergency medical services to include patient transport to the "Emergency Services" provided by the City and to provide for an annual compensation rate for Emergency Services; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code provides authorization for local governments to contract with one another to provide for Emergency Services; and

WHEREAS, the Parties further desire to secure the benefits of the protection of life and property from fire or explosion by entering into this Agreement for establishing investigative resources to conduct the cause and origin investigation of fires and explosions to perform any latent criminal investigations resulting from said fires or explosions; and

WHEREAS, each Party shall make the payments required under this Agreement from current available revenue;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration the foregoing and on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, and for other valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

Article I Firefighting and Emergency Services

- 1.1 Upon the request of Seis Lagos or upon receipt of a call for Emergency Services within the scope of services to be provided hereunder, City shall, based upon availability, dispatch firefighting, emergency medical service, patient transport, disaster support, and related equipment and personnel ("Emergency Services") to any point designated within the territorial limits of Seis Lagos. The details as to the amounts and types of assistance to be dispatched and/or employed, methods of dispatching and communications, personnel training and operations procedures shall be within the discretion of the Fire Chief of the City of Lucas.
- 1.2 The dispatch of equipment and personnel pursuant to this Agreement is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) City shall extend its 911 emergency call and dispatch system to Seis Lagos;
- (b) City will provide the same level and quality of service in performing the terms of this Agreement as are provided in the corporate boundaries of the City. City shall take all actions necessary to include Seis Lagos in its emergency service area/district as necessary for Seis Lagos to receive the benefit of participation by the City in Collin County mutual aid or similar agreements. Nothing contained in this Agreement, however, shall require City to construct new facilities, purchase new equipment or retain additional personnel where, in the discretion of the Fire Chief and/or City Manager sufficient equipment, personnel and facilities exist or are available to accommodate appropriate levels of readiness and protection. City does not guaranty the effectiveness or quality of service and expressly disclaims any warranties, implied or otherwise, regarding effectiveness or quality; and
- (c) Seis Lagos agrees to provide City with a copy of the latest official map of Seis Lagos following execution of, and for the duration of, this Agreement.

Article II Term and Termination

- 2.1 This Agreement shall begin on the last date all Parties have executed this Agreement ("Effective Date") and shall continue until September 30, 2015. This Agreement shall automatically renew on October 1 of each year for additional one (1) year terms unless otherwise terminated by either Party as provided herein.
- 2.2 Either Party may terminate this Agreement by giving the other Party sixty (60) days advance written notice of its intent to terminate.
- 2.3 If Seis Lagos fails to make a quarterly payment of an Annual Contract Amount due hereunder, City may terminate this Agreement after providing written notice to Seis Lagos that payment has not been received; and, if Seis Lagos fails to tender payment within thirty (30) days of receipt of said notice, the City shall send written notice that the Agreement has been terminated if payment is not received during the thirty (30) day notice period.

Article III Costs for Services

- 3.1 Seis Lagos agrees to pay City an annual contract amount for Emergency Services based upon a fiscal year with an October 1 state date in the amount of One Hundred Seventy-Five thousand Dollars (\$175,000.00).
 - (a) The Annual Contract Amount shall be paid in four equal quarterly payments due on or before the fifteenth (15th) day of each quarter, as follows:
 - 1. October 15;

- 2. January 15;
- 3. April 15; and,
- 4. July 15.
- (b) City agrees to furnish Seis Lagos with the Annual Contract Amount for the next annual period to start October 1, not later than the immediately preceding September 1.
- (c) If this Agreement is terminated by either Party as provided herein, the Annual Contract Amount to be paid by Seis Lagos during the then current year shall be pro-rated for that portion of the year in which services under this Agreement were provided; and, following the termination date, Seis Lagos shall pay to City in full any Amortized Payments that carried forward within ninety (90) days following the termination date.
- (d) City shall notify Seis Lagos in writing of any upcoming increase in an Adjusted Annual Fire Department Budget that is attributable to adding paid staff and/or firefighters to the Fire Department or constructing another fire station at least nine (9) months prior to the start of the fiscal year that City anticipates such cost increases going into effect. Such notification is not required to contain exact cost figures, but must contain a reasonable and good faith estimate of the anticipated increase in the future Adjusted Annual Fire Department Budget so that Seis Lagos can estimate the amount of future Annual Contract Amounts.

Article IV Independent Contractor

The Parties intend that City, in performing services specified in this Agreement, shall act as an independent contractor of Seis Lagos and City shall have control of its work and the manner in which it is to be performed. No employee, agent or representative of City shall be deemed to be an employee, agent, or representative of Seis Lagos.

Article V Sovereign Immunity

The Parties hereto are political subdivisions of the State of Texas, each of which has official and sovereign immunity. Nothing contained within this Agreement shall in any way be regarded or interpreted as a waiver of such immunity nor shall any provisions of this Agreement be deemed to create any rights to any person not a signatory hereto.

Article VI Liability

6.1 City has and will maintain in full force and effect policies of public liability insurance covering all Parties in the event of loss, damage or injury, to persons or property which may arise from the provision of service under this Agreement. The Parties agree that they shall

be responsible for civil liabilities in the manner provided by Section 791.006(a) of the Texas Interlocal Cooperation Act, as it existed on October 1, 2014. The provisions of this paragraph are solely for the benefit of the Parties hereto and are not intended to create or grant any rights, controlled or otherwise, to any third person or entity. The provisions of this paragraph shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

6.2 In the event a person performing duties pursuant to this Agreement shall be cited as a defendant to any state or federal civil lawsuit arising out of his or her official acts while performing duties pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, such person shall be entitled to the same benefits and/or defenses that are provided by the Party's insurance carrier that he or she would be entitled to receive and/or assert had such civil action arisen out of an official act within the scope of his or her employment as an employee of the Party.

Article VII Miscellaneous

- 7.1 <u>Assignment and Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement may not be assigned by any Party hereto without the prior written consent of the other Party. No assignment, delegation of duties or subcontract under this Agreement shall be effective without the prior written consent of the other Party hereto. This Agreement is the entire agreement of the Parties regarding the subject matter stated herein. There is no other collateral or oral agreement among the Parties that in any way relates to the subject matter of this Agreement.
- 7.2 <u>Governing Law.</u> The validity of this Agreement and any of its terms and provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the Parties, shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas; and exclusive venue for any action arising as a result of this Agreement shall be in a state court of proper jurisdiction in Collin County, Texas.
- 7.3 <u>Severability</u>. In the event that any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect the other provisions, and this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provisions had never been contained in this Agreement.
- 7.4 <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement may be amended only by the mutual written agreement of the Parties.
- 7.5 <u>Current Revenues</u>. All costs or expenses incurred by any Party as a result of this Agreement shall be paid from the current revenues available to the Party.
- 7.6 <u>Recitals and Authority to Sign</u>. The recitals of this Agreement are incorporated herein. The signatories to this Agreement each represent and warrant they have been granted the requisite authority, by resolution, ordinance, order or other proper formal action of the governing body of each, to execute this agreement and bind the public entity on whose behalf he/she signs.

7.7 <u>Notice</u>. Any notice permitted or required to be sent under this Agreement must be in writing and may be served by depositing same in the United States Mail, addressed to the Party to be notified, postage pre-paid and registered or certified with return receipt requested, or by delivering the same in person to such Party via a hand-delivery service, Federal Express or any courier service that provides a return receipt showing the date of actual delivery of same to the addressee thereof. Notice given in accordance herewith shall be effective upon receipt at the address of the addressee. For purposes of notice, the addresses of the Parties shall be as follows:

- 7.8 <u>Representations</u>. Each signatory represents this Agreement has been read by the Party for which this Agreement is executed and that such Party has had an opportunity to confer with its legal counsel.
- 7.9 <u>Drafting Provisions</u>. This Agreement shall be deemed drafted equally by all Parties hereto. The language of all parts of this Agreement shall be construed as a whole according to its fair meaning, and any presumption or principle that the language herein is to be construed against any Party shall not apply. Headings in this Agreement are for the convenience of the Parties and are not intended to be used in construing this document.
- 7.10 <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in a number of identical counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original for all purposes.

A vote under this subsection is in addition to, and separate from, the vote to adopt the budget or vote to set the tax rate as required by Chapter 26 of the Tax Code.

ORDINANCE # 2014-09-00793[Adoption of Budget for FY 2014-2015]

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LUCAS, TEXAS, ADOPTING THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2014 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2015; PROVIDING THAT EXPENDITURES FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR SHALL BE MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH SAID BUDGET; APPROPRIATING AND SETTING ASIDE THE NECESSARY FUNDS OUT OF THE GENERAL AND OTHER REVENUES FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND **OPERATION OF** THE **VARIOUS** AND **DEPARTMENTS FOR VARIOUS ACTIVITIES AND** IMPROVEMENTS OF THE CITY: PROVIDING A REPEALING CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, an annual budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2014, and ending September 30, 2015, has been duly created by the financial office of the City of Lucas, Texas, in accordance with Chapter 102.002 of the Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the financial office for the City of Lucas has filed the proposed budget in the office of the City Secretary and the proposed budget was made available for public inspection in accordance with Chapter 102.005 of the Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by the City in accordance with Chapter 102.006 of the local Government Code, following due publication of notice thereof, at which time all citizens and parties of interest were given the opportunity to be heard regarding the proposed budget; and

WHEREAS, after full and final consideration, it is the opinion of the Lucas City Council that the 2014-2015 fiscal year budget as hereinafter set forth should be adopted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LUCAS, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the proposed budget of the revenue and expenditures necessary for conducting the affairs of the City of Lucas, Texas for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2014, and ending September 30, 2015, as submitted to the City Council by the City Manager, attached hereto as Exhibit "A", be and the same is hereby adopted as the budget of the City of Lucas for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2014 and ending September 30, 2015.

- **Section 2.** That the expenditures during the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2014, and ending September 30, 2015, shall be made in accordance with the budget approved by this ordinance unless otherwise authorized by a duly enacted ordinance of the City of Lucas, Texas.
- **Section 3.** That all budget amendments and transfers of appropriations budgeted from one account or activity to another within any individual activity for the fiscal year 2013-2014 are hereby ratified, and the budget approval for fiscal year 2013–2014, heretofore enacted by the City Council, be and the same is hereby amended to the extent of such transfers and amendments for all purposes.
- **Section 4.** Upon approval of the budget the budget office shall file a true and certified copy thereof with the County Clerk of Collin County, Texas.
- **Section 5.** All ordinances of the City of Lucas, Texas, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are hereby, repealed; provided, however, that all other provisions of said ordinances not in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
- **Section 6.** Should any word, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this ordinance, be adjudged or held to be void or unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of said ordinance which shall remain in full force and effect.
- **Section 7.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage as the law in such cases provides.

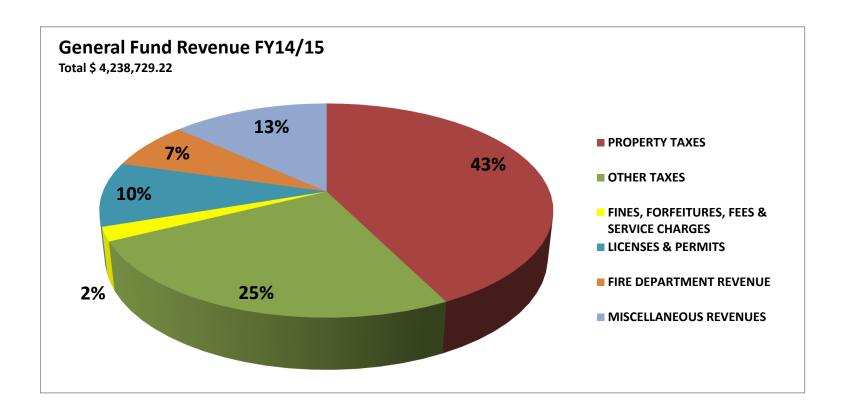

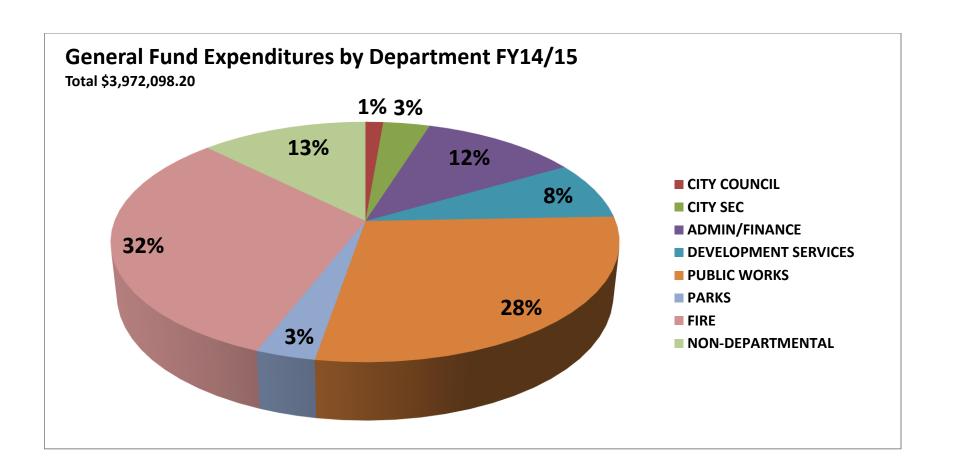

ORDINANCE # 2014-09-00794 [AD VALOREM TAX RATE FOR 2014]

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LUCAS, TEXAS, LEVYING AD VALOREM TAXES FOR THE TAX YEAR 2014 (FISCAL YEAR 2014-2015) AT A RATE OF \$0.320661 PER ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100) ASSESSED VALUATION ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF LUCAS AS OF JANUARY 1, 2014, TO PROVIDE REVENUE FOR THE PAYMENT OF CURRENT EXPENSES; PROVIDING FOR AN INTEREST AND SINKING FUND FOR ALL OUTSTANDING DEBT FOR THE CITY OF LUCAS; PROVIDING FOR DUE AND DELINQUENT DATES TOGETHER WITH PENALTIES AND INTEREST; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A REPEALING CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, following public notice duly posted and published in all things as required by law Texas Tax Code §26.052(c) regarding the meeting to be held regarding the adoption of the proposed tax rate for the City of Lucas for Tax Year 2014, submitted by the City Manager in accordance with provisions of state statutes and the City of Lucas Home Rule Charter, and

WHEREAS, the City Council, upon full consideration of the matter, is of the opinion that the tax rate hereinafter set forth is proper and should be approved and adopted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LUCAS, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1. There is hereby levied and shall be assessed for the tax year 2014 on all taxable property, real, personal and mixed, situated within the corporate limits of the City of Lucas, Texas, and not exempt by the Constitution of the State and valid State laws, a tax of \$0.320661 on each \$100 assessed valuation of taxable property apportioned and distributed as follows:

- (a) For the purpose of defraying the current expenditures of the municipal government of the City of Lucas, a tax of \$.233068 on each and every \$100 assessed value on all taxable property; and
- (b) For the purpose of creating a sinking fund to pay the interest and principal maturities of all outstanding debt of the City of Lucas, not otherwise provided for, a tax of \$.087593 on each \$100 assessed value of taxable property within the City of Lucas, and shall be applied to the payment of interest and maturities of all such outstanding debt of the City.

THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE.

THE TAX RATE WILL EFFECTIVELY BE RAISED BY 8.69 PERCENT AND WILL RAISE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS ON A \$100,000 HOME BY APPROXIMATELY (\$20.93).

- **Section 2.** All ad valorem taxes shall become due and payable on October 1, 2014, and all ad valorem taxes for the year shall become delinquent if not paid prior to February 1, 2015. There shall be no discount for payment of taxes prior to February 1, 2015. A delinquent tax shall incur all penalty and interest authorized by law, to wit:
 - (a) A penalty of six percent on the amount of the tax for the first calendar month it is delinquent, plus one percent for each additional month or portion of a month the tax remains unpaid prior to July 1 of the year in which it becomes delinquent.
 - (b) Provided, however, a tax delinquent on July 1, 2015, incurs a total penalty of twelve percent of the amount of delinquent tax without regard to the number of months the tax has been delinquent. A delinquent tax shall also accrue interest at the rate of one percent for each month or portion of a month the tax remains unpaid. Taxes for the year 2014 and taxes for all future years that become delinquent on or after February 1 but not later than May 1, that remain delinquent on July 1 of the year in which they become delinquent, incur an additional penalty in the amount of twenty percent (20%) of taxes, penalty and interest due, pursuant to Texas Property Tax Code Section 6.30 and 33.07, as amended. Taxes assessed against tangible personal property for the year 2014 and for all future years that become delinquent on or after February 1 of a year incur an additional penalty on the later of the date the personal property taxes become subject to the delinquent tax attorney's contract, or 60 days after the date the taxes become delinquent, such penalty to be in the amount of twenty percent (20%) of taxes, penalty and interest due, pursuant to Texas Property Tax Code Section 33.11. Taxes for the year 2014 and taxes for all future years that remain delinquent on or after June 1 under Texas Property Tax Code Sections 26.07(f), 26.15(e), 31.03, 31.031, 31.032 or 31.04 incur an additional penalty in the amount of twenty percent (20%) of taxes, penalty and interest due, pursuant to Texas Property Tax Code Section 6.30 and Section 33.08, as amended.
- **Section 3.** The City shall have available all the rights and remedies provided by law for the enforcement of the collection of taxes levied under this ordinance.
- **Section 4.** The tax roll as presented to the City Council, together with any supplements thereto, be and the same are hereby approved.
- **Section 5.** Should any word, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this ordinance, be adjudged or held to be void or unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of said ordinance which shall remain in full force and effect.

All ordinances of the City of Lucas, Texas, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are hereby, repealed; provided, however, that all other provisions of said ordinances not in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage, as the law and charter in such cases provide.

A RESOLUTION OF THE FIRE CONTROL, PREVENTION AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF LUCAS, TEXAS, ADOPTING THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2014 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2015; PROVIDING THAT EXPENDITURES FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR SHALL BE MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH SAID BUDGET; PROVIDING A REPEALING CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, an annual budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2014, and ending September 30, 2015, has been duly created by the financial office of the City of Lucas, Texas, on behalf of the Fire Control, Prevention and Emergency Medical Services District of the city of Lucas (the "District") in accordance with Chapter 344.203 of the Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lucas also serves in the capacity as the Board of Directors of the District; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by the Board of Directors of the District in accordance with Chapter 344.203 of the local Government Code, following due publication of notice thereof, at which time all citizens and parties of interest were given the opportunity to be heard regarding the proposed budget; and

WHEREAS, after full and final consideration, it is the opinion of the Board of Directors of the District that the 2014-2015 fiscal year budget as hereinafter set forth should be adopted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. That the proposed budget of the revenue and expenditures necessary for conducting the affairs of the District for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2014, and ending September 30, 2015, as submitted to the City Council by the Board of Directors, attached hereto as Exhibit "A", be and the same is hereby adopted as the budget of the District for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2014 and ending September 30, 2015.

SECTION 2. TESRS GOVERNMENT CODE PROCEDURES

Sec. 865.012. LOCAL BOARD. (a) A local board is composed of:

- (1) one trustee selected by the governing body of the political subdivision of which a participating department is a part;
- (2) three trustees who are active members representing a participating department chosen by a majority of the emergency services personnel in the department who are eligible to participate in the pension system; and
- (3) two trustees who are representatives of the political subdivision who are chosen by the other members of the local board.
- (b) Trustees of a local board serve staggered two-year terms. At the first meeting of a local board, the trustees shall draw lots to determine the length of the term to be served, with the terms of two trustees to be two years and the terms of two trustees to be one year. The first appointments of trustees appointed by other members of the local board are to be one trustee for a two-year term and one trustee for a one-year term.
- (c) A local board shall hold not fewer than four meetings a year under Chapter 551.
- (d) A vacancy on a local board is filled for the remainder of the unexpired term by the procedure by which the position was originally filled.
- (e) A local board shall elect a presiding officer from the trustees at its first meeting.
- (f) At any meeting of a local board, a vote by a majority of the trustees present is necessary for a decision by the trustees.
- (g) A trustee of a local board may not receive compensation for service as a trustee but may be reimbursed by the governing body of a participating department for actual and necessary expenses incurred in performing local board functions.

Sec. 865.014. LOCAL CONTRIBUTIONS. (a) Each governing body of a political subdivision of which a participating department is a part shall contribute for each member for each month of service beginning on the date that the member enters the pension system at a rate determined in accordance with Subsection (b) and may make additional contributions as determined by the political subdivision. If the participating department is located in more than one political subdivision, the governing bodies of the political subdivisions shall contribute equally for each member for each month of service.

- (b) The state board by rule shall determine the minimum, and may determine a maximum, contribution for each member of a participating department for each month of qualified service at a rate the state board determines necessary, after consultation with the actuary, to make the pension system actuarially sound.
- (c) Contributions required as provided by this section shall be paid at the times and in the manner that the state board prescribes by rule. Contributions required by this section shall be submitted by electronic funds transfer unless the executive director grants an exception based on the difficulty of a participating department's use of that payment method. Contributions that are not paid within the time required by the state board accrue interest at the most recent assumed actuarial rate of return on investments of the fund.

- (d) The state board may by rule require a monthly contribution from political subdivisions that do not participate in the pension system but whose employees or former employees are members or retirees of the pension system in an amount necessary to pay the expenses of administering benefits for those persons.
- (e) The attorney general may file suit to collect unpaid accrued interest. Interest recovered shall be deposited in the fund.

In a perfect world, we could survey eight other cities that are just like the City of Lucas for comparison. Unfortunately this is not a case. We are a unique community and the services provided by city staff are not comparable to most small communities in Texas. The City of Lucas has a combination fire department, outsourced law enforcement, a full-service water system, development of high-end housing and a rural setting in a metropolitan region which makes Lucas relatively unique when being compared to other small communities.

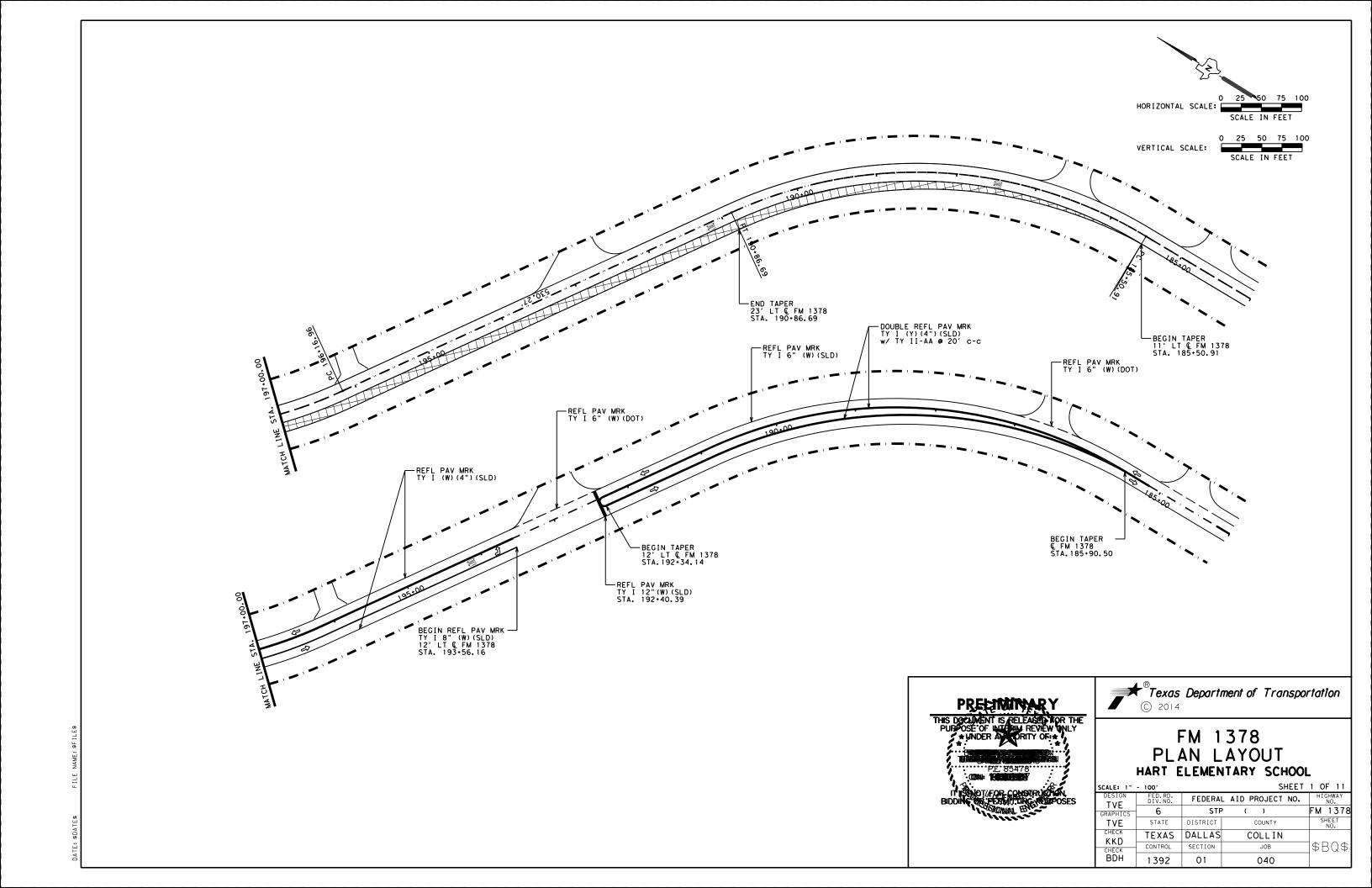

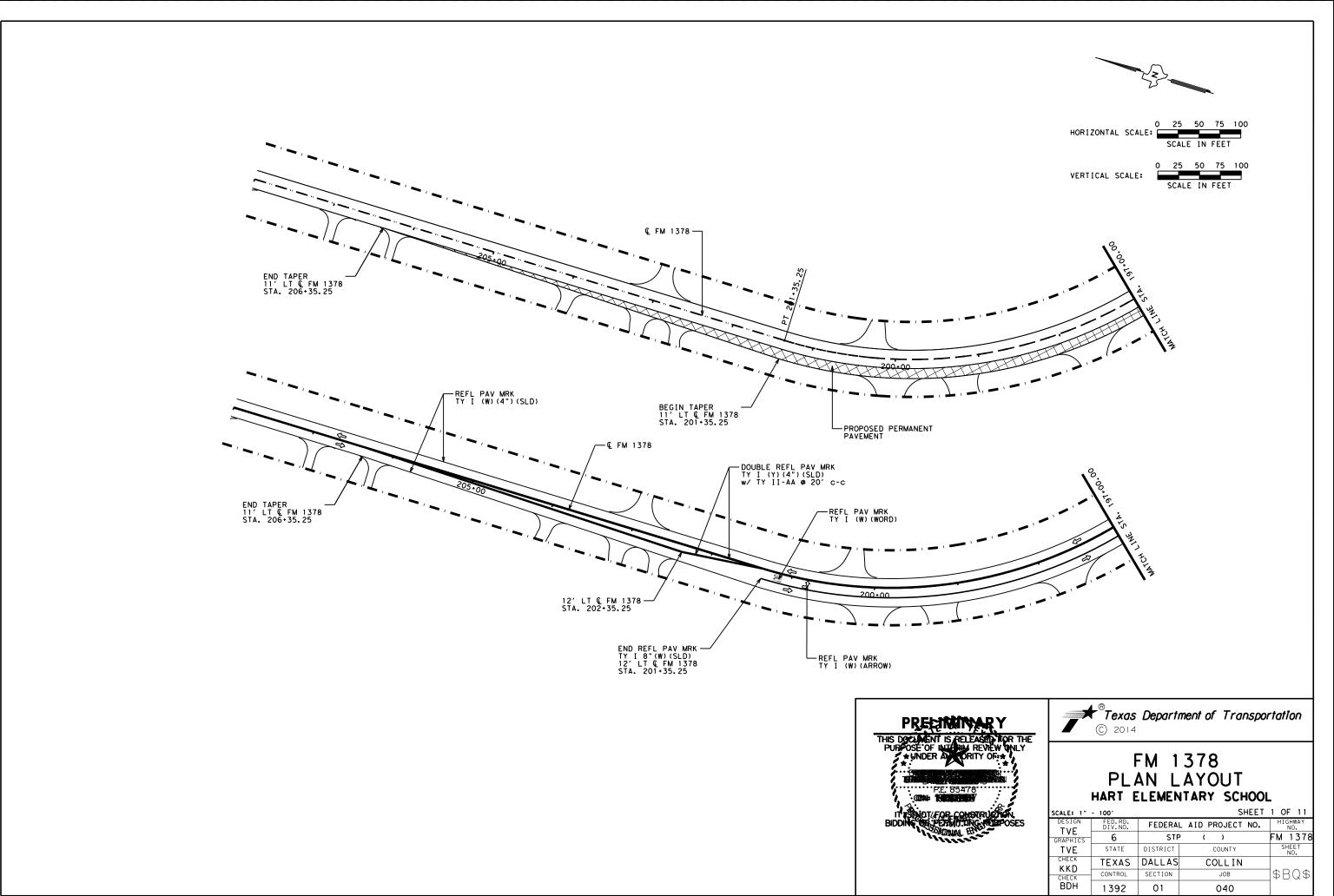

DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

COUNTY OF COLLIN §

This Development Agreement (the "Agreement") is made by and between the City of Lucas, Texas, a municipal corporation existing under the laws of the State of Texas ("City"), and Bullard Brothers Property, a General Partnership, ("Owner") (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Party" or "Parties"), acting by and through their respective representatives.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, this Development Agreement is entered into pursuant to Sections 43.035 and 212.172 of the Texas Local Government Code by and the City and the undersigned property owner(s) (the "Owner"). The term "Owner" includes all owners of the Property.

WHEREAS, the Owner owns a parcel of real property (the "Property") in Collin County, Texas, which is more particularly and separately described in the attached Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to institute annexation proceedings on all or portions of Owner's Property; and

WHEREAS, the Owner desires to have the Property remain in the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction, in consideration for which the Owner agrees to enter into this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement is entered into pursuant to Sections 43.035 and 212.172 of the Texas Local Government Code, in order to address the desires of the Owner and the procedures of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Owner and the City acknowledge that this Agreement is binding upon the City and the Owner and their respective successors and assigns for the term (defined below) of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, this Development Agreement is to be recorded in the Real Property Records of Collin County.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Article I Agreement Not to Annex

1.1. The City guarantees the continuation of the extraterritorial status of the Owner's Property, its immunity from annexation by the City, and its immunity from City property taxes, for the term of this Agreement, subject to the provisions of this Agreement. Except as provided in this Agreement, the City agrees not to annex the Property, agrees not to involuntarily institute proceedings to annex the Property, and further agrees not to include the Property in a statutory

annexation plan for the Term of this Agreement. However, if the Property is annexed pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, then the City shall provide services to the Property pursuant to Chapter 43 of the Texas Local Government Code.

Article II Owner's Obligations

- 2.1 The Owner covenants and agrees not to use the Property for any use other than for agriculture consistent with Chapter 23 of the Texas Tax Code without the prior written consent of the City.
- 2.2 The Owner covenants and agrees that the Owner will not file any type of subdivision plat or related development document for the Property with Collin County or the City until the Property has been annexed into, and zoned by, the City.
- 2.3 The Owner covenants and agrees not to construct, or allow to be constructed, any buildings on the Property that would require a building permit if the Property were in the city limits, until the Property has been annexed into, and zoned by, the City. The Owner also covenants and agrees that the City's AO—Agricultural District zoning requirements apply to the Property, and that the Property shall be used only for AO—Agricultural District zoning uses that exist on that Property at the time of the execution of this Agreement, unless otherwise provided in this Agreement.
- 2.4 The Owner acknowledges that each and every owner of the Property must sign this Agreement in order for the Agreement to take full effect, and the Owners who sign this Agreement covenant and agree, jointly and severally, to indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the City against any and all legal claims, by any person claiming an ownership interest in the Property who has not signed the Agreement, arising in any way from the City's reliance on this Agreement.

Article III Voluntary Annexation

- 3.1 The Owner acknowledges that if any plat or related development document is filed in violation of this Agreement, or if the Owner commences development of the Property in violation of this Agreement, then in addition to the City's other remedies, such act will constitute a petition for voluntary annexation by the Owner, and the Property will be subject to annexation at the discretion of the City Council. The Owner agrees that such annexation shall be voluntary and the Owner hereby consents to such annexation as though a petition for such annexation had been tendered by the Owner.
- 3.2 If annexation proceedings begin pursuant to this Section, the Owner acknowledges that this Agreement serves as an exception to Local Government Code Section 43.052, requiring a municipality to use certain statutory procedures under an annexation plan.

3.3 Furthermore, the Owner hereby waives any and all vested rights and claims that he may have under Section 43.002(a)(2) and Chapter 245 of the Texas Local Government Code that would otherwise exist by virtue of any actions Owner has taken in violation of Article II herein.

Article IV City's Authority

4.1 Pursuant to Sections 43.035(b)(1)(B) of the Texas Local Government Code, the City is authorized to enforce all of the City's regulations and planning authority that do not materially interfere with the use of the Property for agriculture use, in the same manner the regulations are enforced within the City's boundaries. The City states and specifically reserves its authority pursuant to Chapter 251 of the Texas Local Government Code to exercise eminent domain over property that is subject to a Chapter 43 and/or Chapter 212 development agreement.

Article V Term

- 5.1 The term of this Agreement (the "Term") is ten (10) years from the date that the Mayor's signature to this Agreement is acknowledged by a public notary.
- 5.2 The Owner, and all of the Owner's heirs, successors and assigns shall be deemed to have filed a petition for voluntary annexation before the end of the Term, for annexation of the Property to be completed on or after the end of the Term. Prior to the end of the Term, the City may commence the voluntary annexation of the Property. In connection with annexation pursuant to this section, the Owner hereby waives any vested rights Owner may have under Section 43.002(a)(2) and Chapter 245 of the Texas Local Government Code that would otherwise exist by virtue of any plat or construction any of the owners may initiate during the time between the expiration of this Agreement and the institution of annexation proceedings by the City.

Article VI Zoning

6.1 Property annexed pursuant to this Agreement will initially be zoned AO — Agricultural District pursuant to the City's Code of Ordinances, pending determination of the property's permanent zoning in accordance with the provisions of applicable law and the City's Code of Ordinances.

Article VII Notice

7.1 Any person who sells or conveys any portion of the Property shall, prior to such sale or conveyance, give written notice of this Agreement to the prospective purchaser or grantee, and shall give written notice of the sale or conveyance to the City.

7.2 Furthermore, the Owner and the Owner's heirs, successors, and assigns shall give the City written notice within fourteen (14) days of any change in the agricultural exemption status of the Property. A copy of either notice required by this section shall be forwarded to the City at the following address:

Article VIII Miscellaneous

- 8.1 <u>Assignment of Agreement</u>. This Agreement may be assigned by Owner without the prior written consent of City. This Agreement may not be assigned, in whole or in part, by City.
- 8.2 <u>Venue</u>. This Agreement shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and is specifically performable in Collin County, Texas. Exclusive venue shall be in state district court in Collin County, Texas.
- 8.3 <u>Savings/Severability</u>. In case any one or more provisions contained in this Agreement shall be for any reason held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof, and it is the intention of the Parties to this Agreement that in lieu of each provision that is found to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, a provision be added to this Agreement which is legal, valid, and enforceable and is as similar in terms as possible to the provision found to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable.
- 8.4 <u>Authority</u>. Each of the Parties represents and warrants to the other that they have the full power and authority to enter into and fulfill the obligations of this Agreement.
- 8.5 <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the Parties with respect to the matters contained herein and may not be modified or terminated except upon the provisions hereof or by the mutual written agreement of the Parties to this Agreement.
- 8.6 <u>Miscellaneous Drafting Provisions</u>. This Agreement shall be deemed drafted equally by all parties hereto. The language of all parts of this Agreement shall be construed as a whole according to its fair meaning, and any presumption or principle that the language herein is to be construed against any Party shall not apply. Headings in this Agreement are for the convenience of the Parties and are not intended to be used in construing this document.

- 8.7 <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement will be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors, and authorized assigns. This Agreement only inures to the benefit of, and may only be enforced by, the Parties and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, assignees, lender, successors, and City. No other person or entity is a third-party beneficiary of this Agreement.
- 8.8 <u>Governmental Powers; Waiver of Immunity</u>. By its execution of this Agreement, City does not waive or surrender any of its governmental powers, immunities, or rights except as to the enforcement of this Agreement.
- 8.9 Covenants Run with Property. The provisions of this Agreement are hereby declared covenants running with the Property and are fully binding on the Owner and each and every subsequent owner of all or any portion of the Property but only during the term of such party's ownership thereof (except with respect to defaults that occur during the term of such person's ownership) and shall be binding on all successors, heirs, and assigns of the Owner which acquire any right, title, or interest in or to the Property, or any part thereof. Any person who acquires any right, title, or interest in or to the Property, or any part hereof, thereby agrees and covenants to abide by and fully perform the provisions of this Agreement with respect to the right, title or interest in such Property.
- 8.10 <u>Recordation of Agreement</u>. A copy of this Agreement shall be recorded in the Deed Records of Collin County, Texas.
- 8.11 <u>Multiple Counterparts and Duplicate Originals</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of multiple counterparts and/or duplicate originals, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which considered together shall be deemed one and the same Agreement.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LUCAS, TEXAS, ANNEXING THE HEREINAFTER DESCRIBED TERRITORY INTO THE CITY OF LUCAS, TEXAS, EXTENDING THE BOUNDARY LIMITS OF THE CITY SO AS TO INCLUDE SAID HEREINAFTER DESCRIBED TERRITORY WITHIN THE CITY'S LIMITS, GRANTING TO ALL INHABITANTS AND OWNERS OF TERRITORY ALL OF THE RIGHTS AND **PRIVILEGES** OF **OTHER** CITIZENS, **AND BINDING** THE **INHABITANTS** BY **ALL** THE ACTS, **ORDINANCES AND** REGULATIONS OF THE CITY; ADOPTING A SERVICE PLAN FOR THE DESCRIBED TERRITORY; PROVIDING A REPEALING CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, this ordinance pertains to the hereinafter described territory consisting of a 10.682-acre tract of land, more or less, being part of the Montgomery Birch Survey, Abstract No. 115, and, which is more particularly described and identified in Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "B"; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lucas has given the requisite notices and conducted the public hearings required by Chapter 43 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has adopted a service plan as required by Section 43.056 of the Texas Local Government Code for the territory, which is attached hereto as Exhibit "C"; and

WHEREAS, the territory to be annexed lies within the exclusive extra territorial jurisdiction of Lucas, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the requirements for annexation of this area are as stated in Chapter 43 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lucas has concluded that said territory should be annexed to and made a part of the City of Lucas, Texas.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LUCAS, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the territory consisting of a 10.682-acre tract of land, more particularly described and identified in Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "B," attached hereto and made a part hereof for all purposes, is situated within the exclusive extraterritorial jurisdiction of the

City and adjacent and contiguous thereto, be and the same is hereby annexed to the City of Lucas, Texas.

SECTION 2. The boundary limits of the City of Lucas, Texas, shall be and are hereby extended to include said territory within the City limits and the territory described herein shall be and is hereby included within the territorial limits of the City, subject to all the acts, ordinances, resolutions and regulations of said City. The inhabitants of the property described herein and annexed hereby shall hereafter be entitled to all rights and privileges of other citizens of the City of Lucas, and shall be bound by the acts, ordinances, resolutions, and regulations of the City.

SECTION 3. That the service plan for the territory is approved by the City Council of the City of Lucas, which is attached hereto as Exhibit "C" and made a part hereof for all purposes, the same as if fully copied herein, be and the same is hereby adopted by the City of Lucas.

SECTION 4. That all provisions of the ordinances of the City of Lucas, Texas, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are hereby, repealed, and all other provisions of the ordinances of the City not in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5. That should any sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part or provision thereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, and shall not affect the validity of the Code of Ordinances as a whole.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption, as the law in such cases provides.

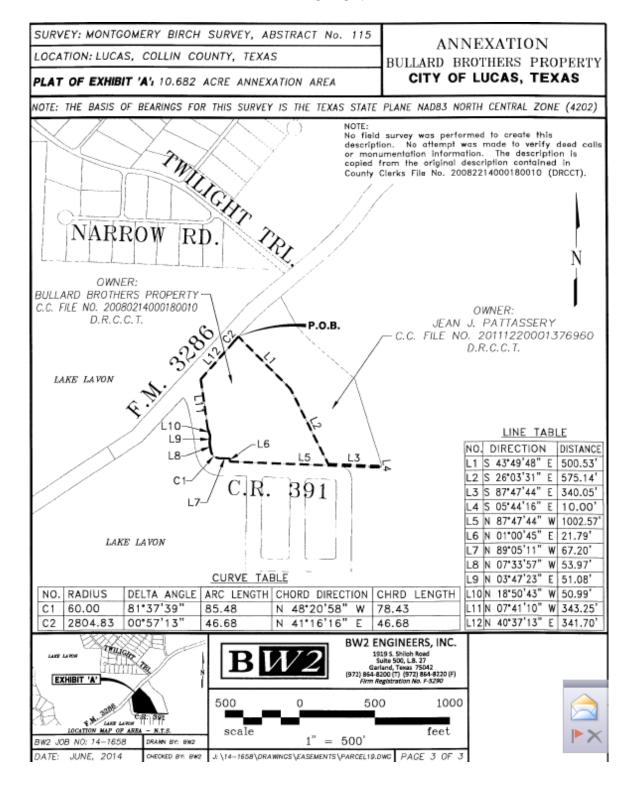

FOR SERVICES EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY AFTER DATE OF ANNEXATION

1. POLICE PROTECTION

The City of Lucas, Texas will provide police protection to the newly annexed tract at the same or similar level now being provided to other areas of the City of Lucas, Texas with similar topography, land use and population within the newly annexed area.

2. FIRE PROTECTION AND AMBULANCE SERVICE

The City of Lucas, Texas will provide fire protection to the newly annexed tract at the same or similar level of service now being provided to other areas of the City of Lucas, Texas, with similar topography, land use and population with the City. Ambulance service will be provided to the newly annexed tract at the same or similar level of service now being provided to other areas of the City of Lucas, Texas, with similar topography, land use and population with the City.

3. SOLID WASTE COLLECTION

The City of Lucas, Texas will provide residential solid waste collection to the newly annexed tract at the same or similar level now being provided to other areas of the City of Lucas, Texas with similar topography, land use and population within the newly annexed area.

4. WATER FACILITIES

Maintenance of any public water facilities in the area to be annexed that are not in the service area of another water utility will begin upon the effective date of the annexation using existing personnel and equipment.

5. MAINTENANCE OF ROADS AND STREETS

Any and all roads, streets or alleyways which have been dedicated to the City of Lucas, Texas, shall be maintained to the same degree and extent that other roads, streets and alleyways are maintained in areas with similar topography, land use and population density. Any and all lighting of roads, streets and alleyways which may be positioned in a right-of-way, roadway or

utility company easement shall be maintained by the applicable utility company servicing the City of Lucas, Texas, pursuant to the rules, regulations and fees of such utility.

6. MAINTENANCE OF PARKS, PLAYGROUNDS AND SWIMMING POOLS

The City Council of the City of Lucas, Texas, is not aware of the existence of any parks, playgrounds or swimming pools now located in the area proposed for annexation. Any existing private parks, playgrounds, swimming pools and other recreational and community facilities within the annexation area will be unaffected by the annexation.

7. MAINTENANCE OF PUBLICLY OWNED FACILITY, BUILDING OR MUNICIPAL SERVICE

The City Council of the City of Lucas, Texas, is not aware of the existence of any publicly owned facility, building or other municipal service now located in the area proposed for annexation. In the event any such publicly owned facility, building or municipal service does exist and are public facilities, the City of Lucas, Texas, will maintain such areas to the same extent and degree that it maintains publicly owned facilities, buildings or municipal services of the City now incorporated in the City of Lucas, Texas.

CONSTRUCTION OF ANY CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

1. POLICE PROTECTION, FIRE PROTECTION AND SOLID WASTE COLLECTION

The Council of the City of Lucas, Texas finds and determines it to be unnecessary to acquire or construct any capital improvement for the purposes of providing police protection, fire protection or solid waste collection. The City Council finds and determines that it has at the present time adequate facilities to provide the same type, kind and level of protection and service which is presently being administered to other areas already incorporated in the City of Lucas, Texas, with the same or similar topography, land use and population density.

2. WATER AND WASTE WATER FACILITIES

The City Council of the City of Lucas, Texas, finds and determines it to be unnecessary to construct any additional capital improvements for the purpose of providing water and waste water services. The City Council finds and determines that it has, at the present time, adequate facilities to provide the same type, kind and level of service which is presently being administered to other parts of Lucas, Texas, with the same topography, land use and population density.

3. ROADS AND STREETS

Maintenance of properly dedicated roads and streets will be consistent with the maintenance provided by the City to other roads and streets will be consistent with the maintenance provided by the City to other roads and streets in areas of similar topography, land use and subdevelopment of the annexed property, the developers will be required pursuant to the ordinances of the City of Lucas, Texas, to provide internal and peripheral streets and to construct those streets in accordance with the specifications required by the City of Lucas, Texas, for the properly dedicated street.

4. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Notwithstanding any other provision of this service plan, a landowner within the newly annexed area will not be required to fund capital improvements necessary to provide municipal services in a manner inconsistent with Chapter 395 of the Local Government Code, unless otherwise agreed to by the landowner.

SPECIFIC FINDINGS

The City Council of the City of Lucas, Texas finds and determines that this proposed Service Plan will not provide any fewer services, and it will not provide a lower level of service in the area proposed to be annexed than were in existence in the proposed area at the time immediately preceding the annexation process.

Because of the differing characteristics of topography, land utilization and population density, the service levels which may ultimately be provided in the newly annexed area may differ somewhat from services provided in other areas of the City of Lucas, Texas. These differences are specifically dictated because of differing characteristics of the property and the City of Lucas, Texas will undertake to perform consistent with this contract so as to provide the newly annexed area with the same type, kind and quality of service presently enjoyed by the citizens of the City of Lucas, Texas who reside in areas of similar topography, land utilization and population.

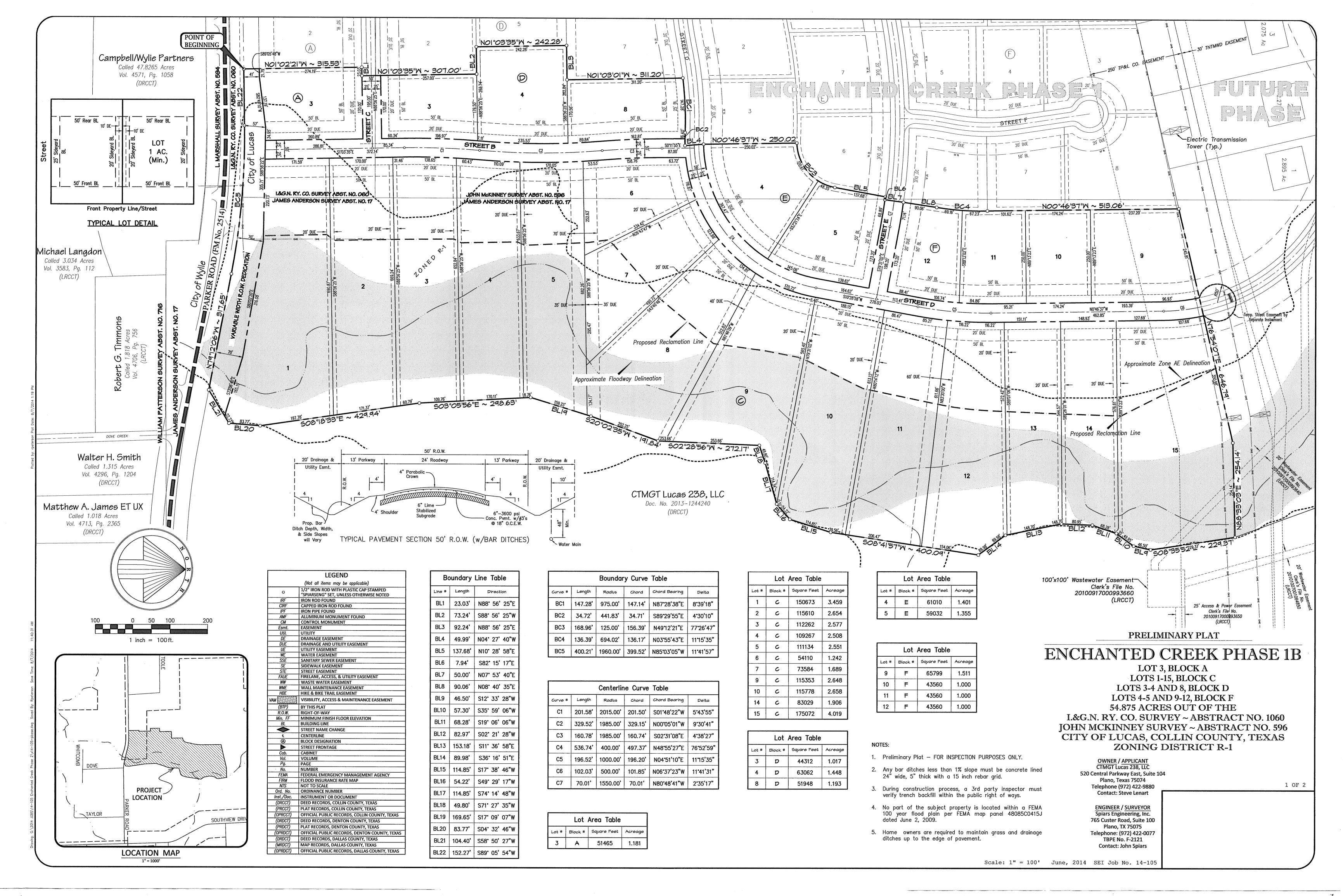

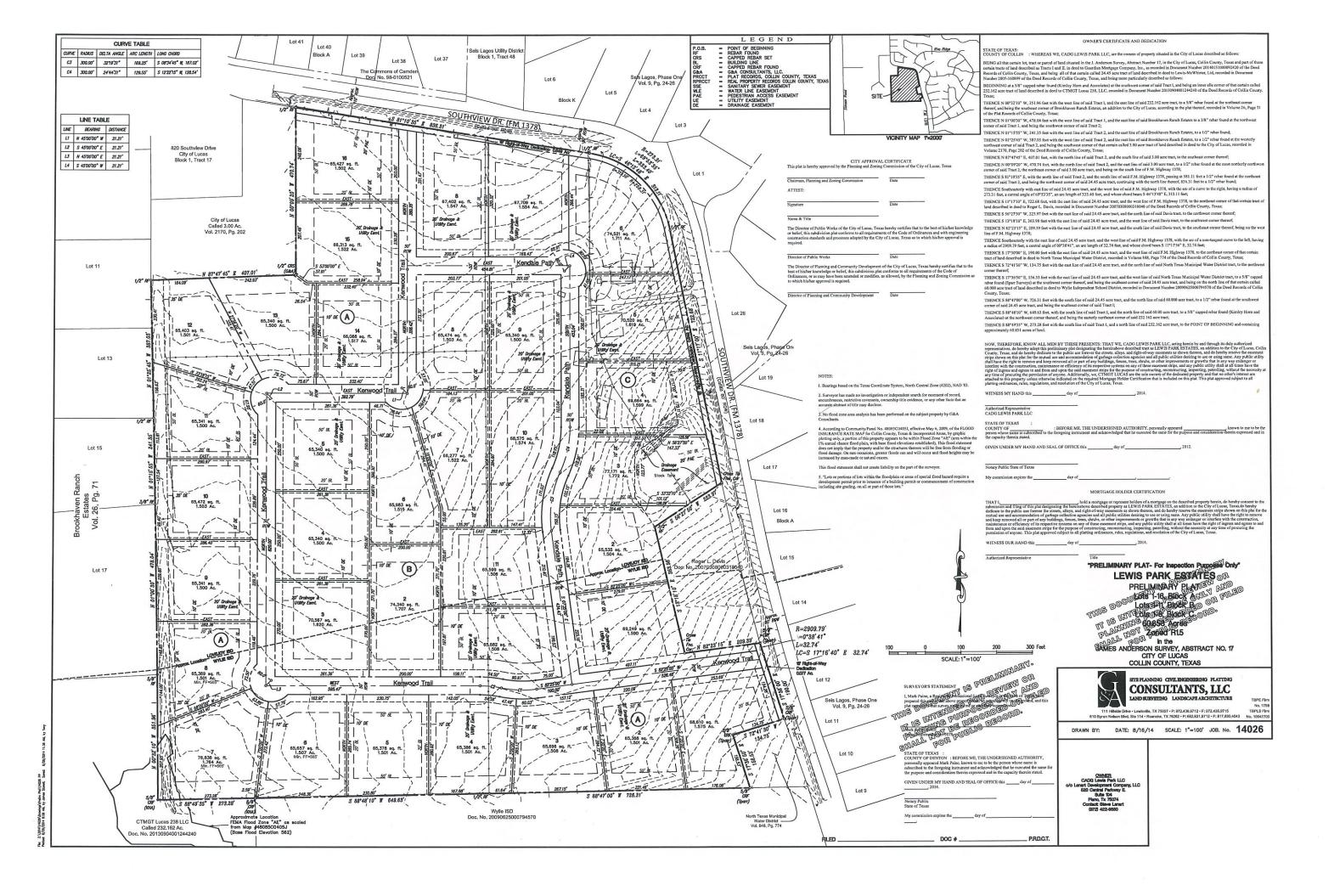

ARTICLE 14.02 ADMINISTRATION

Division 1. Generally

Sec. 14.02.001 Enforcement and penalties

Any person, firm, corporation, or political subdivision who violates any of the provisions of these regulations shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction in the municipal court, shall be subject to a fine of not more than two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for each offense. Each day that a violation is permitted to exist shall constitute a separate offense and such violation is hereby declared to be a common nuisance which may be abated by the city in any manner authorized by law, including injunction and an action for damages. (1995 Code, sec. 9-6)

Division 2. Board of Adjustment*

Sec. 14.02.031 Definition

The word "board" when used in this chapter shall be construed to mean the board of adjustment. (1995 Code, sec. 9-190)

Sec. 14.02.032 Organization and procedure

- (a) Membership. The board shall consist of five (5) citizens as full-time members of the board and four (4) citizens as alternate members of the board who shall serve in the absence of one or more regular members when requested to do so by the mayor. Each board member and alternate board member are to be appointed or reappointed by the mayor and confirmed by the city council for staggered terms of two (2) years, respectively. Each member of the board shall be removable for just cause by the city council upon written charges and after public hearing. Vacancies shall be filled by an alternate board member selected by the city council. The selected alternate board member's term then becomes vacant. The board shall elect its own chairman, who shall serve for a period of one (1) year or until his successor is elected. The board shall elect a vice-chairman who shall preside over meetings of the board in the absence of the chairman. (Ordinance 2005-09-00535, sec. 1, adopted 9/6/05)
- (b) <u>Meetings</u>. Meetings of the board shall be held at the call of the chairman or, in his absence, the vice-chairman, and at such times as the board may determine.
- (c) <u>Hearings</u>. The hearings of the board of adjustment shall be open to the public. however. [sic] The chairman, or, when appropriate, the vice-chairman, may administer oaths and compel the attendance of witnesses.

(d) <u>Rules and regulations</u>. The board shall keep minutes of its proceedings, showing the vote of each member and upon the fact that a member is absent or fails to vote. The board shall keep records of its examinations and other official actions. The minutes and records shall be filed immediately in the board's office and are public records.

Sec. 14.02.033 Appeals

- (a) <u>Procedure</u>. A decision made by an administrative official of the city may be appealed to the board of adjustment by a person aggrieved by the decision or by any officer, department, board or bureau of the city affected by the decision. Such appeal shall be made by filing a notice of appeal with the office of the board and with official from whom the appeal is taken specifying the grounds thereof. The office, official or department from which the appeal is taken shall forthwith transmit to the board of adjustment all of the papers constituting the records upon which the action appealed from was taken. The appeal must be filed within twenty (20) days after the date of the decision of the administrative official from which the appeal is taken.
- (b) <u>Stay of proceedings</u>. An appeal shall stay all proceedings in furtherance of the action appealed from unless the official from whom the appeal is taken certifies in writing to the board facts supporting the official's opinion that a stay would cause imminent peril to life or property. In such case, the proceedings may be [stayed] only by a restraining order granted by the board or by a court of record on application, after notice to the official, if due cause is shown.
- (c) Notice of hearing on appeal. The board shall set a reasonable time for the hearing on the appeal or other matter referred to it, and shall mail notices of such hearing to the petitioner and to the owners of property lying within two hundred feet (200') or less of street frontage of any point of the lot or portion thereof on which a variation is desired. The city shall give public notice of the hearing and due notice to the parties in interest. A party may appear at the appeal hearing in person or by agent or attorney. The board shall hear and decide the appeal within a reasonable time. Notice of such hearings may be sent by the board in writing, properly addressed to the last known addresses of the proper parties, and such notices shall be deemed complete when deposited in the mail.

Sec. 14.02.034 Powers and duties of board

- (a) <u>Subpoena witnesses</u>, etc. The board of adjustment shall have the power to subpoena witnesses, administer oaths, and punish for contempt, and may require the production of documents, under such regulations as it may establish. The board may:
 - (1) Hear and decide an appeal that alleges error in an order, requirement, decision or determination made by an administrative official in the enforcement of this chapter;
 - (2) Hear and decide special exceptions to the requirements when necessary or appropriate to:

- (A) Permit the erection and use of a building or the use of premises for railroads if such uses are in general conformance with any master plan and present no conflict or nuisance to adjacent properties.
- (B) Permit a public utility or public service structure or building in any district with a ground area or of a height at variance with those provided for in the district in which such public utility or public service building is permitted to be located, when found reasonably necessary for the public health, convenience, safety, or general welfare.
- (C) Grant a permit for the extension of a height or area regulation into an adjoining district which divides a lot into a single ownership on the effective date of this chapter.
- (D) Permit the reconstruction of a nonconforming building which has been damaged by explosion, fire, act of God, or the public enemy, to the extent of more than fifty percent (50%) of its fair market value, where the board finds some compelling necessity requiring a continuance of the nonconforming use and the primary purpose of continuing the nonconforming use is not to continue a monopoly.
- (E) Waive or reduce the parking and loading requirements in any of the districts. whenever the character or use of the building is such as to make unnecessary the full provision or parking or loading facilities, or where such regulations would impose an unreasonable hardship upon the use of the lot, as contrasted with merely granting an advantage or a convenience.
- (F) Determine, in cases of uncertainty, the classification of any use not specifically named in this chapter.
- (3) Authorize in specific cases a variance from the terms of this chapter if the variance is not contrary to the public interest and, due to special conditions, a literal enforcement of this chapter would result in unnecessary hardship, and so that the spirit of this chapter is observed and substantial justice is done.
- (b) <u>Procedure</u>. In exercising its authority under this section, the board may reverse or affirm, in whole or in part, or modify the administrative official's order, requirement, decision, or determination from which an appeal is taken and make the correct order, requirement, decision, or determination, and for that purpose the board has the same authority as the administrative official.
- (c) <u>Voting</u>. The concurring vote of four (4) of the members of the board is necessary to reverse an order, requirement, decision, or determination of an administrative official, or grant a variance authorized herein.

(d) <u>Changes</u>. The board shall have no authority or jurisdiction to change or modify the provisions and requirements of this chapter, and its jurisdiction is limited to hardship and borderline cases which may arise from time to time and the authority specifically granted in this division.

Division 2. Park and Open Space Board[†]

Sec. 1.09.031 Established; composition; qualifications of members

The city council shall provide for the appointment of a park and open space board consisting of five (5) regular members and two (2) alternate members. Board members shall reside in the city for at least 6 months preceding appointment day. (Ordinance 2005-03-00522, sec. 1, adopted 3/21/05)

Sec. 1.09.032 Reserved

Editor's note—Former section 1.09.032 pertaining to the terms of members and deriving from Ordinance 2005-03-00522, sec. 1, adopted March 21, 2005 and Ordinance 2007-08-00599, sec. 3, adopted August 2, 2007, was repealed and deleted in its entirety by Ordinance 2011-06-00682, sec. 2, adopted by the city on June 2, 2011.

Sec. 1.09.033 Removal of members; filling of vacancies

The members of the park and open space board shall be subject to removal from office by the city council for any cause deemed sufficient by a majority vote of city council members at a regularly scheduled council meeting. Any vacancy in the board shall be filled by the city council for the unexpired term of the member whose place has become vacant.

Sec. 1.09.034 Meetings; liaison with planning and zoning commission

- (a) The park and open space board shall hold at least one (1) quarterly meeting. Such meeting shall be held on a day of the month approved by the board. Special meetings may be called by the chairman, by the city administrator, or if requested by at least four (4) board members. Such meetings shall comply with the Texas Open Meetings Act.
- (b) A liaison shall be appointed by the board to attend regularly scheduled meetings of the planning and zoning commission.

Sec. 1.09.035 Officers

(a) <u>Election</u>. A chairman and vice-chairman shall be selected each year at the regular meeting in January.

(b) Duties.

- (1) <u>Chairman</u>. It shall be the duty of the chairman to preside at all meetings of the board and to call special meetings.
- (2) <u>Vice-chairman</u>. It shall be the duty of the vice-chairman to perform the duties of the chairman during any absence.

Sec. 1.09.036 Duties

- (a) The board shall serve in an advisory capacity to the city council in all matters relating to the parks and open space of the city.
- (b) The board shall acquaint itself with and make a continuous study and inspection of the complete parks and open space programs and shall advise the city council from time to time as to the present and future planning, acquisition, development, enlargement and use policy of the parks system and open space.
- (c) The board shall develop and maintain a master planning guide of park facilities and open space. Such master plan shall be considered, revised and maintained with technical assistance and recommendations of the city administrator. The master plan shall be reviewed at least annually and should include a five-year capital improvement program.
- (d) The board shall review, study and make recommendations to the city administrator for priorities of projects or activities to be included in future parks and open space programs.
- (e) The board shall study fees and policies on an annual basis, making recommendations to the director for report to the city council.
- (f) The board shall study budget proposals on an annual basis and recommend inclusion or exclusion of budget items to the city administrator.
- (g) The board may establish additional policies and guidelines upon approval by the city council.
- (h) The board shall study and make recommendations to the city council on any other matters as requested by the city council.
- (i) The board shall make recommendations with regard to park land dedications.

ARTICLE 1.05 BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES[±]

Division 1. Generally

Sec. 1.05.001 Qualifications of members

A person is eligible for appointment to a board or commission of the city if the person:

- (1) Has been a citizen of the city for six (6) continuous months prior to the date of appointment;
- (2) Has obtained the age of eighteen (18) years prior to the date of appointment;
- (3) Has never been convicted of and is not currently charged with a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude;
- (4) Is not delinquent on any ad valorem tax due the city.

(1995 Code, sec. 2-70)

Sec. 1.05.002 Disqualification; residency requirement

After appointment to a board or commission, a person may become disqualified if any of the qualifications listed insection 1.05.001 are found to be untrue at the time of appointment. In addition, if any board or commission member subsequently moves his or her primary residence from the city, then a vacancy shall exist on the subject board or commission and a new member shall be appointed in the manner provided herein. (1995 Code, sec. 2-71)

Sec. 1.05.003 Appointment of members

- (a) All members of any board, commission or corporation of the city shall be appointed by a majority of the city council. The members of any board, commission or corporation shall be appointed for staggered terms of two (2) years. The initial appointment of the members of boards, commissions or corporations by the council shall be in November of 2011. At the time of initial appointment, the council shall designate which members shall serve a two-year term and which members shall serve a one-year term; and, in November of each succeeding year thereafter, the council shall select replacements for those members whose terms have expired. Vacancies and unexpired terms shall be appointed by the council for the remainder of the term. No person related to the mayor or any member of the city council within the first degree by consanguinity or affinity shall be eligible to serve on any city board, commission, corporation or committee.
- (b) Except as otherwise required by state law, a person appointed by the city council to any board, commission or corporation is not subject to term limits.

Division 2. Planning and Zoning Commission^{*}

Sec. 1.05.031 Established; jurisdiction

There is hereby created and established the city planning and zoning commission for the territorial jurisdiction of the city and its extraterritorial jurisdiction. (1995 Code, sec. 2-40)

Sec. 1.05.032 Composition; appointment and term of members

The planning and zoning commission shall be composed of five (5) regular members and two (2) alternate members, each of whom shall be appointed in accordance with section 1.05.003 of this code. Alternate members shall serve in the absence of one or more regular members when requested to do so by the presiding officer of the planning and zoning commission. Each member of the planning and zoning commission shall continue in office until such time as a successor is appointed and duly qualified. (Ordinance 2011-06-00682, sec. 1, adopted 6/2/11)

Sec. 1.05.033 Qualifications of members

The appointed members of the planning and zoning commission shall be resident citizens and qualified voters of the city. (1995 Code, sec. 2-42)

Sec. 1.05.034 Filling of vacancies

All vacancies on the planning and zoning commission shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as provided for the original appointments. All expired terms shall be filled for terms as provided for the original appointments and in the same manner. (1995 Code, sec. 2-43)

Sec. 1.05.035 Election of officers

The members of the planning and zoning commission shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from its membership. (1995 Code, sec. 2-44)

Sec. 1.05.036 Powers and duties

The planning and zoning commission shall have the power and it shall be its duty to make, and recommend for adoption, a master plan, as a whole or in parts, for the

future development and redevelopment of the municipality and its environs, including its extraterritorial jurisdiction, and shall have power and it shall be its duty to prepare a comprehensive plan and ordinance for zoning the city and its extraterritorial jurisdiction in accordance with <u>chapter 211 of the Texas Local Government Code</u> and amendments thereto. The commission shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by ordinances or state law. (1995 Code, sec. 2-45)

Sec. 1.05.037 Rules, regulations and bylaws

The planning and zoning commission shall have the power to make rules, regulations and bylaws for its own government, which shall conform as nearly as possible with those governing the city council, and the same shall be subject to approval by the council. Such bylaws shall include, among other items, provisions for:

- (1) Regular and special meetings open to the public.
- (2) Records of its proceedings, to be open for inspection by the public.
- (3) Reporting to the council and the public, from time to time and annually.
- (4) The holding of public hearings as required by law.

(1995 Code, sec. 2-46)

Sec. 1.05.038 Removal of members

Members of the planning and zoning commission may be removed by the city council at any time, with or without cause. (Ordinance 2004-11-00511, sec. 2, adopted 11/15/04)
