First Responders Helping First Responders



Hurricane Harvey struck the Texas coast on August 25, making landfall over the Rockport/Fulton area. The path and destruction of the hurricane was devastating for that area. Lucas Fire-Rescue was part of a strike team that was deployed to Fulton. Lucas Fire-Rescue was deployed to Fulton from August 28 until September 17,

serving three weeks to help the community and assist the Fulton Volunteer Fire Department. While assisting the Fulton Volunteer Fire Department we learned that several of their own first responders had lost everything in the hurricane, homes, personal possessions, and even jobs. Lucas Fire-Rescue wants to directly impact those first responders that we worked with for over three weeks by raising a "Fill The Boot For Fulton" for the first responders that have been impacted. Lucas Fire-Rescue will host a "Fill The Boot For Fulton" at the Walmart in Lucas on Wednesday, October 4 through Friday, October 6 from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm each evening. All monetary donations will be directly given to Fulton first responders (Matt Jamison, Jonathan Peters, Michael Greenway, Samantha Greenway, Shara Harris, and others) who lost everything. This event has forever changed Lucas Fire-Rescue with our response to help our brothers and sisters in Fulton. Harvey the Hurricane Hawk Lands in Lucas

The Blackland Prairie Raptor Center received Harvey the Hurricane Hawk for rehabilitation after being rescued from Hurricane Harvey in Houston on August 27. The Cooper's Hawk was sent to the Blackland Prairie Raptor Center for final flight exercise before its release on Wednesday, September 13 at Oak Point Park in Plano. The hawk became an international phenomenon when it took refuge inside a Texas cab drivers car during the storm and refused to leave. The cab driver took the hawk home and cared for it until a member of the Texas Wildlife Rehabilitation Coalition in Houston was able to take it to their center for professional care. The Blackland Prairie Raptor Center was contacted by the Texas Wildlife Rehabilitation Coalition to help with the final rehabilitation as the Blackland Prairie Raptor Center has the large cages necessary to give the hawk exercise before releasing it back into the wild. The release took place in the Plano area as the Texas Wildlife Rehabilitation Coalition felt that

releasing the newly recovered hawk into damaged habitats in the Houston area would not be in the best interest of the hawk's survival. The Blackland Prairie Raptor Center is a state and federally permitted facility in Lucas, Texas whose mission is the rehabilitation and release of birds of prey in North Texas as well as outreach programming with live raptor ambassadors. The Blackland Prairie Raptor Center is a nonprofit organization that has received almost 600 patients so far this year. After signing in, volunteers will pick up their supplies, listen to a short safety speech, divide into teams, and then be driven to the drop off locations for their work assignments. Once they are done, they will be picked up and return to the pavilion where they will be served lunch.

In support of Arbor Day, members of the Legacy 4-H Club will be on hand giving away Shumard Oak and Overcup Oak tree saplings, along with a small bag of mulch. Representatives from Texas Pure will be available to talk about their products for organic gardening, and members of the Collin County Master Gardeners Association will be on hand to share information about the proper planting and care of the trees, and to answer questions about becoming a Master Gardener. This is a great opportunity to show your support in helping us keep Lucas a beautiful place to live. 


Recycling Drop-Off October 7, 2017 9 am - 1 pm



Saturday, October 7 is the beginning of drop-off recycling program for the City of Lucas. Residents can bring their recycle items to City Hall the first Saturday of each month between 9:00 am and 1:00 pm. A Barnes Waste Disposal truck will be parked at the back near the Community Center, and staff from Barnes and the City will be available to assist residents with unloading items if necessary. City staff will be working that day to direct traffic and ensure we have a smooth flow of vehicles in and out of City Hall. You must have proof of residency in Lucas, or be a Lucas water customer showing a drivers license or utility invoice to participate in the recycling program. All recyclable items should be rinsed and free of material. Acceptable recyclable items include:

- Aluminum, tin, and steel cans
- Glass bottles and jars
- > Plastic bottles and containers with a recycle symbol of 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, or 7
- ➤ All mixed paper and paperboard products





Again this year, the City of Lucas Parks and Open Space Board will be hosting the annual Scarecrow Contest. Lucas residents, business, youth groups and church groups are encouraged to register and create a scarecrow display at their home or any other location. There are two scarecrow maker categories individual/family and business/organization. Organizations may be comprised of businesses, school classrooms, sports teams, churches or various clubs. just a few of the vendors taking part in the Lucas Fire Station Open House. There will also be fire prevention activities for the kids that include a face painter and a physical ability test. For the adults, a fire extinguisher prop to teach how to properly use a fire extinguisher will be available. Lucas Fire-Rescue will also be discussing how to create your own home escape route in an emergency. We hope that the entire family can join Lucas Fire-Rescue for a fun afternoon and to learn more about safety and fire prevention.



The City of Lucas has had two instances where the 911 call back feature has been activated through the mass communication function of Nixle. This call back feature is for more serious incidents that affect a

greater majority of our residents. The City received several phone calls after this feature was activated asking why the different notifications between a text message, a phone call, and an email. If the 911 call back system is activated, a phone call, text message, and email will be sent. This is ensure you are reached. If you do receive a phone call, please answer the phone call or the system will continue to call back. Once the entire message has played, press 1 to confirm. The City wants to ensure that when serious incidents occur, everyone is notified.

- Be a citizen of the City for twelve (12) continuous months prior to the date of appointment
- Be eighteen (18) years old prior to the date of appointment
- Have not been convicted of, and are not currently charged with a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude
- Have no indebtedness to the City, such as delinquent taxes
- Be a qualified voter of the City

The application deadline is November 10 and the City Council will be conducting interviews and considering appointments at their December 7 and December 17 City Council meetings.

Tree Removal

The City will occasionally get a call from a concerned citizen regarding the removal of a tree on private property. If you are a resident of Lucas, you are probably passionate about our trees! We love our tree-lined streets and the benefits that trees offer, such as providing shaded areas to reduce ambient temperatures, preventing erosion, and the aesthetic appeal and beauty they afford to the City. The City of Lucas is working on becoming designated as a Tree City USA!

In the City's building regulations, there is a section on tree conservation and landscaping that regulates the removal of trees during the development and construction of a project. The City works with developers or builders to ensure they comply with these conservation standards. However, an owner of a residence who uses the property as a homestead is exempt from these requirements. There are other exceptions to these requirements, which include agriculture uses, damaged or diseased trees, the city working in the right-of-way, and in the case of utility interruption. Please do not hesitate to contact the City of Lucas if you see a questionable tree removal so City staff can evaluate the situation.

New City Hall Sign

The City will be replacing the existing City Hall sign with a new full color LED message display sign. This upgrade was necessary because parts to repair the existing sign are no longer available. The new sign will feature Austin Chalk Stone and will have a cedar looking metal cap. The dimensions of the sign will be approximately 6 foot by 10 foot and will be placed in the same location as the current sign. We hope to have the sign in place and operational in early October.
