October starts the holiday season with our 3rd annual Scarecrow Contest. Lucas residents and businesses are encouraged to register and create a scarecrow display at their home or place of business, choose your theme and be creative. Registration is available October 1 through 31 on the City's website at www.lucastexas.us/news and be sure to view the other scarecrows that have registered so you can take the kids on a tour around town of all the scarecrow entries. Last year we had a total of 13 creative scarecrow entries with 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners receiving Walmart gift cards.

In November, events kick off with our first annual Fall Sweep Cleanup/Arbor Day event on November 4 from 8 am to 12 pm at the Lucas Community Park. Free tree saplings will be given out along with a free bag of mulch. Residents will be able to get gardening tips from the Collin County Master Gardener Association, and you will have the opportunity to take part in the Keep Lucas Beautiful Cleanup event that begins at 8 am. As a way to say thank you to our volunteers, lunch will be provided after the cleanup event. This is also great way for students to obtain community service hours.

The City of Lucas was presented with the Scenic City Certification on Thursday, October 5 in Houston, at an event held in conjunction with the Texas Municipal League's

Annual Conference. A first-time participant in the Scenic City Certification Program, the City of Lucas emerged from its Scenic City assessment with Recognized certification. Its Comprehensive Plan contributed to the City's strong showing in terms of public infrastructure, parks and open spaces, and sign regulation that shape high quality public roadways and public spaces.


- Be a citizen of the City for twelve (12) continuous months prior to the date of appointment
- Be eighteen (18) years old prior to the date of appointment
- Have not been convicted of, and are not currently charged with a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude
- Have no indebtedness to the City, such as delinquent taxes
- Be a qualified voter of the City

Visit http://www.lucastexas.us/departments/boards-commissions/ to complete the on-line application. There are currently two vacant positions on the Parks and Open Space Board. The application deadline is November 10 and the City Council will be conducting interviews and considering appointments at their December 7 and December 17 City Council meetings.

Lucas Walmart Hosts Training Academy

Mayor Pro Tem Kathleen Peele and Councilmember Debbie Fisher recently had the honor of attending a very special ceremony – the graduation class from the Walmart Academy. The celebration was held September 26 at the Lucas Walmart for the first 60 candidates to complete the training program. The Academy is designed for Supervisors, Assistant Managers, and Department Managers, and offers a program that combines classroom and sales-floor training in addition to role specific functions. Areas of study include leadership, merchandising, operations, and customer service.

The Lucas Walmart store was chosen as the training location for a number of reasons including the location, the performance of the store, and the growing sales volume. This store will serve as the training camp for approximately 36 stores from surrounding communities.

This project was a big undertaking and enhances the usefulness and beauty of our parks and trailhead.

• • Construction Update • • •

November marks the completion and beginning of several Public Works projects in Lucas. The new 6400-foot, eight-inch Snider Lane waterline is scheduled to be completed by the end of November, and a new 12-inch waterline serving citizens on Shiloh Drive, Toole Drive, and Parker Road should also be completed by the end of November, along with the widening and overlay of W. Lucas Road. The last of the new striping for W. Lucas Road should be in place this month.

Roadway maintenance projects got underway in October. Skyline Drive, Horseman Drive, Edgefield Lane cul-de-sac, a short section of Blondy Jhune Road, and Daytona Avenue will have smooth, stable new asphalt roadway by the end of November.

Just as somethings come to an end other projects are just beginning. The Winningkoff Road Reverse Curve construction is scheduled to begin in November. A traffic control plan is being created and will be published on the City's website prior to construction. During this same timeframe, the Stinson Road/W. Lucas Road Intersection and the City's North Pump Station new water tower projects will be in preparation for bidding in January/February, 2018. The design of the following projects will be in full swing in November:

- Country Club Road/Estates Parkway Turn Lane
- Winningkoff Road from Forestview Drive to Snider Lane
- Blondy Jhune Road from the western bridge to Winningkoff Road
- Stinson Road from Parker Road to Bristol Park

To recommend an individual, business, or group for recognition please fill out the Service Tree Award Nominating Form. Nominations must be submitted no later than January 15, 2018 to City Secretary Stacy Henderson at shenderson@lucastexas.us or 665 Country Club Road, Lucas, Texas 75002.

Nominees to be selected for recognition should meet the following criteria:

- Actions being recognized should benefit the City of Lucas or its residents in a significant manner.
- Nominee may be individual, youth, Church group, Civic or neighborhood group (ex: HOA, garden club), youth group (ex: Boy or Girl Scout troop, 4-H Club), local business, local charity or other organization.
- The Individual must live in the City of Lucas or have lived in the City of Lucas corporate limits during the time the service was performed. If a business or church, they must be located within the City of Lucas.
- All nominees will be reviewed and finalists selected by the Lucas City Council at the February 1, 2018 City Council meeting. The City of Lucas Service Tree Award(s) will be presented to the recipient(s) during the annual Lucas Founders Day event scheduled for April 14, 2018. The recipients will be notified in advance to allow family and friends to attend.
