New Container Delivery Schedule

Green recycling container delivery will begin on April 2 (95 gallon). All items must fit into the container for services. You may request a second cart for an additional fee.

Service Schedule

Recycle collection will be once every other week on Fridays.

Place at the curb on Friday at 7:00 a.m. Crews will be collecting by area starting at 7 a.m. Your first collection services will begin on April 13,2018



Container Placement

Place your recycling container two feet away from the edge of the street. Make sure the handle is facing your home, so that the lid opens toward the street. Please check to make sure your containers are not obstructed by parked cars, boats, etc.

When Should I Set Out My Containers?

Be sure your containers are set out for collection by 7:00 a.m. on Fridays for recycling collection.
